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


TOTNES MUSEUM

Housed in a restored Elizabethan townhouse, it offers a fascinating insight into the history of our town plus many interesting features, including an Elizabethan kitchen, Victorian-style shop plus the Babbage Room dedicated to the life and work of mathematician and inventor Charles Babbage. Look out for the unique wood-carved sculptures on the museum's façade.

ST MARY'S CHURCH

The dominant red stone building at the heart of the high street, where you'll discover the magnificent features of this 15th-century construction. Don't miss the stunning, hand-drawn map of Totnes, which captures a snapshot of the quirks of local life.



TOTNES CASTLE

At the top of the High Street turn right into Castle Street to Totnes Castle (English Heritage) built by Judhael, the 11th-century Norman overlord of Totnes. From the ramparts appreciate the castle's superb defensive position and enjoy magnificent 360 degree far-reaching views.

THE GUILDHALL

Behind St Mary's, is the impressive Guildhall with nearly a thousand years of history to explore. The original priory dates back to 1088 and was restored in 1553. Over the years, the buildings have been a town gaol, boy's school and magistrate's court. The Guildhall still continues to be used by Totnes Town Council.
