#### **The Secrets Inside**

You will learn little-known facts about the mansions, churches, and former residents on or near Millionaires Row. A 90-minute walk takes you through the heart of Danville's Old West End where you'll marvel at the beautiful Victorian homes and places of worship -- and hear about the secrets within their walls. See where Lady Nancy Langhorne Astor was born. She became the first woman to sit in the British House of Commons in 1919 before women in the U.S. could vote. A 15-minute tour inside a restored mansion is based upon availability but not guaranteed. (*\$15 per person*)

#### There's a Story Here

Joyce will tell stories about the people and buildings on Holbrook Street, where the professional African-American community lived from the late 1800s until the late 1960s. You will see the church where Camilla Williams sang. (She was the first African-American to sing with a major New York opera company and became an international star.) Also on tour is a house listed in Green Book, the guide for traveling African Americans during segregation. This historic neighborhood included the location of the William F. Grasty Branch of the Danville Public Library during segregation; the residence that housed a restaurant for African Americans; the home where the Civil Rights Movement was nurtured and more. (*\$15 per person*)

#### Tales of Tobacco, Textiles, and Trains

You will start this 90-minute tour in the oldest part of Danville located near the Dan River. Cobblestone streets lead visitors into the Tobacco Warehouse District noted for having the best of industrial architecture built in the late 1800s and early 1900s. These textile-manufacturing and tobacco-processing buildings have been repurposed as living spaces, businesses, cafes, and more. (\$15 per person)

### Millionaires Row Mini-Tour + Danville Museum of Fine Arts & History Tour

This tour includes an hour walk on Millionaires Row and admission to the Danville Museum of Fine Arts & History housed in a Victorian mansion. See recreated rooms in the house when it was the private residence of the Sutherlin family from 1858 until 1911, art galleries, a Civil War exhibit, a Civil Rights exhibit, a gift shop, and more. (\$30 per person)
