

INTO THE MOUNTAINS

1. A GREAT VIEW FROM YOUR BACKYARD

Nestled beneath craggy peaks of the San Juan Mountains, Molas Lake offers pristine views and opportunity for Winter fun.

Twilight Peak is the highest peak in the West Needle Mountain Range in the San Juans. Its beauty and grandness can be seen from an overlook on Coal Bank Pass.

Known as "The Train" by locals, the historic steam engine takes riders from Durango to Silverton via the route constructed in 1882.




A SCENIC DIZIVE

STROLL THROUGH A WINTER WONDERLAND

4. AROUND THE LAKE


A perfect day for a perfect hike! Andrews Lake offers easy access for snowshoes, cross country skis, and hikers alike.

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
2. DURANGO PUBLIC ART




