As the top destination in the Caribbean, the Dominican Republic is a popular hub in the region where flights of all major cities around the world connect. With numerous attractions around the country, easy access throughout its eight airports will assure comfort, safety and top notch management in the arrival and departure experience.

Santo Domingo:

- <u>Las Americas International Airport</u>, (SDQ) also known as the José Francisco Peña Gómez Airport, is 30 minutes from the capital city of Santo Domingo and very close to the tourist areas of Boca Chica and Juan Dolio. At the end of 2017, a total of 1,348,014 nonresident made their entry into the country through this airport.
- <u>La Isabela International Airport</u>, (JBQ) also known as the Joaquín Balaguer International Airport, is north of Santo Domingo and handles mostly domestic flights and flights to Haiti.

Punta Cana:

• Punta Cana International Airport, (PUJ) is only 15 minutes from the Punta Cana and Cap Cana area, and some 30 minutes from Bávaro, El Cortecito, Arena Gorda, Macao and Uvero Alto hotel areas. This is the Caribbean airport with the largest diversity of flights from all around the world. The airport has three terminals, all featuring its characteristic palm frond-thatched roofs, free wi-fi and in the near future, services of pre-checking for US passengers. At year end 2017, a total of 3,643,488 nonresident decided on Punta Cana International Airport for their arrival to the country.

Puerto Plata:

 Gregorio Luperón International Airport, (POP) also known as the Puerto Plata International Airport, is only 20 minutes from the north coast city of Puerto Plata and neighboring tourist destinations like Cofresí, Playa Dorada, Sosúa and Cabarete. Built in 1979 with the purpose of boosting tourism in the North region, it has a track 3,081 meters long x 46 meters wide, with the capacity to receive wide-body aircraft, including the B-747 and A-340.

La Romana:

 <u>La Romana International Airport</u>, (LRM) also known as the Casa de Campo International Airport, is just 10 minutes from Casa de Campo Resort on the southeast coast and only 20 minutes from Bayahibe. The style for the airports has raised on the interesting mixture of modernity while being reminiscent of a sugarcane mill.

Samaná:

 <u>El Catey International Airport</u> (AZS), also known as the Juan Bosch International Airport, is half an hour from the city of Samaná and 45 minutes to the destinations of Cosón, Las Terrenas and Portillo on the famed northeastern coast of the Dominican Republic. It has a track 3,000 meters long by 45 meters wide and a ramp of 45,000 square meters that allows the parking of 4 wide-body aircraft simultaneously.

Santiago:

 <u>El Cibao International Airport</u> (STI) is 15 minutes from the city of Santiago in the central region and provides easy access to the nearby cities of La Vega, Jarabacoa, Constanza, San Francisco de Macorís and Moca.

Barahona:

 <u>María Montez International Airport</u> (BRX) is located at the entrance of Barahona city in the southwest. Today it receives mainly domestic flights.

DOMESTIC AIRPORTS

Several small airports nationwide cater to domestic flights. These include:

Arroyo Barril (ABA) in Samaná on the northeast coast.

Constanza (COZ) located in the central mountain region.

Cabo Rojo (CBJ) in Pedernales on the southwest coast.

Montecristi (MTC) on the northwest coast.
