Buckle up for an exciting 2019 in Dayton, the Birthplace of Aviation and So Much More, where Wilbur and Orville Wright overcame the bounds of Earth and taught the world to fly. Trace the story of aviation from its infancy, get active in the "Outdoor Capital of the Midwest" or experience world-class art at the 100-year-old Dayton Art Institute. Dayton has the perfect blend of big-city amenities coupled with Midwestern charm and hospitality. Experience and explore one of the following three themed Dayton trails!



"WILBEAR WRIGHT **AVIATION** TRAIL"

Chart your own course through Dayton's role as the Birthplace of Aviation with the self-guided Aviation Trail. Pick up an aviator teddy bear passport brochure to Dayton's amazing aviation places at any of the participating sites. Get your passport stamped at 8 of 17 sites to earn your own "Wilbear."

Launch your adventure in style at the Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park's Wright-**Dunbar Interpretive Center and** Aviation Trail Visitor Center complex, which is home to two stops on the trail. In the Interpretive Center, find exhibits recounting the lives of powered flight inventors Wilbur and Orville Wright and their friend African-American poet laureate Paul Laurence Dunbar. Visit the Wright Cycle Company, where the brothers built bikes and maintained a printing business. Don't leave without checking out the Aviation Trail Parachute Museum, which details the development of the free-fall parachute in Dayton.

The passport trail is loaded with so much more. Carillon Historical Park is home to the Wright Brothers National Museum and the original 1905 Wright Flyer III, the world's first practical airplane. The Wright "B" Flyer at Dayton-Wright Brothers Airport is a flyable replica of one of the Wright brothers' early airplanes.

Get your passport stamped at the National Museum of the United States Air Force, the world's largest and oldest military aviation museum, and the co-located National Aviation Hall of Fame, the Wright Brothers Memorial and Huffman Prairie Flying Field, where the Wrights practiced flight.

With more stops spread around Greater Dayton and Southwest Ohio, there's so much more to explore. Go to aviationtrailinc.org to download a passport.


Greater Dayton boasts the nation's largest network of paved trails — over 340 miles! The Miami Valley Bike Trails connect to some of Dayton's biggest attractions such as Carillon Historical Park, the Dayton Dragons' Fifth Third Field and the National Museum of the United States Air Force, and wind along beautiful riverways, scenic woods and lush prairies and farmland.

Bring your bike or plan on renting a LINK bicycle at various downtown Dayton locations to hit the bike trails.

The Great Miami Riverway consists of 99 miles of river

and paved trails and connects Dayton to other popular stops along the Great Miami River, making the city the perfect hub for your outdoor excursions in Southwest Ohio.

Dayton's Five Rivers MetroParks offer more than enough outdoor excitement to fill up an entire day. Don't miss the MetroParks' annual Outdoor Experience event held the first weekend in October. Whether you hit the 12 miles of hiking trails at Englewood MetroPark, kayak the Mad River Run or Mad River Water Trail at Eastwood MetroPark or pedal through the 8 miles of International





Paul Laurence Dunbar **House Historic Site**
