

DESTINATION ITINERARY

Fall Foliage and Farms Tour

The cool crisp air, the rich colors taking over the trees, and, sprawling farmlands as far as the eye can see. The perfect setting for a beautiful, scenic drive from Corning, NY to Hornell, NY.

Start out in Corning, NY

Follow Interstate 86 westbound out of Corning to Interstate 99 (route 15) South. Take Addison Route 417 exit and turn right onto Route 417. Follow 417 which then turns into Route 36 in Jasper, NY.

Continue along this route and visit the stops along the way as you enjoy a backroads farms and foliage tour of the Southern Finger Lakes Region through rolling hills and farmlands.

Make your first stop **Pinnacle State Park** at 1904 Pinnacle Road in Addison, NY. Pinnacle State Park has breathtaking views and tremendous vistas, including the Canisteo River Valley, Harris Hill and the Village of Addison. The park is known for its challenging 9-hole golf course, but visitors can enjoy many other recreational activities, including hiking or cross-country skiing on 11 miles of trails. Anglers can fish for bass, bluegill or bullheads in Levi Pond. Hunters can go after deer, turkey or small game in season and picnickers can relax and enjoy the scenery.

Visit a New York State Hops Farm, Crooked Creek Hops Farm at 6700 Holden Road Addison, NY. Call ahead to schedule a tour.

The next stop on the Fall Foliage and Farms Tour is the **Golden Age Cheese Company** at 1577 Mill Street in Woodhull, NY where visitors can purchase local hand-crafted cheeses.

Pay a visit to **The Wigwams Historical Museum** at 3855-3893 NY-417 in Jasper, NY. This unusual building was originally a restaurant, service station and free museum along Route 417 in rural Steuben County, New York. It now houses the Historical Society Museum of Jasper, New York.

One of the more unique stops along the driving tour is the **Canisteo Living Sign** at 84 Greenwood St. in Canisteo, NY. The sign that was originally laid out in 1933 consists of 260 pine trees that spell out "Canisteo". The sign is on the Register of National Historic Places, so it's one stop you won't want to miss.

Next stop is **Cider Creek Hard Cider** at 6459 Cunningham Creek Rd in Canisteo, NY. Prepare to be wowed by their high-quality, craft, hard cider with authenticity. Cider Creek proudly uses 100% New York State apples and never add water, sugar, artificial flavors or sweeteners to their products. Cider Creek Hard Cider can be found in retailers, bars and restaurants in New York, MA, CT and RI. Their relaxed tasting room will make you feel right at home while enjoying your cider.

What better way to wind down a day of touring the countryside and fall foliage than to settle into the newly renovated **Best Western Maple City Inn** located at 1 Canisteo Square in Hornell, NY.

The last stop of the day is to **Railhead Brewing Company** at 40 Park Drive in Hornell, NY. Railhead Brewing Company pays homage to the rail industry which came to define Hornell New York. A local brewery with a rotational tap line of in house and other local brews paired with a menu of wood oven pizzas offers a great atmosphere to unwind and enjoy the local fare.
