

## **Forest Preserve**

The changing of the seasons is already spectacular at this botanically diverse site. Add to it the soaring presence of migrating hawks — this is Greene Valley Forest Preserve in the fall. Venture along 12 miles of marked trails, or specifically come to scour the skies at the 190-foot-tall scenic overlook. Perhaps you'll spot a bald eagle or a red-tailed hawk — it is in those moments we find awe in the natural world in which we live. On a clear day, your 360-degree view draws the eye as far as the Chicago skyline. Fall Bird Migration season officially begins September 1st.

The overlook is open to the public on Saturday and Sunday, May through October from 11 am until 6 pm, weather permitting. Take on the challenge to the top of the overlook via the 2.6-mile Hawk Trail, or by car on the road that leads from the base of the hill to a parking lot at the top.

Spotted in previous years during hawk migration were turkey vultures, broadwinged hawks, sharp-shinned hawks, red-tailed hawks, ospreys, bald eagles, Cooper's hawks, peregrine falcons, merlins, northern harriers, American kestrels, red-shouldered hawks and a rough-legged hawk.
