The Cannonball

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Confederate Soldiers Buried on Cemetery Hill

Fort Duffield

Built in 1861 to protect a Union supply route, this site is the largest and best-preserved Kentucky earthen fortress. The fort also served as General Sherman's headquarters. Linger for a panoramic scene of West Point, the Ohio River, and surrounding area. West Point 502-922-4574



General George Patton Museum of Leadership





From the birthplace of Lincoln to the birthplace of bourbon

Learn about Lincoln's early years growing up in Kentucky, or discover how pioneers created a uniquely American whiskey that has become a worldwide phenomenon today.

18 Lincoln Heritage House

Visit the replicated pioneer home of Hardin Thomas and his family, which was built with the help of Thomas Lincoln, a family friend. Thomas was Abraham's father and a skilled cabinet-maker. Elizabethtown 270-769-3916

19 Sarah Bush Johnston Lincoln Memorial Cabin Lincoln's stepmother's early 1800s cabin, recreated down to the brightly colored flowers and nearby butterfly garden. Period items are similar to those used during this era. 270-769-3916



Lincoln Museum in Hodgenville

Trace the life of Abraham Lincoln with exhibits and wax figures. In addition, there is an art collection and film. Hodgenville 270-358-3163



Lincoln - Johnston Marriage Site Memorial

On this site Abraham Lincoln's father, Thomas, married Sarah Bush Johnston. The original 1798 cabin was demolished in 1921.



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Abraham Lincoln's Birthplace

Climb the 56 steps (one for each year of Lincoln's life) leading to the Memorial Building, which houses the symbolic cabin. See Lincoln family exhibits. Hodgenville 270-358-3137

Abraham Lincoln Boyhood Home

At the base of a IOO-year-old oak tree springs some of the purist limestone water found in the knobs of central Kentucky. Originally, the spring fed an 1800s schoolhouse located adjacent to the farm. Today, this natural spring is used to distill small-batch bourbon, amber, and moonshine the first from Hardin County, Kentucky since Prohibition. 270-351-2013



Elizabethtown Nature Park/Hardin County Veterans Tribute/Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall

The 104-acre Elizabethtown Nature Park is located on Ring Road just north of Freeman Lake Park. The Hardin County Veterans Tribute serves as the centerpiece of the Nature Park. Visitors can stroll along the pathway to closely view the five life-size bronze sculptures - one for each branch of the military. The Wall is an 80 percent scale of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall in Washington, D.C. It measures 360 ft. long and 8 ft. tall. The Memorial was built in 40 days by members of the Veterans Tribute Group, UAW/Ford 862, the City of Elizabethtown, and Bluegrass Tank. This is a tribute to those brave men and women who served in Vietnam, both living and dead. 270-769-3916 or 270-765-6121

Elizabethtown Sports Park
