


Staff Launches Yearbook on Successful Voyage




Perhaps the most thrilling activity of our band is its participation in our home football games. How proud we have felt when our splendid band marched out on the field at half time displaying its marching ability.






Besides regular meetings, this year's club attended a performance of "Wish You Were Here."





At the monthly meetings, the girls hear representatives of the business world speak on proper speech, dress, behavior, and other qualifications of the good secretary.


The club attends the Business Students' Conference at Northwestern University and visits two business firms annually.

Among the highlights of the club's social activities are the fall and spring picnics, luncheon at a Chicago restaurant, and a movie or play.






York's annual talent show was presented by the Red Cross, under the direction of Mr. Stasek, this year in order to raise funds to help their worthwhile projects.


Chess Mates Plot Ways for Smooth Sailing

The club has done a splendid job so far, and we hope it will continue to keep up the good work.



Each year of Girl's Club comes to a close with a tea honoring the mothers. This Mother-Daughter Tea is always a great success and enjoyed by all.



G. A. A. Hauls in Another Net Full of Success



Midge Nicoll has proved to be a very capable leader and will undoubtedly be missed.







York Grapplers Have Best Season in History



The major meets in which the Dukes participated last year were the Naperville Relays, the County Meet, the District Meet, the Conference Meet, and the Wheaton Relays.




