



After 36 Years at York Mr. East is Retiring

Mr. Clarence D. East, a York coach and teacher for 36 years, is completing his final year at York. His football teams captured conference titles in 1922, 1923, 1930, and 1932; and the basketball teams coached by Mr. East in 1922 and 1923, ladd the conference.

Since 1927 they have had the remarkable record of never finishing lower than third in conference competition. Mr. East's track coaching has produced 3 state relay champions and 10 individual winners.


Seniors elected to the society in their junior year comprise the active chapter of this organization. Their duties include ushering at the musical events and serving as guides at various meetings held at the school.

One of the traditions of National Honor Society is to have its members from all over the country compete for scholarships. This year twenty-three York members entered in this competition.












Spanish Club Lends Flavor of Old Mexico to Circus



Duke's First Season in New Gym Disappointing






