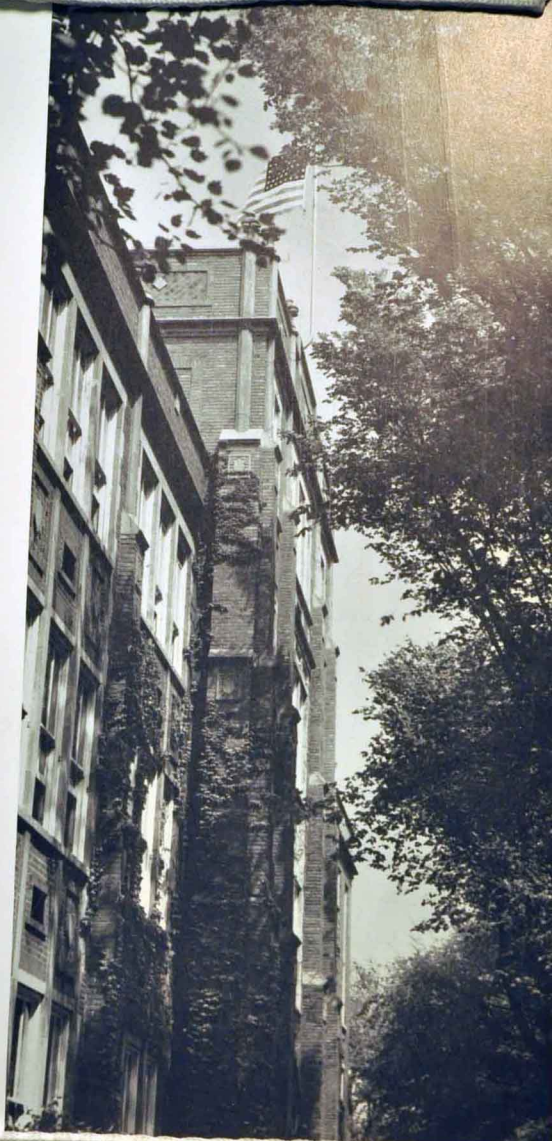

We have enjoyed preparing this book for you, and we hope you will enjoy reading it and keeping it as your memory of York in 1951-1952.





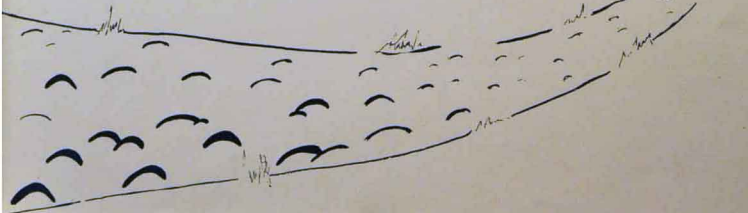

Our superintendent, Dr. Paul A. Young, came to York at mid-year two years ago, just in time to inherit the headaches of increasing enrollment, crowded conditions, and plans for taking care of an ever-increasing number of Yorkites. The new cafeteria, which opened the second semester, is a first step toward solving some of the difficulties.

Under Mr. Young's administration the first York Homecoming was held, and he initiated the Alumni Association. The Guidance Services Department and a state-supported transportation system are other contributions for which he is largely responsible.

We appreciate the time and effort Mr. Young has put into making York a better school (his working time has ranged through all hours of day and night); and we hope that his future years here will be pleasant.

The pleasant-looking man on the right, whose smile is as familiar at York as the ivy on the front of the building, is our Assistant Principal, Mr. Roy De Shane.

Mr. De Shane hasn't missed a day of school because of illness since the fall of 1924 and has remained one of the busiest persons at York during these 27 years of service. While students are enjoying a summer vacation, he is planning the students' and teachers' schedules for the coming year. The problems of growing enrollment at York have called for a great deal of work on the part of the administration, and Mr. De Shane has naturally been devoting much time to activities connected with expansion plans.

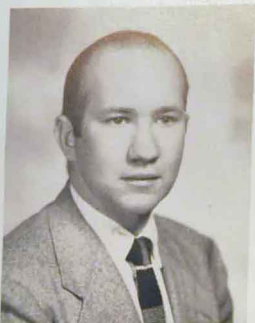

Miss Davis is the Quill and Scroll faculty advisor.

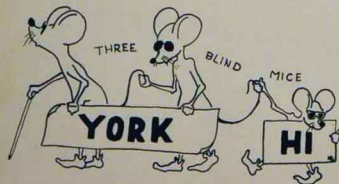

The Concert Band this year has been under the excellent direction of its two new, capable directors, Mr. Reimer and Mr. Puppel. Its efforts are dedicated to the service of the school and the community, and to help spread the name of York High throughout the state.

In the fall, the musicians trained to form a marching band entertained the spectators with music and formations between halves of home varsity football games on Lithgow Memorial Field. Winter found the Concert Band divided into two pep bands, the Green and the White, which alternated in playing at the home basketball games.

The band plays marches, classical selections, and popular music with equal facility, and all look forward to the concerts that are presented throughout the year. This year, four presentations were scheduled. The Christmas Concert, held December 16, featured Morrissey's *An American Week End* and ensemble and solo numbers. A new feature of the department, the ensemble groups, was introduced in a special concert on February 21. It presented the Brass Choir, the Woodwind Quintet, and solos by members of the band.

The cost of entrance fees, transportation, and housing will be borne by the Band Parents Association from money raised by the annual Antiques Fair, sponsored each year to help out band activities.

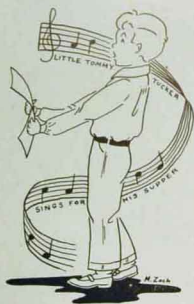
Freshmen Tommy Tuckers Sing for Suppers in Chorus

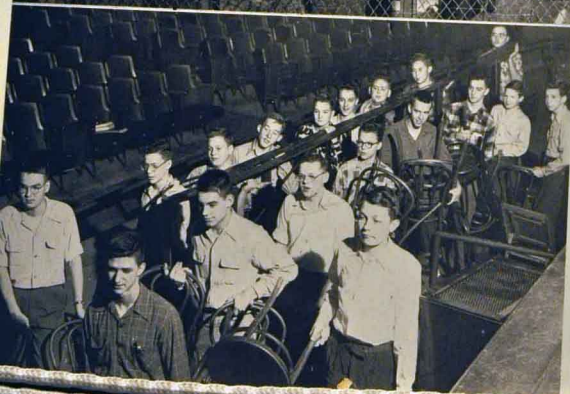
Each year the members attend a professional production. This year the Thespian members attended the play *Guys and Dolls*.

Even though this is the first year for the New Yorkers' Club, it boasts a large membership; and long life, along with York's other clubs, is just about certain.

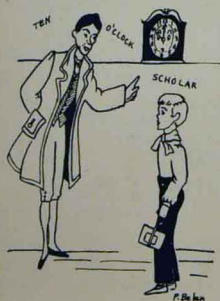

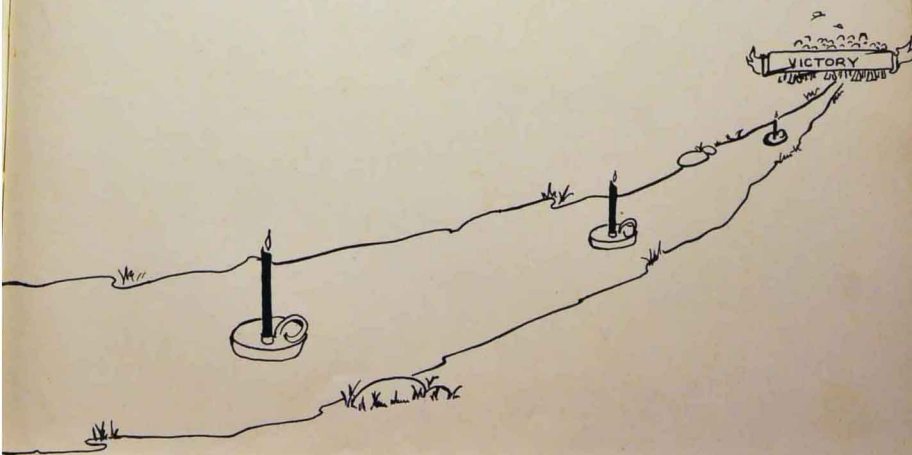

In their first year as York's new football mentors, Head Coach John Fischer and Line Coach William Mueller led the Dukes through a two win, six loss record, a comparatively good season considering that York had won only one game and tied one game in their past three campaigns.

In the opening game, Elgin jumped off to a 14-0 lead, and York's Carroll Knight broke through his own right tackle and raced 60 yards for a TD. Bruce Johnson's extra point attempt was blocked. Elgin scored again in the closing minutes and the final score read 20-6, Elgin.

In their first home game, the Dukes turned back a stubborn Arlington Heights Eleven, 13-6. After a scoreless first half York, sparked by the fire play of Carroll Knight and Paul Windlow, drove down the field for two touchdowns and one extra point. In the closing seconds of play, Arlington made one touchdown by desperation passes.

York made it two in a row the following week-end when they beat Riverside-Brookfield in the Homecoming tilt. After three quarters in which the Dukes repeatedly drove deep into R.B. territory only to meet their Waterloo in fumbles, we came forth to score seven points late in the fourth period.

In the next game a disaster called Maine struck York between the eyes—47-0, and after that a spirited Downers Grove team beat us 21 to 7.

Then came the all-important contest—York versus Glenbard. Taking advantage of two Duke errors, the Hilltoppers managed to pull by York 14-7 in a rough-and-tumble battle. A blocked punt on the York seven-yard line let Glenbard draw the first blood; however, the Dukes soon marched down the field to tie the score 7 to 7. In the second quarter, a mistake in judgment gave Glenbard the ball on our eleven-yard line, from where they scored quickly, making the final score 14 to 7.

In six inches of snow the Dukes took a 38-0 setback from the mighty Hinsdale eleven, the eventual West Suburban Conference champs.

In the La Grange tilt the Dukes held the Lions just about gainless in the first half, but, as always seemed their fate, they ran out of steam to be plowed under 28 to 6.

The Dukes' mainstays in the past season were Co-Captains Carroll Knight and Bob Golseth, who both made all conference honors; Jerry Weingand and Dick McConnell, tackles; Marve Chaney and Jerry Wheeler, guards; and Bruce Carlson, Ernie Echelman, and Wayne Mahood, ends.

With nine returning lettermen and a fairly good frosh-soph coming up, coaches Mueller and Fischer have high hopes for next season.

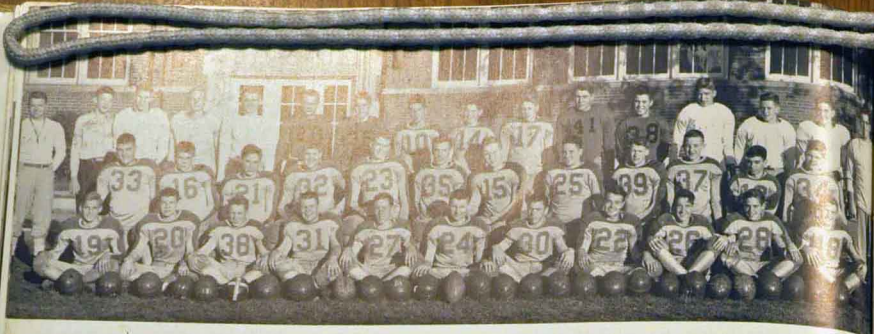

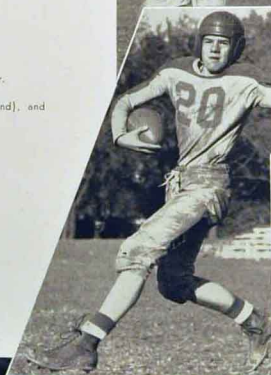

York Dukes, with Lady Luck on their side next year, have a prosperous year ahead with four regulars returning.

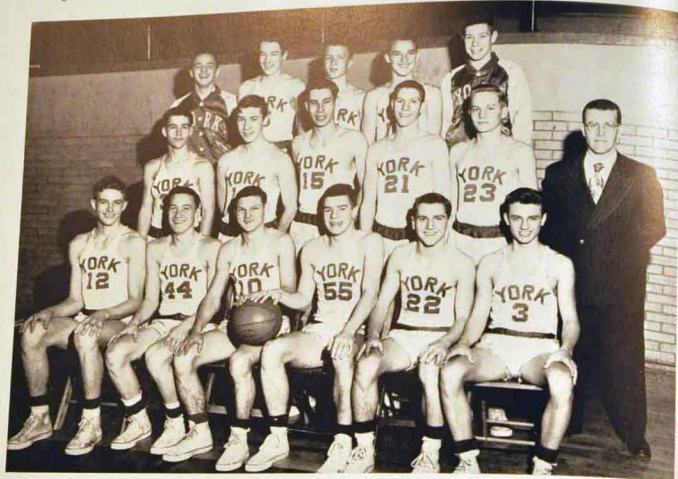

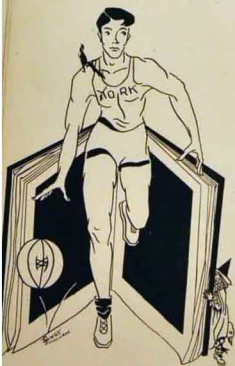

Head Coach Stefani and Assistant Coach Mueller led the York matmen through a comparatively good season, considering the opposition.

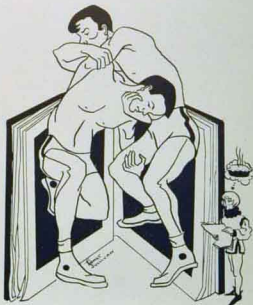
