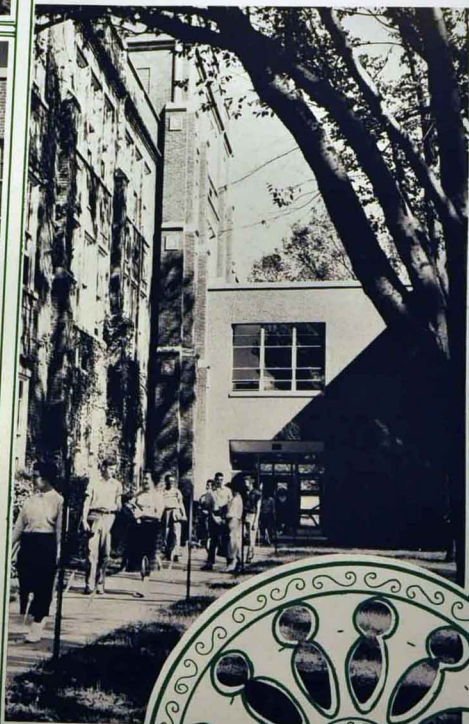

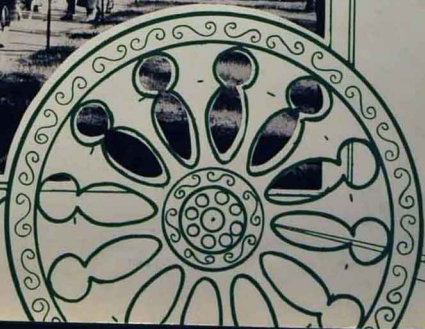

After 36 Years at York Mr. East is Retiring

Mr. Clarence D. East, a York coach and teacher for 36 years, is completing his final year at York. His football teams captured conference titles in 1922, 1923, 1930, and 1932; and the basketball teams coached by Mr. East in 1922 and 1923 led the conference.

His greatest personal achievements, however, have been his track teams. In 1936 and 1939 they won state championships. Besides this, his teams have brought home 10 district titles and 8 conference wins. Since 1927 they have had the remarkable record of never finishing lower than third in conference competition. Mr. East's track coaching has produced 3 state relay champions and 10 individual winners.

Mr. East may well be proud of his record here. To him, in gratitude for his great contributions to their school, the students of York affectionately dedicate *Y's Tales* of 1956.

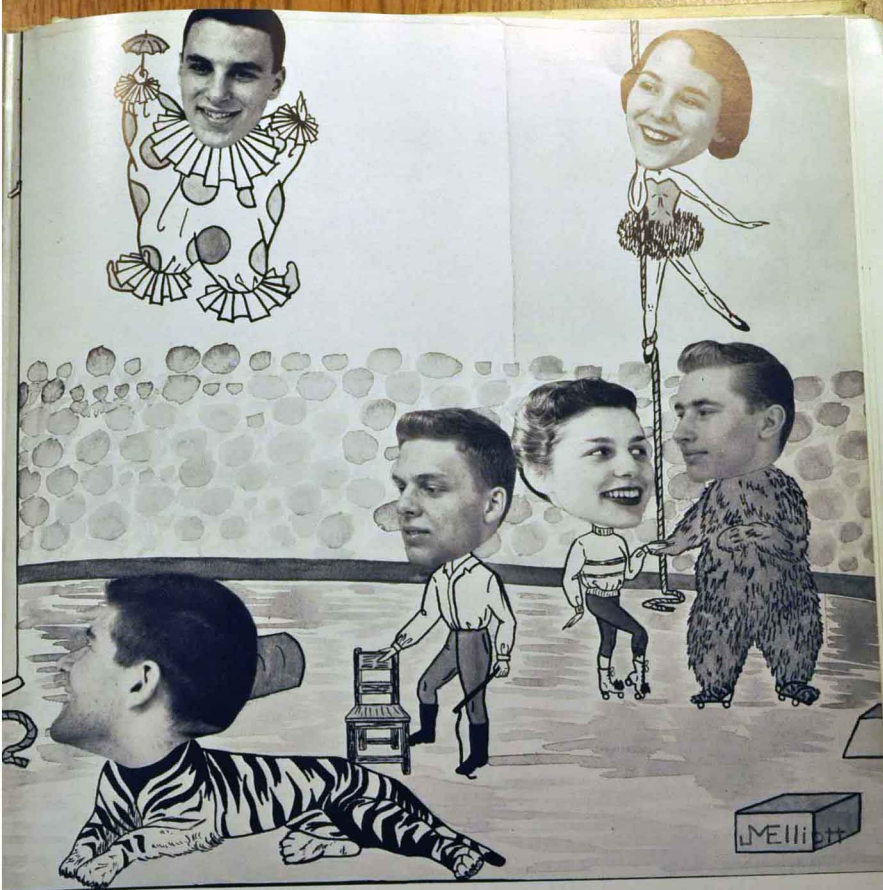




'56 'Billboard' Rates These Seniors 'Outstanding'

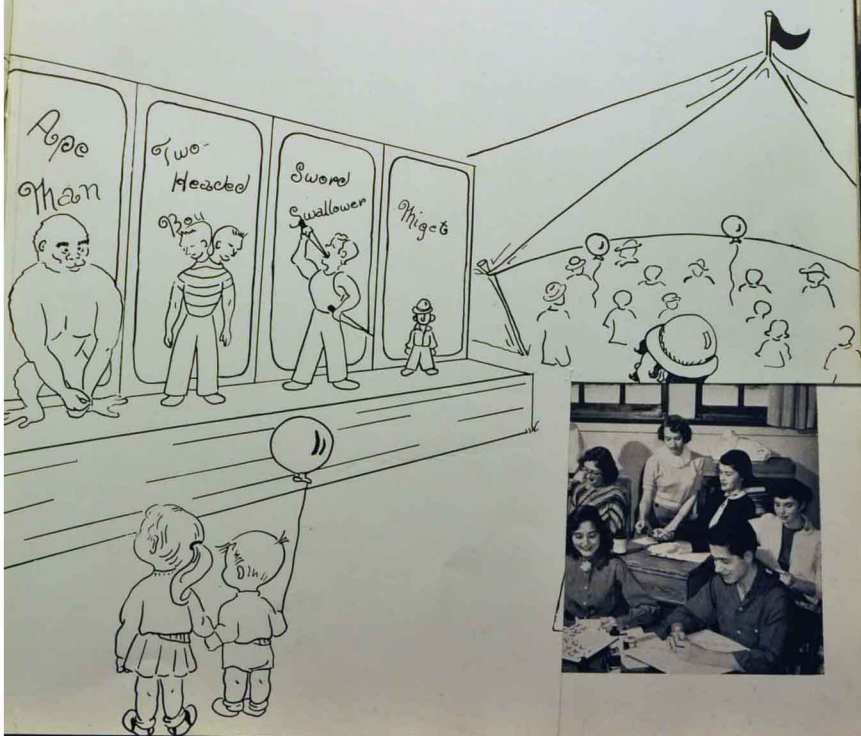

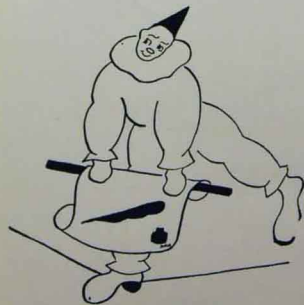

It has been separated into three classes: The clarinets, saxophones, and oboes, which meet third period; the drums, which meet fifth period; and the baritones and basses, which meet seventh period.

Mr. Reimer feels that the students will have a better opportunity to learn to play their instruments by working in the smaller groups, because in a large group there would be many more students, and each one would not get enough personal attention.

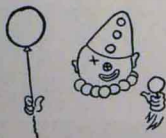

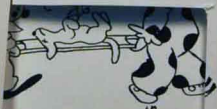

This year the club has visited St. Lukes, Evanston Hospital, Wesley Memorial Hospital and has attended the

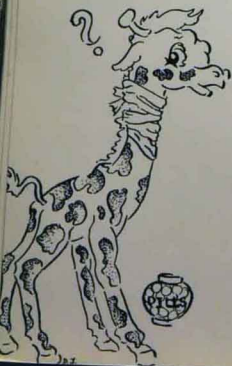
Future Nurses Club rally in Alton, Illinois.

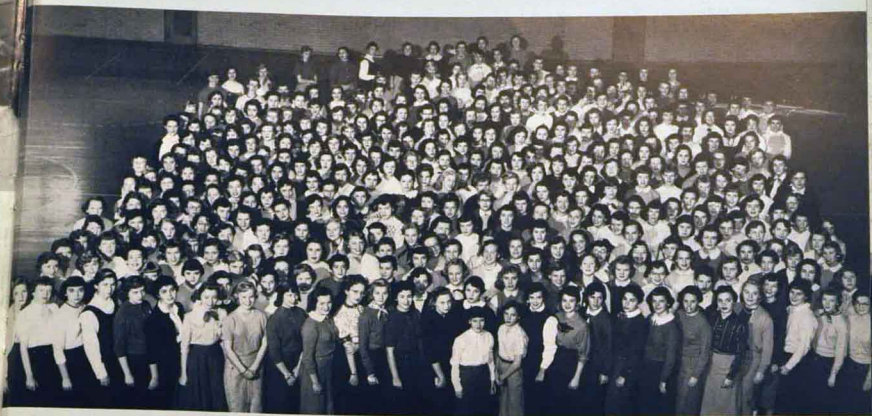

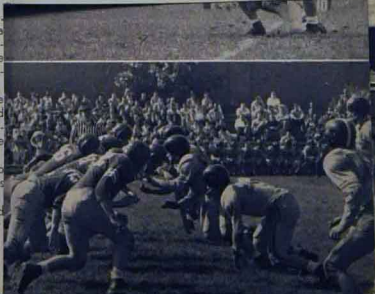

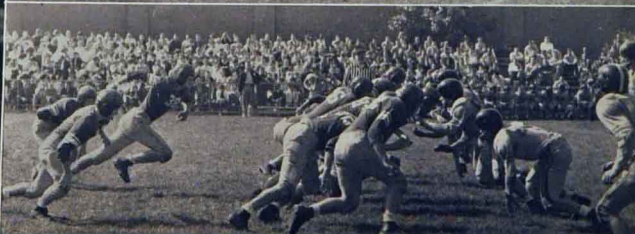


TOP RIGHT: Stahl laterals to Krause on end run.
