Lehigh Valley's historic Moravian Bethlehem, a National Historic Landmark District, examines a unique, historically rich, and culturally significant way of life for over 300 years. Explore 20+ locations maintained by **Historic Bethlehem Museums & Sites** for a look back in time, including a working blacksmith's shop and the first pumped municipal water system in America— several of which helped to enlist Bethlehem on the U.S. Tentative List for World Heritage.

For a dose of culture, tour facilities including the Allentown Art Museum, the National Museum of Industrial History (a Smithsonian affiliate), and America on Wheels. Stroll the Hoover Mason Trestle on the grounds of the former Bethlehem Steel to learn about the region's steel heritage.

Wow Your Family

Plan the perfect vacation for your family that brings ear to ear smiles and laughter memories are made for. Make it a night under the lights and catch Olympic hopefuls in training at the **Valley Preferred Cycling Center** [Velodrome] in Trexlertown with 28-degree bank turns. Once the inspiration sets in, enroll you and your kids in a Try the Track clinic to experience the thrill of riding a fixed gear bike on the track!
