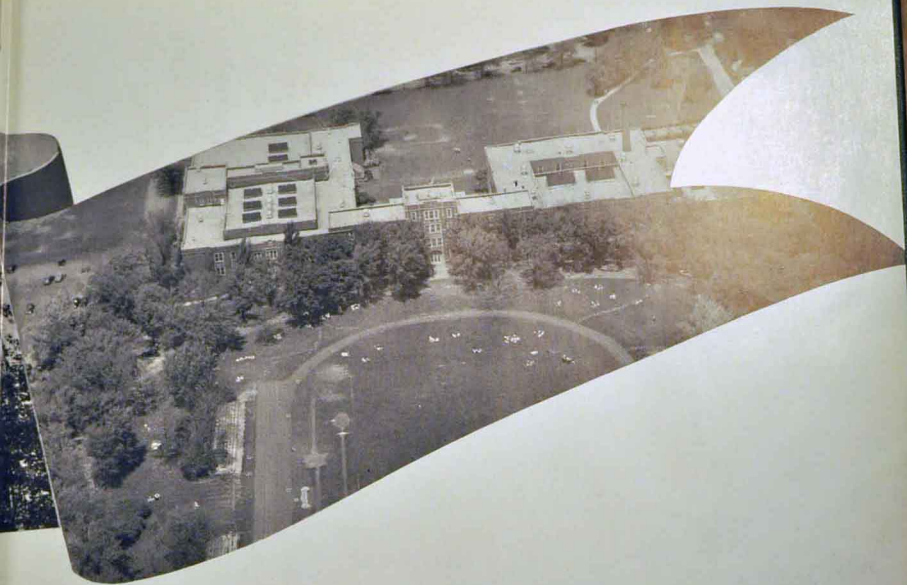

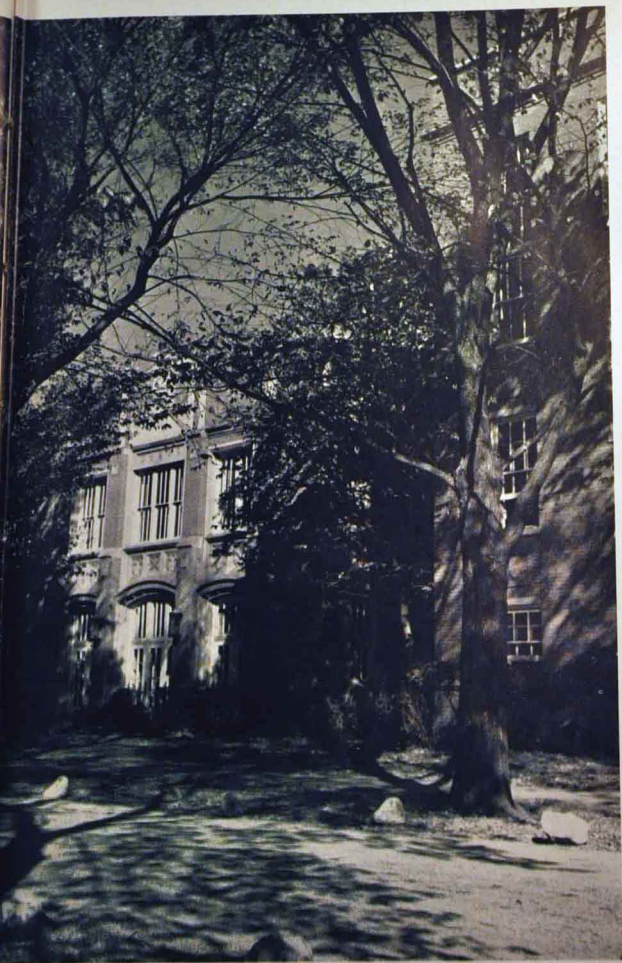

The Middle Ages! Intellectually so preposterous, spiritually so strange. The pageant of those centuries charm our eyes.



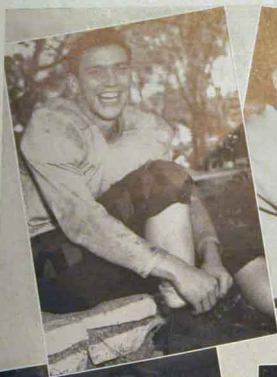

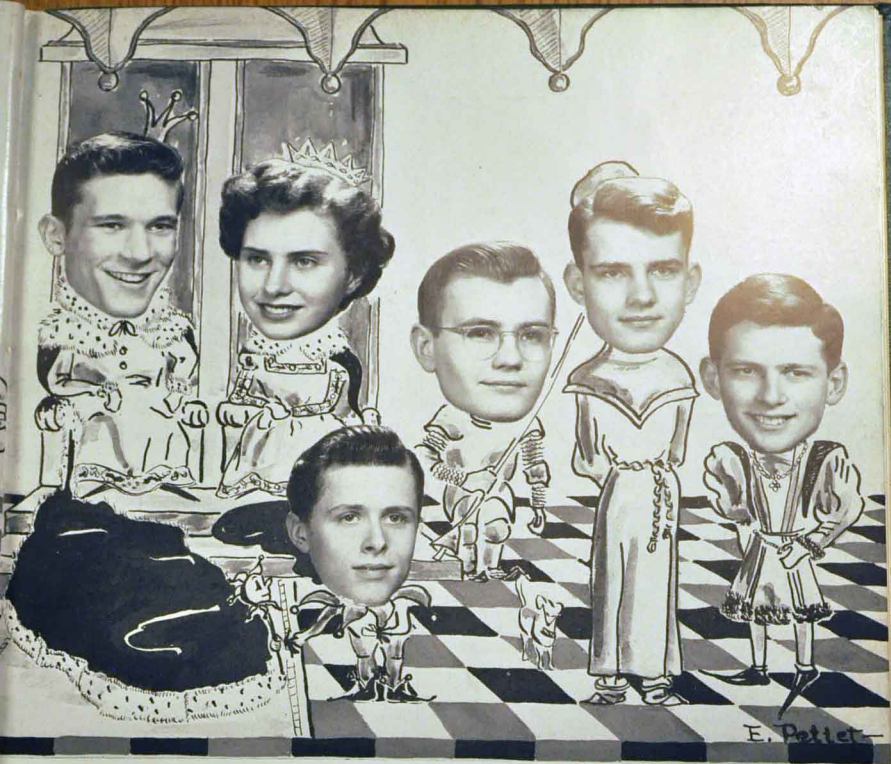






Meet the outstanding members of the class of '50 in this scene from merry Yorkshire Hall.

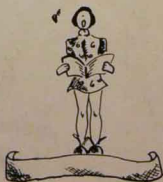

In Medieval days the scribes were very special members of the castle. They knew how to read and write. York's Quill and Scroll members can be compared to these scribes. Any York-Hi staff member who has done superior work in writing, editing or business management and who has had forty-five articles of material printed in the paper is eligible. The committee chairman; the head photographer, if he's a senior; the business manager; and the editor of the *Y's Tales* are recommended by Mr. Morgan for this honor.

This year Nanci Leader, president; Ed Ross, vice-president; and Shirley Kling, secretary-treasurer, capably handled all Quill and Scroll projects. During the first semester the members took a special tour through The Chicago Tribune. They were shown how a big newspaper is put out every day. Everybody had an interesting trip.

The main project for the second semester was the drive for books to be sent to Europe through the CARE organization. Quill and Scroll members cooperated with the York-Hi on this drive.

A film, "Hungry Minds," was shown in all English classes during April. Money was collected from the students to buy these books. The replenishment of high school libraries in Europe was the aim of this drive. Quill and Scroll and the York-Hi planned to send their books to a high school in Germany.

In a local editorial contest held last fall which was open to members of Quill and Scroll, Hoyt Mathews won first prize. In the spring a similar contest was held, and Lucille Eddy won first place.

Quill and Scroll sponsored various other contests. One was in connection with the Scholastic Magazine. It covered any type of writing. Between forty and fifty manuscripts were submitted by York students. Among these manuscripts were eight original short stories, two essays, and two sets of poetry in addition to the regular news columns.

Last but not least twenty-five new members were initiated in May. The initiation was both formal and funny.

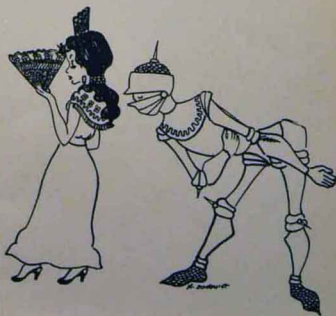

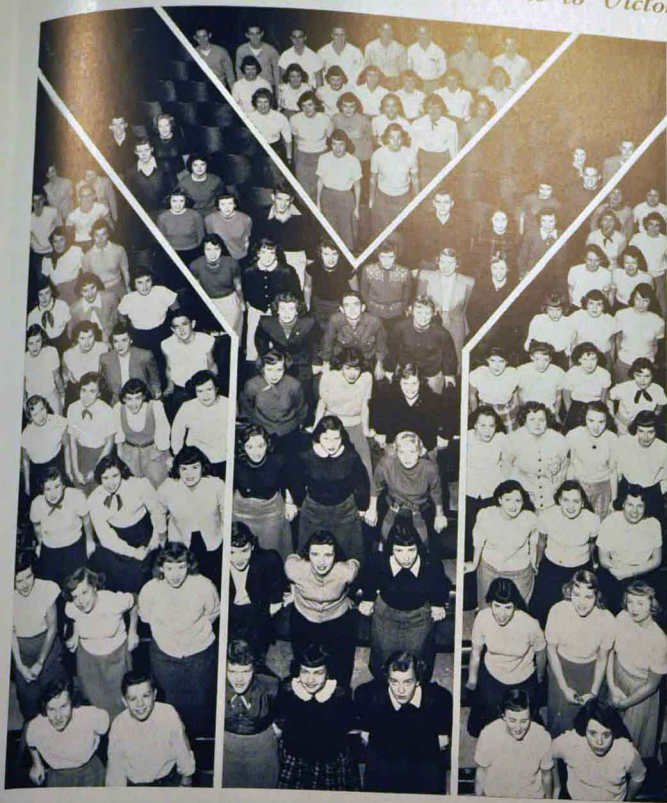

The club had a big picnic late in the spring at Fullersburg to end the school year with a bang.



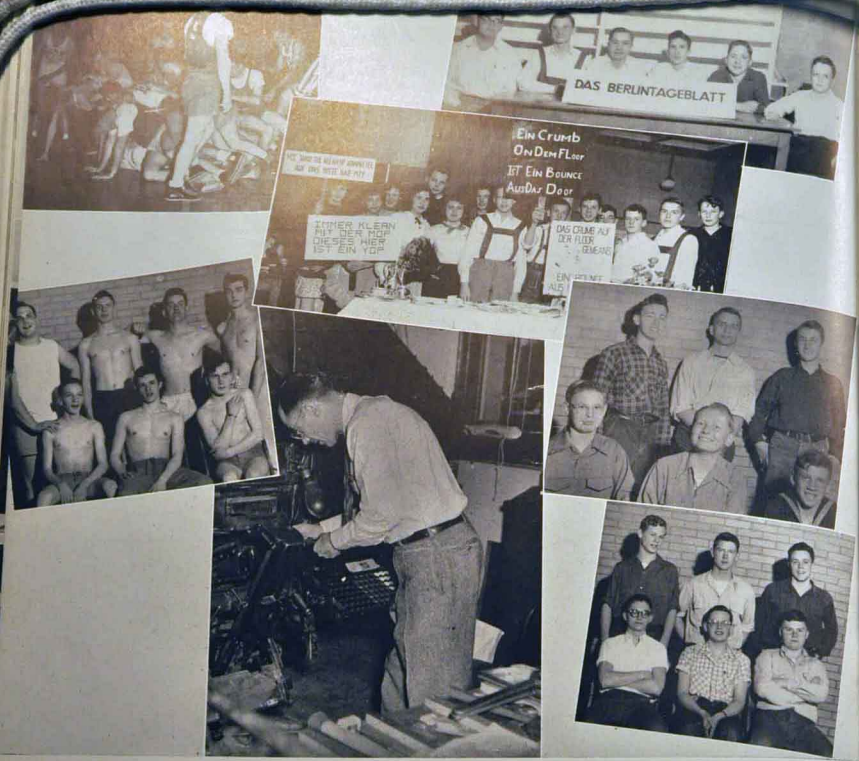

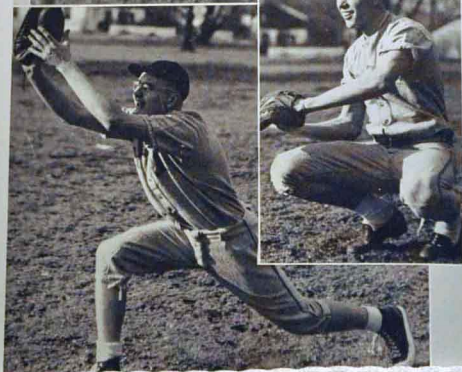
# Diamond Dukes Fight For Conference Championship
