


#### Staff Launches Yearbook on Successful Voyage

The organization claims twenty-six active members. Aspirants who fail to meet all the requirements but have made sizeable contributions to the publications, are made honorary Quill and Scroll members.


This year, the members took their annual trip to a Chicago newspaper plant. They also sponsored contests for newspaper writing and art work.

Next year, a cadet orchestra will be formed to further the growth of the orchestra.






# Over the Bounding Main Come the Senior Choir Voices

Behind-the-scenes sponsor of Music Club is Mr. Harris.







This year Equestrian Club has a new sponsor. Her name is Mrs. Evans. Members all have an interest in horses and going riding a great deal of the time.


## Science Clubbers Sail in Search of Knowledge

By helping in the office, typing for the library, **York-Hi**, or **Y's Tales** staffs, the girls earn points toward their plns.





York's annual talent show was presented by the Red Cross, under the direction of Mr. Stasek, this year in order to raise funds to help their worth-while projects.


The organization also planned and presented an assembly to kick off the annual enrollment and fund raising campaign.

Each year of Girl's Club comes to a close with a tea honoring the mothers. This Mother-Daughter Tea is always a great success and enjoyed by all.



After the game it was announced that Center Jack Falter, Guard Gene Kraegel, Tackle Al Fritz and Back Bob Kruse were selected to the allconference team.




















## Koch Takes Over the Helm of York Dukes






