Exploring the Scenic Outdoors and Vibrant Culture of Easton

MORNING

National Canal Museum: Learn about America's Canal Age at the Museum dedicated to telling the story of America's historic towpath canals. The museum sits along the Delaware & Lehigh National Heritage Corridor–a trail system that runs along canals and rivers–perfect for walkers, runners, or bikers.

LATE MORNING

Crayola Experience in Easton: Perfect for families or creative souls, the Crayola Experience offers hands-on activities, including crafting custom crayons, making colorful art, and exploring interactive exhibits.

LUNCH

Lunch at Two Rivers Brewing Company: Enjoy a hearty lunch at this popular gastropub, known for its locally-sourced ingredients, craft beers, and regional flavors.

AFTERNOON

Explore Easton's Farmers' Market (Saturdays, year-round): The Easton Farmers' Market, one of the country's oldest, is open on Saturdays and showcases local produce, artisanal foods, and handmade goods.

Sigal Museum: Learn about Lehigh Valley's rich history at the Sigal Museum, with exhibits that range from Native American artifacts to regional history collections, providing a fascinating glimpse into the area's heritage.

EVENING

Dinner at Easton Wine Project: Enjoy local wine that is produced on-site, craft beers from breweries throughout Pennsylvania, and cocktails featuring spirits from local distilleries. Easton Wine Project's menu features "shareables," such as truffle oil popcorn and charcuterie boards, as well as flatbreads, sandwiches, bowls, salads, and even desserts. They also feature live music every Friday and Saturday night.

OPTIONAL FINALE

SteelStacks Campus: Wrap up your trip with a visit to the SteelStacks, a 10-acre campus centered around the iconic blast furnaces. The area frequently hosts live music, movies, and events and makes a stunning spot for photos, especially in the evening when the structures are illuminated.
