

## KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

The following information reflects the guidelines placed forth by the Illinois Department of Public Health for Phase 4 operations for each business sector. Follow face mask requirements and all visitor signage.

### INDOOR & OUTDOOR RECREATION

Select indoor and outdoor recreation is open, with the exception of indoor playgrounds and trampoline parks. Guidelines require activity stations to be spaced at least 6 ft. apart.

- Capacity is limited to 50 people or 50% of facility capacity – whichever is the lesser of the two
- Outdoor recreation allowing group sizes of up to 50, and multiple groups given appropriate space to social distance and limited interaction between groups
- Shared equipment disinfected before and after each use
- Clubhouses and other communal gathering places are open
- Concessions open, with restrictions

### MUSEUMS AND ZOOS

Check individual organizations prior to visit for details on opening date to the public, advance ticket sales and timed entry ticketing.

- Capacity limit of no more than 25% occupancy
- Guided tours limited to 50 or fewer people per group
- Hands-on exhibits and touch screens are closed or modified
- Audio tours only available at museums with ability to disinfect before and after individual use
- Concessions available, with restrictions

### THEATERS & PERFORMING ARTS

Seated theaters, cinemas, and performing arts centers for ticketed events with seating available for all customers permitted.

- General admission shows and/or events with standing room only are not permitted at this time
- Patrons should wear face coverings over their nose and mouth, except while seated within a venue (exceptions can be made for people with medical conditions or disabilities that prevent them from safely wearing a face covering)
- Indoor capacity limit set at the lesser of the two: 50 people or 50% of space capacity (applies to each screening room)
- Outdoor capacity limited to 20% of overall space capacity
- Concessions permitted with restrictions

### RETAIL (CLOTHING STORES, DEPARTMENT STORES AND MALLS)

Stores can continue to open their doors to guests, remaining at 50% occupancy or less. Customers should wear face coverings over their nose and mouth (exceptions can be made for people with medical conditions or disabilities that prevent them from safely wearing a face covering).

- Customers should not bring reusable shopping bags into stores
- Mall food courts may be open, check ahead
- Fitting rooms and frequently touched surfaces disinfected after every use OR fitting rooms remain closed
- If fitting rooms remain open, solid surfaces (e.g., tags and hangers of garments) should be sanitized before returned to the sales floor
- Bathing suits and undergarments may not be tried on by customers
- All returned items disinfected either via use of disinfecting products or by removing and isolating the items for a recommended duration of at least 72 hours, before returning items to the sales floor
