

The members, at the present time, are occupied in selecting a club pin which any member may buy. Guards for the pins will be awarded according to a point system.





Obviously enough, the aim of this versatile club is (in the president's own words) "to work math and have fun while doing it."





This year Bob Leishman is president and is doing a wonderful job running this popular club.





Sheiks of York Experience Rough and Tumble Season






York Grabs Second-Place Trophy at Naperville Relays


