Morning Star. Duck Paddle. Friendship Circle. Indian Star.

From 1884 to 1975, the 19 Quilt Gardens weave a story of Elkhart County's and Indiana's colorful past. Reflecting popular quilt patterns of their era, the Quilt Gardens offer a peek into what life was like for Hoosiers from pioneer settlers, growing families, farmsteads and industrialists.

The Duck Paddle pattern quite appropriately is located at the Elkhart County Historical Museum in Bristol, near the banks of the St. Joseph River and the many ducks that flock there.

The Morning Star pattern in downtown Elkhart's Central Park calls to mind the former site of the city's municipal Christmas tree and the famous arch that once graced a nearby intersection.

Friendship Circle, at the Elkhart County 4-H Fairgrounds in Goshen, pays homage to the camaraderie that helped Goshen and the rest of Elkhart County endure the Great Depression.

Indian Star, which can be seen at Das Dutchman Essenhaus, is a reminder of Middlebury's position near one-time Native American trails as well as the town's centennial in 1936.

Slow down and get away when you visit **Amish Country** on the Heritage Trail. Immerse yourself in the Amish lifestyle through a working Amish farm, nestled amid lush farmland, and try your hand at milking a cow or feeding newborn calves. Indulge in comfort foods that will remind you of your childhood - bite into a piece of crunchy fried chicken at family-style favorites such as **Das Dutchman Essenhaus** or **Amish Acres**. More mashed potatoes, anyone? Quaint shops will wow you with the craftsmanship - from fine woodworking and quilts to scrumptious baked goods - of Amish artisans.



Ignite your senses

History comes alive along the Heritage Trail in repurposed factories, historic mansions, even a wellfield, that visitors can see up close. At **The Old Bag Factory**'s campus in Goshen, shoppers can browse under the roof of the former Chase Bag Co. Venture downtown and stop at **Ignition Music Garage**, a dealer of record albums and also a concert stage located in a one-time car repair shop. In Nappanee, **Coppes Commons** houses shops, eateries and a museum in the former Coppes Kitchen Cabinets factory. The lives of the rich and famous are on full display at the **Ruthmere Museum** and the nearby **Havilah Beardsley House**.
