
BETHLEHEM





EASTON



Discover a city that is continually redefining itself as a hub for creatives, food-lovers, and more. Easton draws a sense of community that is palpable at its events including Easton Out Loud, where downtown restaurants and merchants gather to open their doors and host Fourth Friday celebrations. Stroll along the Bushkill Creek to the newly established SILK property where you'll find new businesses (think coffee shops, breweries, urban wineries, art galleries, and more) popping up in renovated silk mill spaces, complete with exposed brick and soaring ceilings. But there are historical ties as well - the city of Easton is recognized as one of the sites of the original readings of the Declaration of Independence in 1776, an event that is celebrated annually as part of Easton Heritage Day. >>





THINGS TO DO

SIGAL MUSEUM & NORTHAMPTON COUNTY HISTORICAL & GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

In addition to highlighting Northampton County's history, the Sigal Museum is home to collections of pre-European settlement artifacts, textiles, farming implements, and more. The NCHGS also maintains properties including the 1753 Bachmann Publick House, the oldest remaining building in the city.

THE SLATE BELT **REGION & NAZARETH**

To the northern end of Lehigh Valley is the Slate Belt, home to some of the region's most impressive industrial heritage. The area is dotted with small towns that are big on experiences including Nazareth, Bangor, and more.



Explore how world-famous acoustic instruments come to life at this true factory tour. A guide will lead you through the process, beginning with the various types of wood utilized for these custom instruments all the way through the finished product, ready to ship to eager musicians. MORAVIAN HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Dive into the unique history of Moravian culture at this hub in Nazareth. The archives play host to artifacts including the earliest known violin made in the American colonies and the 1776 Tannenberg organ. On the grounds of the Historical Society, you can also view the 1740/1743 Whitefield House and the 1740 Gray Cottage, the two oldest Moravian structures in North America.





Moving through the cavern is the Lost River, whose clear waters mysteriously originate from an unknown source, then disappear once more beneath the earth's surface.

THE LIVING HISTORY OF **BETHLEHEM**

A LOOK AT THE UNIQUE CULTURE GAINING NATIONAL RECOGNITION

Step back in time to explore Moravian culture in historic downtown Bethlehem. A community founded in the 1700s, the grounds of Historic Bethlehem Museums & Sites feature more original structures than Colonial Williamsburg. In fact, the 1741 Gemeinhaus is believed to be the largest 18th-century log structure in continuous use in the United States.



Historic Moravian Bethlehem's footprint is 14 acres of the original 18th-century Moravian settlement that served as the center of Moravian activities in America. The region is recognized as a National Historic Landmark District, one of eight in Pennsylvania and about 200 in the United States, and it recently was named to the U.S. Tentative List for World Heritage Designation.

Today, visitors can get a glimpse of what life was like as a member of the Moravian community through a variety of guided tours led by docents in period 1700s-era Moravian dress. The Moravians believed that people of all races, genders, and ethnicities should receive the same education and health care—a mindset that was quite radical for the times. Europeans, African-Americans, and Native Americans lived, worked, worshipped, and went to school together, and then were buried side by side right in this historic community.







The rolling hills of Lehigh Valley supply more than just stunning backdrops for photographs. It's the undulating landscape — and the soil underneath—that make this a special place to grow wine grapes. So special in fact that a section of the region has been designated an American Viticultural Area (AVA).

That means that since 2008, wine produced in the designated AVA, made using at least 85 percent grapes grown locally, can carry a "Lehigh Valley" appellation on its label. It's a sign of legitimacy for an ascendent wine region, putting Lehigh Valley on the same footing as famous AVAs such as Napa Valley, Willamette Valley, and the Finger Lakes.

"We felt as the Lehigh Valley that it was really important to go after that AVA," says Kari Skrip of Clover Hill Winery. "It adds clout to your growing area. We wanted to define our region what makes us unique and what makes us special."

Covering 1,888 square miles, including portions of Lehigh, Northampton, Berks, Schuylkill, Carbon, and Monroe counties, the Lehigh Valley AVA's distin-

quishing factors include those rippling hills, shale-and-sandstone soils. morning fog from the Delaware River, and plenty of sunshine. The first two characteristics are especially important for providing excellent drainage: dry vines are happy vines.

While there's a tremendous diversity of wine varieties grown in the AVA, a few have become signatures. Riesling thrives in the Lehigh Valley's steep pitches, rocky soils, and cool nights. It's a similar climate to the variety's native Germany.

"With cooler-climate Riesling, you tend to get some more of these minerally, lemony, citrusy type of characteristics," explains Skrip. "As you get into a warmer climate, you tend to get more peach, apricot, and honey from

the grape itself. In Lehigh Valley, we tend to get a really nice blend of those characteristics."

Meanwhile, Chambourcin is a grape grown by most of the wineries in the AVA. The French hybrid — dubbed "the jewel of the Lehigh Valley"—is a versatile variety, but the resulting wines tend to exude notes of berry and cherry and boast balanced tannins.

"At Vynecrest Vineyard and Winery, we use most of our Chambourcin for a dry wine aged in oak," says winemaker John Landis, who has operated his family-run winery since 1974. "But

we've also made a sparkling Chambourcin and a lot of wineries make a rosé from Chambourcin."

No matter what you're looking for—an oaked Chardonnay, an off-dry Cayuga, or a French-style red blend — there's a winery for you in the Lehigh Valley. Or two. Or three. Spend a weekend discovering your perfect fit.

"There is so much diversity, which is part of our unique experience," says Skrip. "You have a lot of different options as far as great varieties that you're going to get to see and taste."

Just a five mile drive north on Cedar Crest Blvd., you'll find Manasses Guth Bridge at the eastern edge of Covered Bridge Park. The 108-foot span that dates back to 1858 is the first of five bridges on the tour that spans Jordan Creek.

KREIDERSVILLE

The pedestrian-only span built in 1839 is the oldest covered bridge in Lehigh Valley and one of the oldest in the state. It's the only remaining covered bridge in Northampton County. The adjacent park is the perfect picnic setting for the end of your tour.

SCHLICHER'S

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, you'll pass over Schlicher's Bridge as you make your way toward the Lehigh Valley Zoo. This bridge was reconstructed in the early 2010s utilizing repurposed original materials. Nearby, you'll find scenic hiking trails.

GEIGER'S

This bridge is located on the eastern side of the Trexler-Lehigh County Game Preserve and is easily recognizable by its unique "stepped portal" design. At one time, a pipe, which was used to pump water from Jordan Creek to nearby orchards and farms, ran from end to end across the bridge.


