It was a wide range of activities and events that were designed to commemorate our formation and celebrate our rich history and culture.

It was a team effort undertaking a celebration of this magnitude and special thanks goes out to our many community partners and sponsors whose financial gifts made the yearlong celebration possible. A big thank you goes out to our Bicentennial Coordinator, John Pratt, whose vision for this event was its driving force. What an incredible year! The Visit Greensburg team, with support from our extraordinary sponsors, community partners, and especially coordinator John Pratt, hosted nearly 50 events in celebration of the Greensburg and Decatur County Bicentennial. With a film series, lecture series, concert series, parade, streetscape banners, and more, our goal going into the year, and one that I believe we overwhelmingly accomplished, was to put on "Our Greatest Celebration."

Other notable accomplishments from the year include:

- Partnering with the Greensburg-Decatur County Chamber of Commerce to create an updated Decatur County map that is available for the public at the Visitor Center.
- Awarding Standing Line Item Grants to partner community organizations that help support our mission of bringing visitors into Greensburg and Decatur County, Main Street Greensburg, the Parks Department, the Arts & Cultural Council, and the Economic Development Corporation.
- Honoring our commitment to the Decatur County Family YMCA Capital Improvement Campaign in making the third of five annual installments towards what will be a total contribution of \$50,000.
- Creating a scale replica of the Decatur County Courthouse in partnership with a
 professional LEGO builder that is on display at the Visitor Center, and also working
 with her to make a 29-piece smaller version of the Courthouse that is available for
 purchase.

2022 YEAR IN REVIEW

- Executive Director Philip Deiwert was accepted into the inaugural class of the Indiana Tourism Academy, a new, year-long program designed to provide education, resources, and networking needed to develop tourism professionals and help grow the industry in the state of Indiana.
- Staff attended the Indiana Tourism Association Annual Conference in Noblesville.
- Sponsoring the July 4th Fireworks Show that is hosted annually by Decatur County Parks & Recreation.
- Working with a group of Industrial Engineering students from Purdue University to begin planning for the 2024 Total Eclipse.
- Hosting a ribbon-cutting ceremony in collaboration with the City of Greensburg to celebrate the completion of the Pavillion at Pirate Park.
- Establishing memberships with organizations that will help support our efforts to bring youth sports events into the community, Indiana Sports Corp. and Playeasy.
- Collaborating with partner organizations, including the Parks Department, Community
 Foundation, EDC, and elected officials to visit pools and aquatic centers in neighboring
 communities and plan for the future of the Allen Memorial Pool at the County Park.
- Working with Main Street Greensburg and the City of Greensburg to create a plan for a Bicentennial legacy project to revitalize an alleyway in the Downtown District.

In 2023, we look forward to continuing our efforts to enhance tourism and bring more visitors into Greensburg and Decatur County. We are already working hard, along with the Arts & Cultural Council, on the 2023 Summer Concert Series that will be held at the Rebekah Park Amphitheater; we are working with the City of Greensburg, EMA, EMS, Law Enforcement, and others to plan for the 2024 Total Eclipse, where Greensburg and Decatur County will be directly in the path of totality; we continue to work on the Bicentennial Alleyway project; we will continue to work alongside community partners and support building a new aquatic center at the County Park; we have invited a travel blogger to visit our community in July; we are excited about the introduction of a print ad campaign in Travel IN Magazine throughout the year; and much, much more.

Funding for the Visitors Commission is provided entirely through a County Innkeeper's Tax, which is levied on all overnight visitors in Decatur County. These funds, which have strict guidelines for usage, are to be used for the promotion of tourism-focused activities, striving to directly increase overnight lodging occupancy or to create positive image-building publicity for Greensburg and Decatur County. The Visitors Commission is made up of a seven-person Board with appointees designated by the Mayor of Greensburg, the Decatur County Commissioners, and the Decatur County Council. Board meetings are held on the third Thursday of each month at 12pm at the Visitor Center, which is located at 211 North Broadway Street in Greensburg. Those meetings are open to the public.


