2024 YEAR IN REVIEW

2024 was another incredibly successful year for Visit Greensburg, with record high Innkeepers Tax collected in the amount of \$305,387.23. Visit Greensburg is funded entirely by a 5% Innkeepers Tax that is collected and remitted by all of the hotels, motels, the bed & breakfast, tourist cabins, and short term rentals such as AirBnB in Decatur County, and the mission of our organization is to promote the County and attract visitors who will invest dollars and grow our community.

The highlight of 2024 was astronomical, with the April 8 total eclipse that drew more than 10,000 unique visitors from all over the world into Decatur County. Thanks to the hard work and preparation of our City and County partners, including the EMA, EMS, DCMH, Fire, Police, Sheriff, Communications, our friends with Greensburg Power of the Past, volunteer extraordinaire Devin Morgan, and many others, we strategically and successfully hosted two large scale events at Pirate Park and the Fairgrounds that enabled thousands of visitors to experience our community and then safely and efficiently get home again after.

Another highlight was year two of our DecCo Summer Concert Series at Rebekah Park, that saw thousands of guests experience live music in a beautiful, updated outdoor setting, with local food truck vendors and beverages from Tree City Brewing.
