



We're Proud of Our New Library

York's beautiful new library was formally dedicated on March 29. Modern and functional in design, it is intended to be used as a laboratory classroom, or more exactly, laboratory classroom. The reading areas are separated according to purpose, the Browsing Room and Vocational Arts Room on the first floor, and the Language Arts Room and Social Studies Room on the second floor. A Supplementary Textbook room on the second floor houses books in classroom

quantities. With charge-out desks removed from the study areas, students may take full advantage of each study period. The seating capacity is 216, and 28 classes may be accomodated daily.







With the help of Mr. Morgan, Y's Tales staff brings you your yearbook.






Quill and Scroll, an international society, recognizes the special work done by students in the field of journalism.



Beginning in 1949, the Sophomore Girls' Chorus has expanded from fifty members to the present ninety.


The Sophomore Chorus is the second step to the Senior Choir, which is the goal of virtually all the young singers.









The two action photos on the page are of Wagner winning the quarter mile in 1935 at the State Meet) and the 880 relay in 1935.


