## Must-See Attractions

**The Corning Museum of Glass**—See glass in a whole new light. 3,500 years of glass art & history, glass innovations, and the new Contemporary Art and Design Wing—the world’s largest light-filled space dedicated to contemporary art and design in glass. Experience the new Amphitheater Hot Shop—one of the world’s largest facilities for live glassblowing demonstrations.

**Hands-on Glass Studio**—Corning’s first public access glassblowing studio. Can accommodate groups of up to 75 visitors to make their own glass souvenirs.

**Rockwell Museum**—The People, The Land, and The Places that shape America. Explore the complex story of America’s migration west. The diverse collection includes a mix of contemporary Native American art with traditional bronze sculptures, and landscape paintings.

**Glenn H. Curtiss Museum**—Dedicated to the Father of U.S. Naval Aviation. Collection of early aircraft, seaplanes, classic motorcycles and automobiles and a wonderful collection of local wine making historic artifacts.

**Corning’s Gaffer District**—Over 120 gift shops featuring locally-made products, outlet stores, day spas, and restaurants. First wheelchair accessible historic district in the United States. Connected via free shuttle to Rockwell Museum and The Corning Museum of Glass.

**Hammondsport Village Square**—The essence of a traditional village square on the southern shore of Keuka Lake, featuring artist galleries, gift shops and restaurants.

**Over 120 Finger Lakes Wineries**—Making award-winning wines from native and vinifera grape varieties. Visit the winery started by the pioneer of the U.S. wine revolution in 1960, Dr. Konstantin Frank.

**Plus parks, waterfalls, hiking & biking trails, lakes, bird-watching, camping, and fishing opportunities throughout the Finger Lakes region.**

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## Top Reasons to Visit Corning & the Finger Lakes

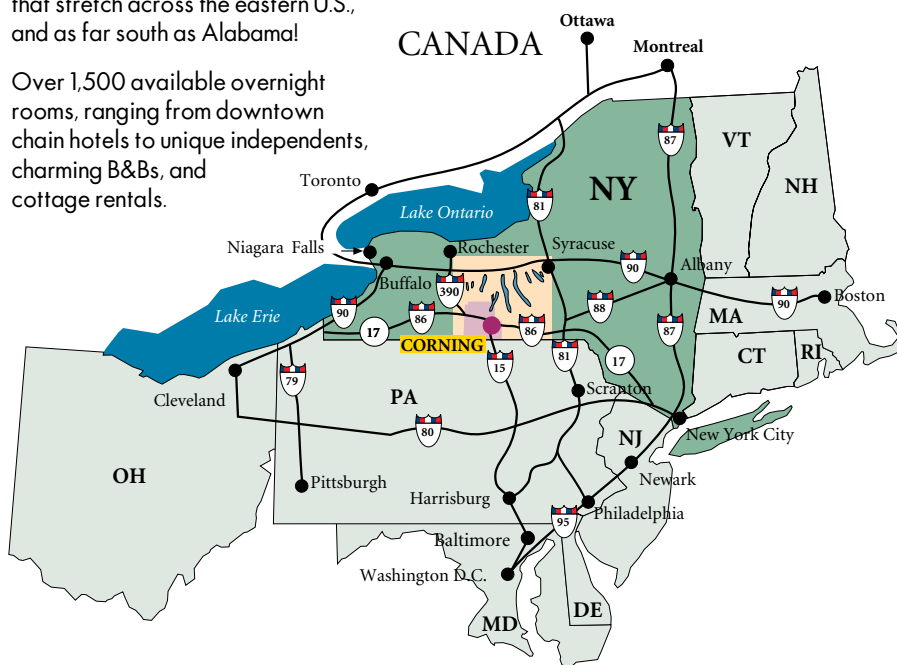
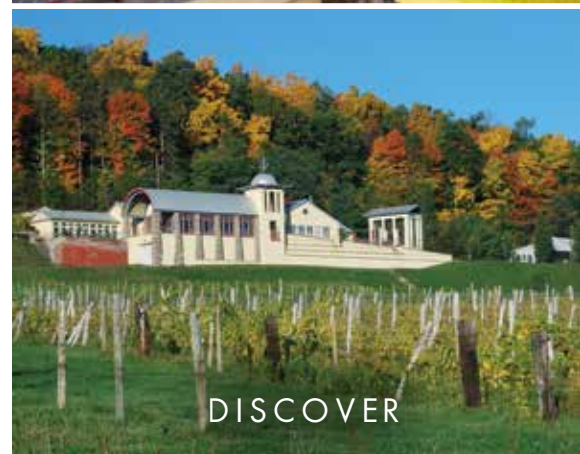
- 1 Located midway between New York City and Buffalo-Niagara Falls. Can also be easily included in a circle tour of the Northeast U.S.
