
DURANGO

Whatever the family prefers, Durango can accommodate.

Day 1

Arrive in Durango and give the hungry travelers some comfort food! Stop at Oscars or Durango Diner for a hearty meal to fuel the day. The rest of the day can be spent riding the train as it takes you through the magical, snow covered Animas Valley to Cascade Canyon towards Silverton. Or you can wander the streets for shopping, stop in at any of our local breweries, or check out the train museum. That evening, hop on the Polar Express to be truly blown away. Head to your hotel after stopping for chocolate at the Animas Chocolate Company.

Day 2

Grab the family and head up to Purgatory for a day on the slopes! Purgatory has trails to thrill every person in the family. From fun, well-groomed beginner runs to steep backcountry trails, there is no shortage of fun mountain terrain for every type of skier. After a long day, fill your bellies with healthy Tex-Mex from Zia Taqueria before drifting off to sleep.

Day 3

There is more adventure to be had off the ski slopes. Spend the day on a dog sledding expedition, snowmobile tour and explore the beauty of the San Juans. Try your hand at snowbiking, or get your thrill tubing. At the end of your fun-filled day, head into town for a show at one of our many theatres.

Day 4

Unwind on your last day. Head to Durango Hot Springs Resort and Spa to soak in their soothing, natural pools. Enjoy the last night in town with a fun dinner at Fired Up Pizza.

Four fun days during summer and fall months

Families, reunions and multi-generational holidays find something for everyone in Durango's playground. With 300+ days of sunshine, friendly locals and something for every budget, you will find Durango a favorite destination for group holidays.

Day 1

All aboard the Durango & Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad for a historic 42-mile trip on our coal-fired, steam-powered train ride to the mining town of Silverton. Enjoy the incredible views and lunch in Silverton before returning to Durango. Stop into Rocky Mountain Chocolate Factory for a treat when you return to the depot and have dinner at The Palace.

Day 2

Divide and conquer depending on what people want to do: raft the Animas River on a 2 hour raft trip, take cruiser bikes on the Animas River Trail, hike Hogsback, Horse Gulch or the Colorado Trail. Enjoy lunch on the river at Animas Brewing Company, and then assemble the gang for a stagecoach ride. Rest up before you spend your evening at the Bar D Chuckwagon dinner and western show.

Day 3

Take on a day of adventure ziplining at Durango Adventure Center or Soaring Tree Top Adventures. Another option is to head to Purgatory Resort for the Alpine Slide, the Plunge zipline, hiking and a picnic in the mountains. In the evening, enjoy live music downtown, a performance at the Durango Arts Center or a live show at the Diamond Belle Saloon.

Day 4

Everyone will enjoy a day at the high mountain hamlet of Vallecito Lake. Rent a pontoon boat and go for a cruise or drop a fishing line, take a horseback ride through the mountains, and then enjoy lunch on the water at Pura Vida Café. Look for Ponderosa Pine commemorative carvings on the Tour of Carvings.

Four exciting days during winter and spring months

Blue skies, fresh powder and crisp clean air...it's easy to fall in love with this quintessential Colorado mountain town.There is so much to love about Durango including the casual friendliness of our locals, inspiring art galleries, boutique shopping and winter fun.

Day 1

Head for the slopes at Purgatory Resort. With over 1,325 skiable acres, 260-inches of annual snowfall, 10 lifts, 2 terrain parks and almost every snowcentric activity imaginable, there is something for everyone from expert to beginner. Enjoy après ski drinks "on the beach" at Purgy's before you head to town, and upon returning, try a sampling of our finest brews and dinner at one of our five craft breweries.

Day 2

Durango's winter wonderland offers a smorgasbord of winter activities. Choose from a snowmobile tour, snowshoeing, cross country skiing, dog sledding, sleigh rides, ice skating, or take a train ride through Cascade Canyon. Find your way back to town for dinner.

Day 3

You've earned a day of rest and relaxation. Start with breakfast at Carver Brewing Co. followed by a massage and soak at Durango Hot Springs Resort and Spa. Head to Historic Downtown Durango for lunch then shop the galleries and stroll Main Avenue. When you are ready for dinner, try one of our award-winning restaurants. End your evening with a show at the Durango Arts Center, Henry Strater Theatre, or live music at one of many venues.

Day 4

Hit the slopes one more time at Purgatory Resort. Enjoy snowbiking and tubing. Looking for adventure? Book a trip with Purgatory Snowcat Adventures or hire a guide and go backcountry skiing or ice climbing in the rugged San Juan National Forest.

Four exciting days during summer and fall months

Durango is sure to take your breath away during the summer and fall. With Durango's wildflowers, peaks, extreme sports, western culture, and mountain lifestyle, you won't believe all the beauty and fun activities our city has to offer. Durango is like nowhere else imaginable!

Day 1

Breakfast at College Drive Cafe to enjoy a hearty, Southwestern style meal and learn more about the establishment and its long history in Durango. Once you've enjoyed your meal, take the beginning of the San Juan Skyway to the top of Coal Bank Pass. Once at the summit, pull over to lace up your hiking boots for a beautiful hike up to Engineer Mountain. Be aware, to get to the peak this climb can be very technical for inexperienced hikers, but the views at the top will take your breath away! The first hour to a meadow offers beautiful wildflowers in season. After your hike, head back to town via the Olde Schoolhouse or Nugget Mountain Bar for the ultimate après experience.

Day 2

Rent four wheelers or a jeep for the day and drive up to The Notch at the top of La Plata Canyon. The drive will give you incredible panoramic views of the peaks surrounding Durango as well as the opportunity to see some of the old mining equipment that was left behind. Check with your rental company about the severity of the pass and if you are equipped to handle it. As you head back to town for the evening, treat yourself with dinner at Kennebec Cafe.

Day 3

Get ready for an entirely new perspective of Durango! Take to the skies with a helicopter tour from Alpine Heli Tours or Colorado Highland Helicopters. If you aren't a fan of flying, spend the day on the river! In the evening, enjoy live music downtown, a performance at the Durango Arts Center (be sure to check the schedule) or a live show at the Henry Strater Theatre.

Day 4

End your vacation by spending the day with Rapp Corral and take in the beautiful San Juan Mountains the way they're supposed to be enjoyed -- on horseback! The Corral is located just 20 miles north of historic downtown Durango at the entrance to beautiful Haviland Lake. Once you get back into town, clean up and head into town to listen to live music.



Four inspiring days during winter and spring months

Durango is a lot of things for a lot of different people, but perhaps what makes this town most magical is its ability to remain unwaveringly unchanged. No matter what fame and fortune have been discovered here - Durango as a community has always remained true to its roots. Experience the place where Cowboy Culture lives on!

Day 1

Durango boasts spectacular artists of all mediums. Check out our rich art scene in one of our dozen downtown galleries, stroll through Historic Downtown at a seasonal gallery walk, or head to the latest theatre production. Take a break for a little retail therapy! Durango, Colorado is the perfect place to shop 'til you drop. Explore over 500 shops, from clothing stores and home and gift stores to bike and outdoor gear shops.

Day 2

Mesa Verde, Spanish for green table, offers a spectacular look into the lives of the Ancestral Puebloan people who made it their home for over 700 years, from A.D. 600 to 1300. Today the park protects nearly 5,000 known archaeological sites, including 600 cliff dwellings. These sites are some of the most notable and best preserved in the United States. Check out Mesa Verde Winterfest and experience the National Park with an entirely new perspective. The Morefield Campground winter trails will be open from 5:30 pm until 10:00 pm for snowshoeing and cross country skiing by moonlight.

Day 3

Take the historic train to Cascade Canyon and be transported to a glorious ice palace. The canyon walls will glisten with frozen waterfalls and you will be amazed by the beautiful white spread! Revered as one of the most famous original ragtime piano bars in the Old West, the Diamond Belle Saloon plays host to the world's finest ragtime entertainers, while costumed dance hall girls and bartenders transport you back to the turn of the last century.

Day 4

Multiple corrals near town offer custom horse drawn sleigh rides in the winter wonderland that is the San Juan Mountains! Get a first hand glimpse of the conditions that the cowboys who founded our town rode through all winter. End your day with live music at our many venues in and around town.

Durango has a long and rich history that both history buffs and curious folks of all ages will enjoy. Durango was founded in 1880 by the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad and it has been booming ever since! From local history, museums, historic downtown to the ancient cliff dwellings of Mesa Verde National Park, Durango is truly where the old west survived, and the new west thrives.

Day 1

Spend the day on the train. Experience living history aboard Durango's historic 1880's train. Take an open-air journey through the majestic San Juan National Forest, alongside dramatic canyons and cliffs carved out by the Animas River. Explore Bar D Chuckwagon in the evening and enjoy a full camp-style barbecue. In the past half century the event has changed very little... it is a timeless tradition!

Day 2


Historic downtown Durango swarms with knowledge about how the Wild West shaped the city. Horsefly History Tours hosts history tours around Durango, including "Coal Dust and Oysters" tour, "Murder and Mayhem" series, "Haunted Horseman" carriage ride, "Underground Durango Ghost Tour" and "Quick and Dirty" for visitors short on time. Spend time in art galleries viewing masterpiece artwork and photography, or create your own beautiful art pieces, ornaments, jewelry, dishes, and wind chimes at "Get Fused" glass studio.

Day 3

With more than 2,500 preserved archeological sites, four nearby National Monuments, 13 historic sites, 2 UNESCO World Heritage Sites, and one National Park, Durango boasts unbeatable access to our nation's bestpreserved history. Spend a day at Mesa Verde National Park UNESCO site, tour Chaco Canyon UNESCO site, and then escape to the Weminuche --Colorado's largest protected wilderness area, for some intimate outdoor time.

Day 4

Nothing beats the quiet sound of horse hooves on a trail and no trip to Durango is complete without National Forest time. Join a group trail ride or book your own private visit to one of the many stables in the area. With a guide, you'll find local knowledge, plus the best views and trails.

Winter and early spring temperatures call for yummy, locally sourced comfort food and that is exactly what you can expect in Durango! With more award-winning restaurants per capita than the majority of US cities, you will not be disappointed with the plethora of good food options.

Day 1

Get your energy for the day from Durango Diner, Oscars or College Drive Cafe for a classic cafe and diner experience. Get coffee at 81301 Coffee House and Roasters on your way north of town for a beautiful drive over Coal Bank or Molas Pass. Warm your hands in any of our local breweries while sipping on their in-house brews. Enjoy a meal at Mahogany Grille for dinner to wrap up your day.

Day 2

Coffee and breakfast can be found at any of our local cafes and coffee shops. Always make sure to pick up a fresh, homemade pastry! Beer fans will be blown away by a day brewery hopping at our 5 local breweries including a tour of Ska Brewery at 4 pm. For a glimpse into the homegrown agricultural scene, stop by Honeyville 15 minutes north of town for local honey, jam, syrups and much more. Treat yourself at the Ore House for dinner.

Day 3

Doughworks is a local favorite for dine-in breakfast and brunch, to-go menu, or their incredible assortment of donuts. After you've experienced Durango's beer scene, it's time to take a wine tour to learn more about our local wineries or do a wine tasting afternoon at Four Leaves. El Moro Spirits and Tavern to end your evening will be a great place for food and drinks.

Day 4

Hermosa Creek Coffee Roasters for breakfast and their open layout will give you an opportunity to slow down and spend time in town. Take the day to explore local store fronts as they all carry local products and trinkets. Don't forget Animas Chocolate Company for a sweet treat after lunch. Derailed Pour House for dinner and drinks before a fun night enjoying the nightlife.

Durango and surrounding La Plata County prides itself on being heavily sustainable from local agriculture and much of our Food and Beverage industry being farm-to-table. You will find that our local farmers' and growers' products can be found all over the city, county and state. Everything is made with our own small town love. On top of our gorgeous summer and fall views, you can indulge your taste buds in all Durango has to offer.

Day 1

Almost all of our bakeries and coffee shops bake in-house with local resources. Start your morning at Bread for coffee and breakfast. Spend your day on the Durango & Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad Brew Train. The train features local food and breweries to be sampled as the train takes you through the beautiful Animas Valley. For your evening, pick up a local bottle of Four Leaves wine and take it to The Boathouse at Electra Lake for a fabulous meal and view. If you are still up for fun and local tastes, head to The Bookcase & Barber for drinks and a password required before entry into this speakeasy.

Day 2

Durango Joe's is a fast, local, delicious start to a busy day. Take the 2.5 hour tour at James Ranch to learn more about local sustainability and taste their homegrown produce and raised beef and meat. Head back to town and enjoy dinner at The Red Snapper or one of our other award-winning restaurants. For more homemade goodness, spend the rest of your night at Durango Craft Spirits Distillery & Tasting Room sampling their liquors.

Day 3


Durango has multiple farmers markets going on throughout the week and weekend. Graze the market for fresh, local produce and crafts to begin your day. After a stroll by the river or short hike in town, head to 11th St Station for lunch where you'll find fresh, tasty options from local food trucks. Many of our local breweries not only have incredible beers to sample all afternoon, but outdoor seating to enjoy the fresh mountain air as well. To end your evening with a happy belly, head to Ken & Sue's.

Day 4

Explore the rest of the county on your last day. Head to Vallecito Lake north of Bayfield. For dinner, Fur Trappers Steakhouse is the place to be! The rest of the day or afternoon can be spent at Bottom Shelf Brewery in Bayfield for drinks and live music most nights.

San Juan Scenic Byway

Durango is the perfect gateway to the San Juan Skyway. This beautifully scenic 232-mile loop spans 8 unique Southwestern Colorado towns. You will find yourself in alpine forests, historic mining towns, expansive cattle ranges and ancient Ancestral Puebloan ruins with no shortage of breathtaking views. A full day trip, anywhere from 7-10 hours, will put you at elevations from 6,512 feet in Durango to 11,075 feet on Red Mountain Pass.

DISTANCE TO DURANGO

The Durango-La Plata County Airport (DRO) is the primary regional airport for SW Colorado and the Four Corners area. Located just 14 miles from historic downtown Durango, DRO is the perfect starting point for a scenic trip on the Durango & Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad, a visit to Mesa Verde National Park, or a holiday at Purgatory Ski Area. Why spend your valuable time driving for hours, only to arrive in Colorado exhausted? Skip the drive and fly Durango. Step off the plane and start your adventure!

DRO offers year round flights from Denver, Dallas-Fort Worth, Houston and Phoenix with seasonal service to Chicago and Los Angeles.
