

Not only does Dayton offer incredible value, you can actually spend several days experiencing world-class attractions with little or no admission fees!

DAY ONE

MORNING | Begin your day at the world's oldest and largest military aviation museum-the FREE National Museum of the U.S. Air Force. Explore 19, acres of enclosed exhibits featuring over 340+ aerospace vehicles. 1100 Spaatz Street, 937-255-3286

LUNCH | Enjoy lunch in the cafeteria at the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force; you can even try freeze-dried astronaut ice cream!

AFTERNOON | Continue exploring the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force. Board and tour a NASA Space Shuttle or four of nine Presidential Air Force One planes. View the iconic WWII Memphis Belle, and modernday unmanned aerospace vehicles. Visit the FREE co-located National Aviation Hall of Fame to learn about aviation pioneers. 1100 Spaatz Street, 937-255-3286

DAY TWO

MORNING | Dayton is known nationally for its extraordinary Five Rivers MetroParks system. Head to one of the MetroParks jewels, Cox Arboretum (FREE), for a morning in nature and stunning outdoor settings. Guided and self-guided tours are available.

LUNCH | Savor lunch in Five Rivers MetroParks historical train freight warehouse, 2nd Street Market (FREE admission), alive with local growers, bakers, culinary specialists, artisans, people and activity. 600 E 2nd Street, 937-228-2088

AFTERNOON | The Dayton

Art Institute ranks in the top 3% of all art museums in North America and among the top 10 for children. Admission ranges from FREE to \$15, fees for special exhibitions.

EVENING | Relax during a casual dinner at the Dayton Art Institute's **Leo Bistro** or head to one of many tour-friendly nearby restaurants such as **Spaghetti Warehouse** or the **Troll Pub.**

DAY THREE

MORNING | National Park Rangers tell the story of Dayton's Wright brothers and why Dayton is called The Birthplace of Aviation! Explore the sites of the Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park. The first stop includes a visit to the FREE Wright Cycle Company and the Wright-Dunbar Interpretive Center.

LUNCH | Step back in time at your second stop, Carillon Historical Park and Carillon Brewing Co. for lunch at the nation's only brewery on the grounds of a museum. 1000 Carillon Boulevard, 937-910-0722





AFTERNOON | At Carillon Historical Park, you'll be awestruck at the Wright Brothers National Museum (a component of the Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park) where there are more Wright artifacts on display than any other place in the world, including the 1905 Wright Flyer III: the only airplane designated a National Historic Landmark.

Explore the 65 acres of Carillon Historical Park (nominal fee) featuring over 30 historic buildings telling the history of innovation and technology in Dayton. 1000 Carillon Boulevard, 937-293-2841

EVENING | Grab a quick bite for dinner at Dayton's **Dublin Pub** or **Wheat Penny Oven and Bar** and then head out for a free outdoor concert at the beautiful new **Levitt Pavilion** in downtown Dayton.
