



In addition to doing superior work on the newspaper or yearbook staff in editing, business management, at work, or writing, a student must be in the upper third of his class. Members elected from the York-HI writing staff must have had forty-five inches of material printed in the newspaper. It is impossible to measure material written for Ys Tales in terms of inches; therefore, yearbook workers are elected on the basis of work, quality of performance, and the capability of assuming responsibility. Members from both publications are chosen for work in business management, editing, and art work. The candidates for Quill and Scroll must be recommended by a faculty adviser.

During second semester all committee chairmen, head photographer, and business manager of the Y's Tales staff, or those on the Yark-Hi staff who have contributed a specified amount of material, or in some way have earned enough points may become members. There are also honorary members whose grade average is not high enough to meet the standards, but who because of their hard work deserve the honor of belonging to this club.

This year Carolyn Whitaker, President; Barbara Seldon, Vice-President; and Carolyn Tilly, Secretary-Treasurer, capably handled all Quill and Scroll projects.

The faculty advisor for Quill and Scroll is Miss Eleanor Davis.




"The Front Page" News is the Main News of the Day


When a person becomes a full member, he is eligible to wear the Thespian pin, one of the most attractive emblems worn by York students. The design shows representations of the two types of masks worn by Greek actors: the mask of a serious face, used in tragedies; and the Data aughing face, used for comedies. These two tiny, application may be a facing in opposite directions, are separated by a blue "T"—for "Thespians." Also of gold is the guard, showing a wreath encircling an "N"—standing for "National." The name "Thespians" is derived from the name of the ancient Greefan actor Thespis, who lived about 535 B.C. He was the first to introduce specific characters into a play to supplement or supersede the traditional chorus.

The club awards pins to those who have good attendance and have worked on projects for the club.






Enjoying its third year, the Future Teachers' Association has again proved of value to those students who aspire to a teaching career. Mrs. Berglund is sponsor of the club,


















Led by Head Coach John Fisher and Line Coach William Mueller, the Dukes tasted victory only once this season, while tying two and dropping six filts.


York's Linksters Hit That Ball for Conference Lead

With the good shooting of last year's upperclassmen, York took second place in the F. S. Conference Meet,




