FAMILY FUN

Colorful memories are made at Easton's **Crayola Experience™**, where you can color, draw, paint, and create with the latest Crayola[®] products without the worry of cleanup afterwards. Bursting with four floors of 26 colorful, hands-on and interactive attractions, you can make a day of it as each creative space invites you to play and explore while learning and having lots of fun.

Twist and turn on the seven inversions of **Dorney Park & Wildwater Kingdom's** Hydra, the park's only floorless coaster; feel the rush when the floor drops you into a splash pool on Python Plummet; and take a spin with the entire family on the Whip, the park's oldest ride. Don't miss Planet Snoopy for the kids.

Get up and atom at Allentown's **Da Vinci Science Center**, where families can make T-Rexroth, the center's robotic dinosaur move with a joystick, experience a Category 1 hurricane with wind forces up to 78 mph and crawl through Tunnel Vision, a 72-foot maze-like tunnel that shows how you can adapt when you cannot see.

RELIVE THE HISTORY

Founded in 1741, Bethlehem was the first well-established Moravian Church settlement in the Americas. Of the 20 historic sites and museums, notables include:

- 1741 Gemeinhaus
- · 1744/52 Single Sisters' House
- 1758/65 Nain-Schober House
- 1762 Moravian Waterworks

The **National Museum of Industrial History**, a Smithsonian Affiliate, is dedicated to preserving America's rich industrial heritage. The museum is located in a 100-year-old former Bethlehem Steel facility on the largest private brownfield in America.

The 48-ton Josiah White II canal boat plies the waters of old Section 8 of the Lehigh Canal as crew interpret the story of the anthracite canals and the people who worked and lived on them. Two mules – Hank and George – tow the boat on a 45-minute trip from the **National Canal Museum** to the Locktender's House and back.
