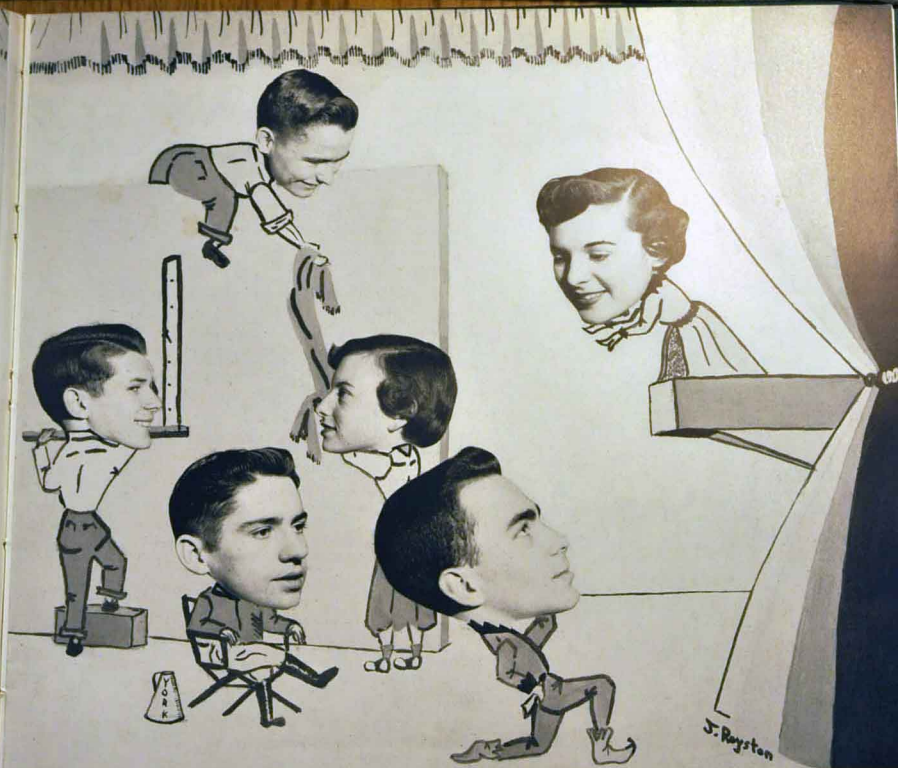

The goal of all York journalists is to become a member of Quill and Scroll, an international honorary society. Its principal purpose is to recognize special work done in the field of journalism. Quill and Scroll, like all honorary clubs, has its own rigid qualifications. In addition to doing superior work on the newspaper or yearbook staff in editing, business management, art work, or writing, a student must be in the upper third of his class. Members elected from the **York-Hi** writing staff must have had forty-five inches of material printed in the newspaper. It is impossible to measure material written for **Y's Tales** in terms of inches; therefore, yearbook workers are elected on the basis of work, quality of performance, and the capability of assuming responsibility. Members from both publications are chosen for work in business management, editing, and art work. The candidates for Quill and Scroll must be recommended by a faculty adviser.

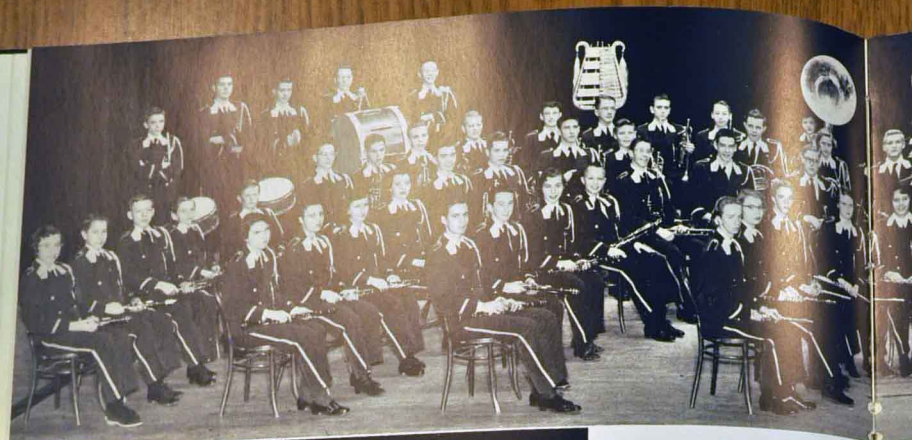

Open to all students who are dramatically inclined is York's troupe—Number Ninety-Four—of the National Thespian Dramatic Society. Candidates for membership, however, must be sophomores or juniors. If they try out successfully, they serve the next year as apprentices, engaging either in acting or in production work. Those who have accumulated enough merit hours during this time to warrant appointment to membership are thus honored.

When a person becomes a full member, he is eligible to wear the Thespian pin, one of the most attractive emblems worn by York students. The design shows representations of the two types of masks worn by Greek actors: the mask of a serious face, used in tragedies; and the Deaf laughing face, used for comedies. These two tiny, golden images, facing in opposite directions, are separated by a blue "T"—for "Thespians." Also of gold is the guard, showing a wreath encircling an "N"—standing for "National." The name "Thespians" is derived from the name of the ancient Grecian actor Thespis, who lived about 535 B.C. He was the first to introduce specific characters into a play to supplement or supersede the traditional chorus.

During the academic year, the activities regularly engaged in by the Thespians are a dinner for apprentice members, a trip to Chicago to see a professionally staged play—this year **Dial M For Murder**—the production of Drama Night, and the initiation of those who have completed their apprenticeship.

In December, York's Thespians, under the direction of Miss Doris E. White, present their annual production, Drama Night, consisting of three one-act plays. This year there was a farce, "The Doctor in Spite of Himself;" a comedy, "The Purple Door Knob;" and a tragedy, "Where the Cross Is Made."

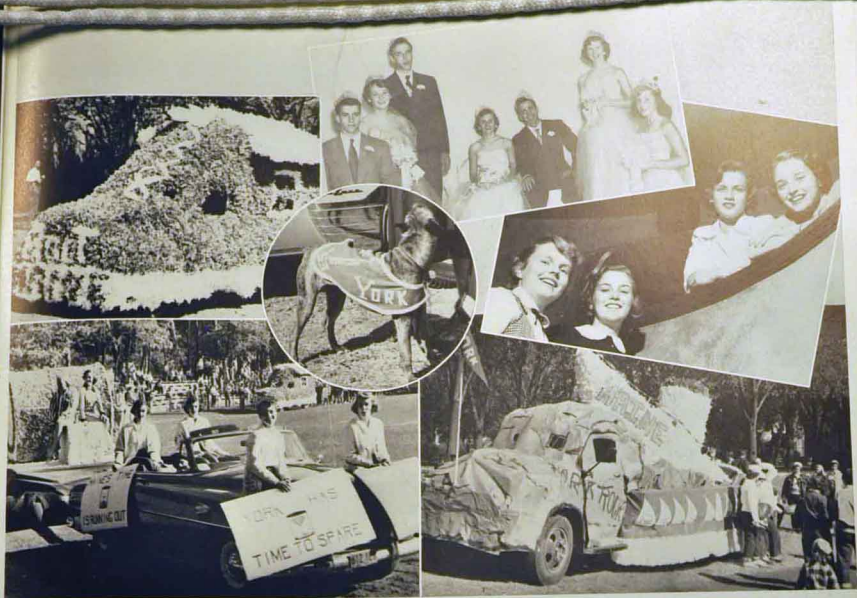

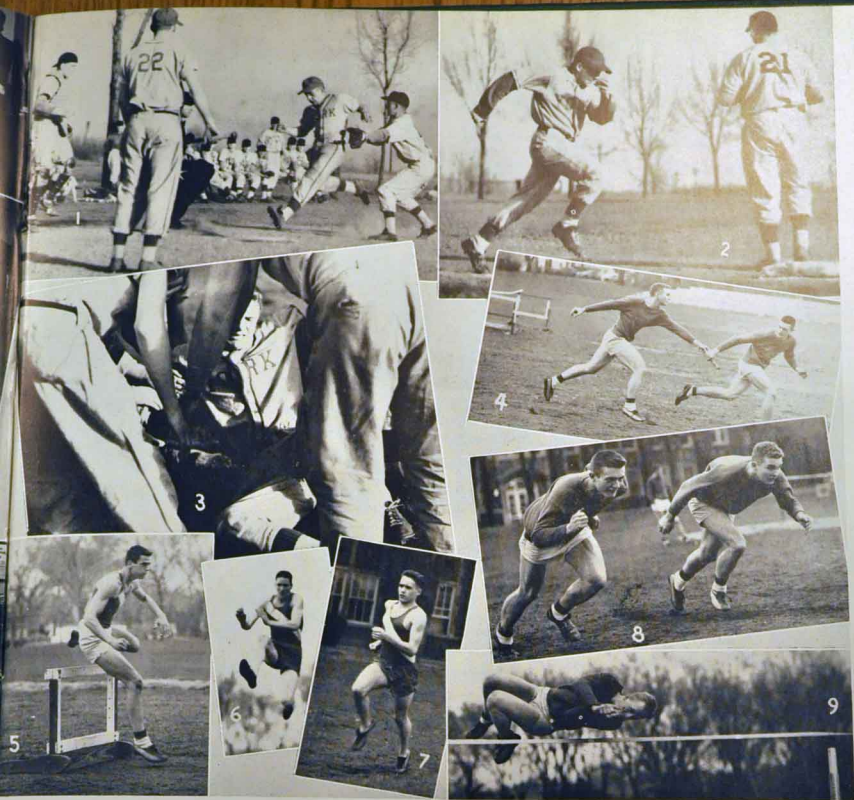

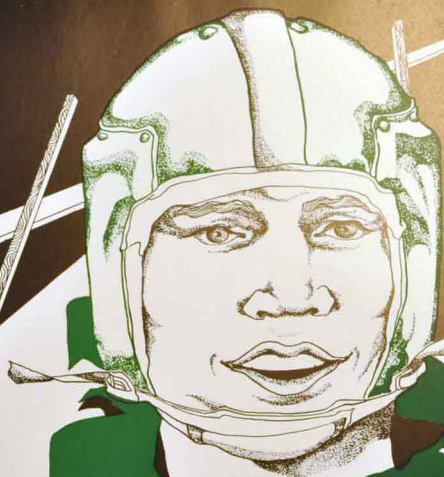

A week later the gridders dropped a close tilt to Downers Grove 14-13.

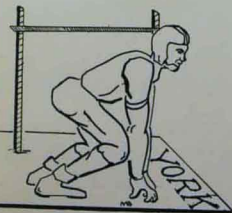

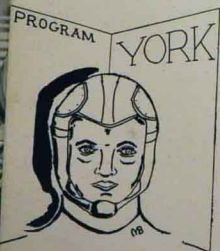

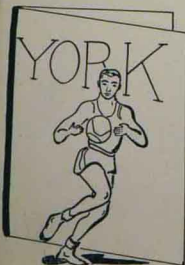

It can be said that the Dukes had a very successful season.



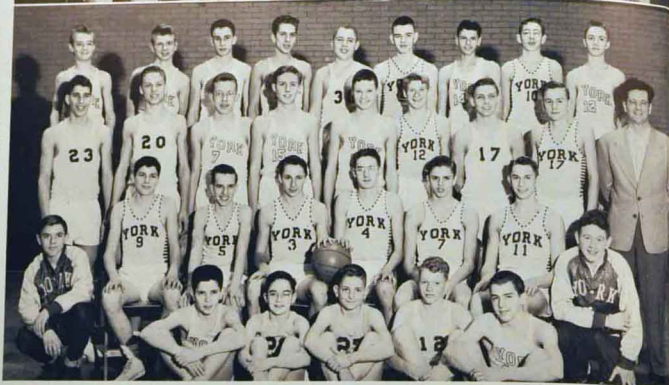

Tom Bartmann racked up 107 points to lead the team in the scoring department, followed closely by Bruce Karr and his 93 counters.

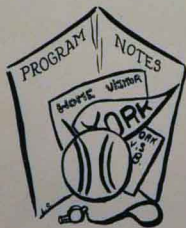

Last year's tennis squad for the second consecutive year finished second in the West Suburban tennis standings.

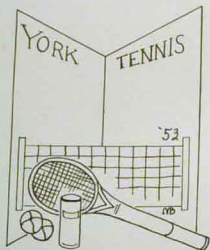
Elmer Kunze, York's capable tennis mentor, had three returning lettermen plus three capable boys from last year's frosh-soph and a senior to build his team around.

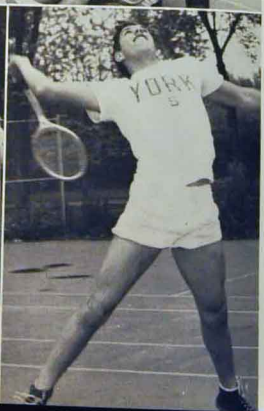

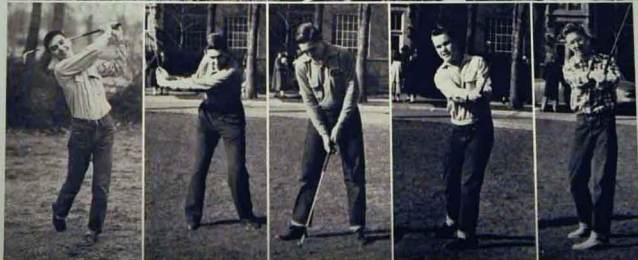
Last year the average shooting of the six senior lettermen was in the low eighties while this year it will not be as good and we will have to expect shooting in the high nineties and low hundreds.

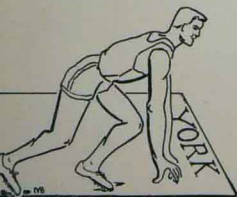

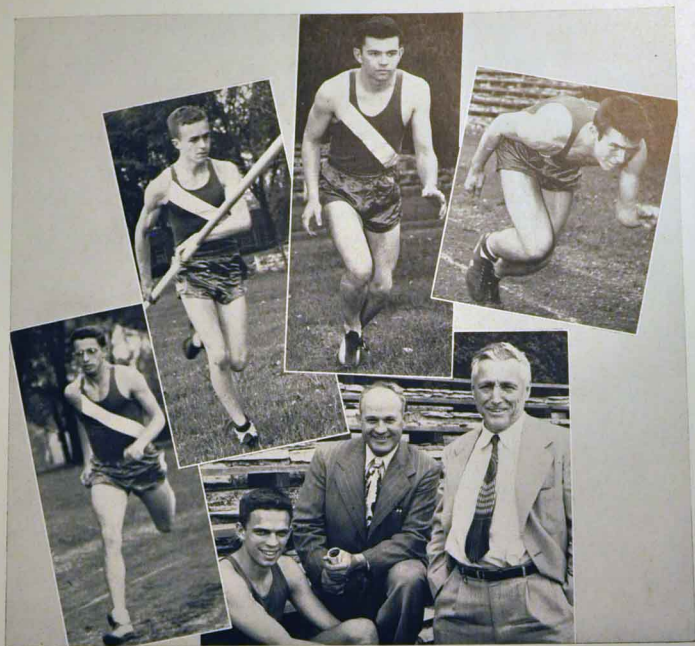

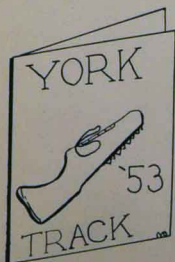
Not doing so well as the varsity were Mr. Heinhorst's frosh-soph, who finished seventh in the conference.

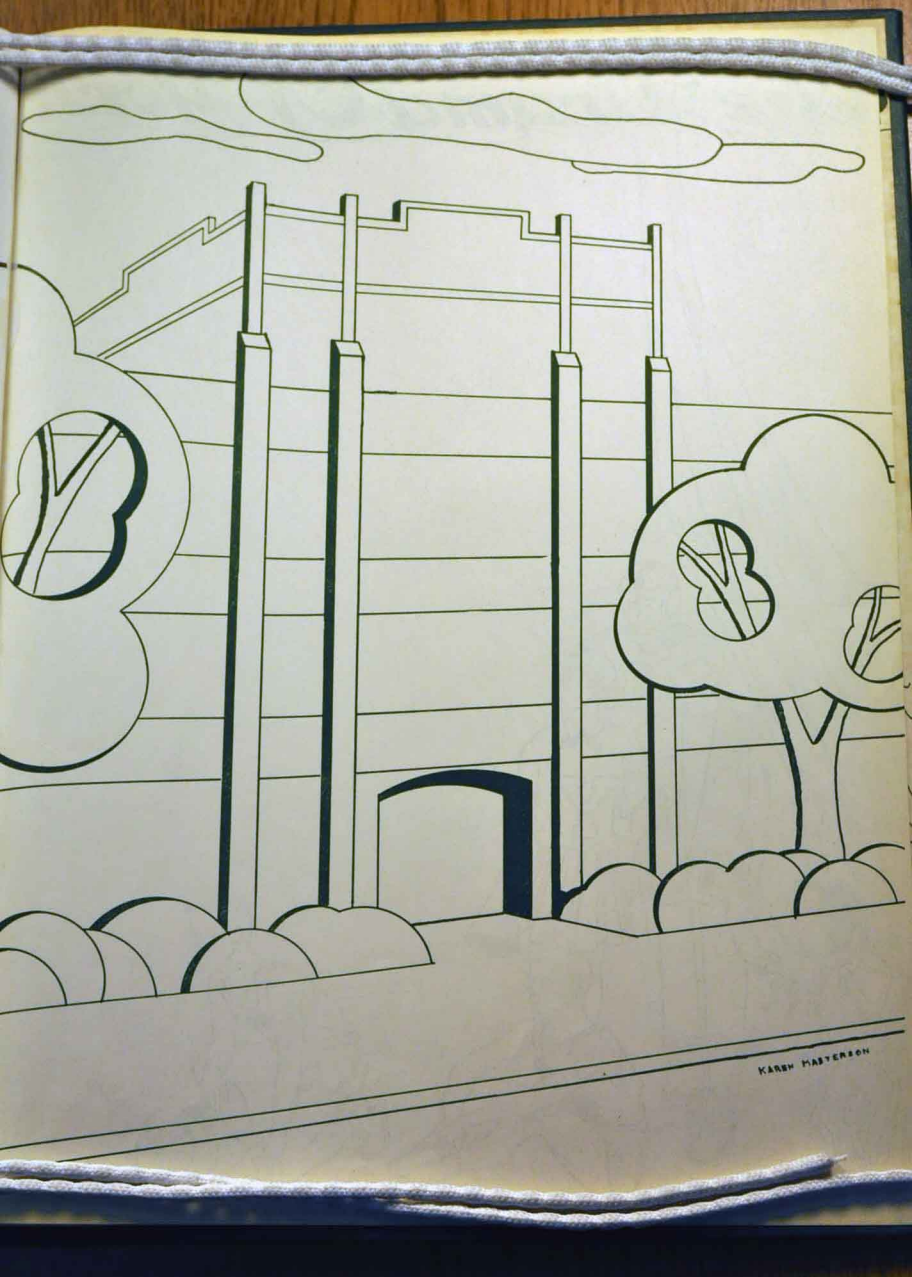
