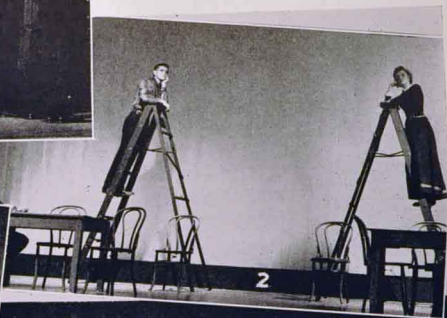

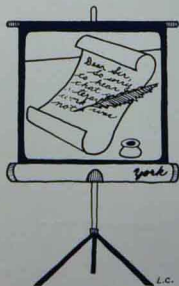
New members are initiated into Quill and Scroll in the spring of the year at the annual picnic of the club.

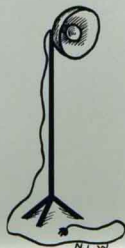

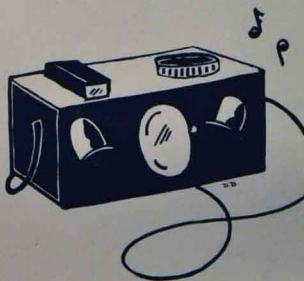

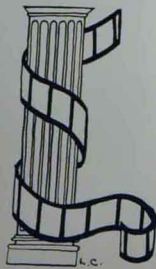
Latin Club Helps Keep Ancient Roman Customs Alive

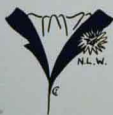

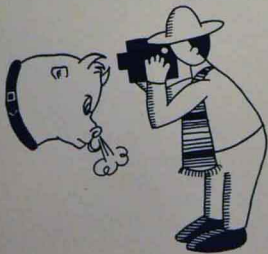

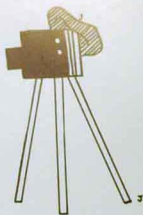
Curtain Rises on Year's French Club Activities

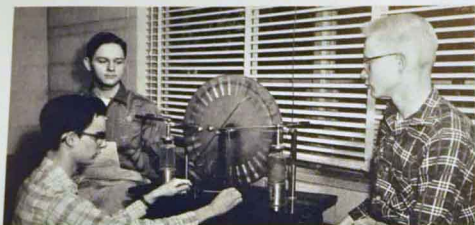
Mrs. Steed, the faculty advisor to the club, feels that it is a good way for students to express their opinions on the conditions in America and abroad.

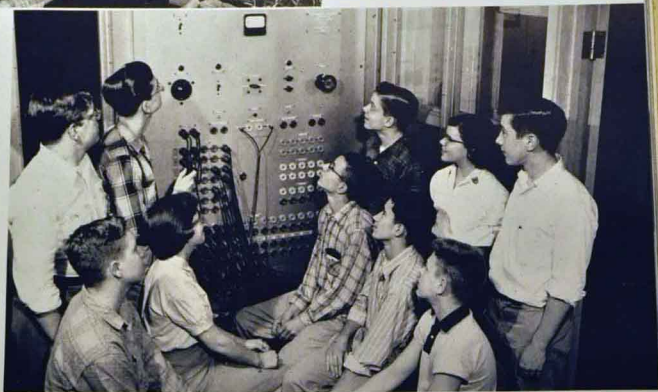

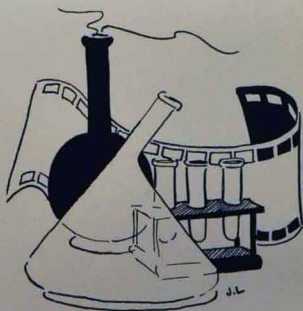

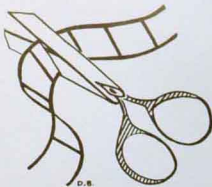


Home Economics Mixes Ingredients for Title Role

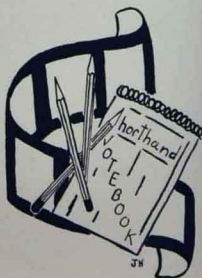

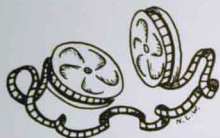

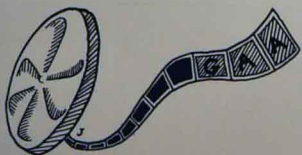
The purpose of Pep Club is to support York's sporting events with spirit, enthusiasm, and good sportsmanship.

One of the highlights of the season was against Arlington Heights when Joe Benedict ran the kickoff back for a touchdown.

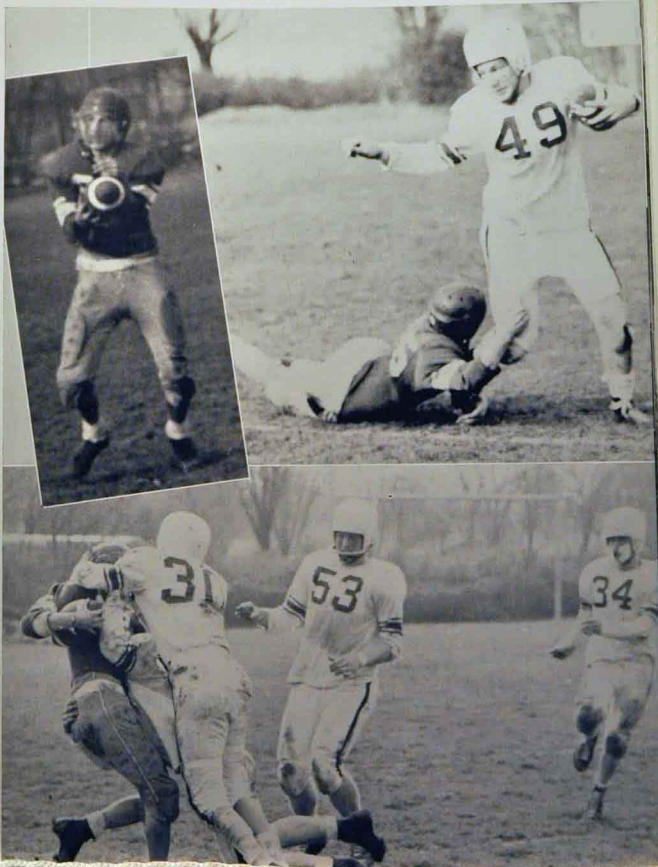

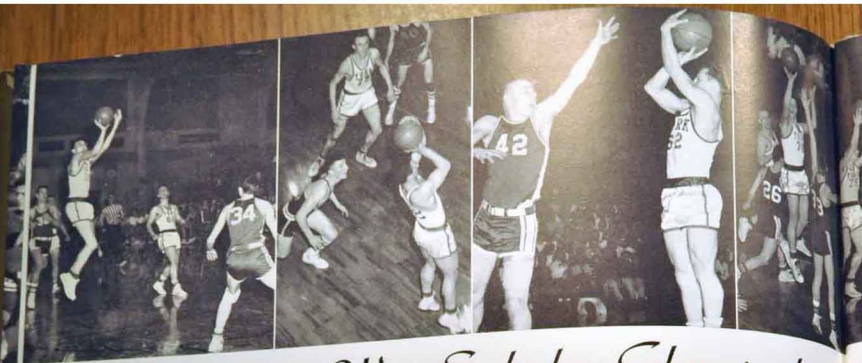

Dukes Win the West Suburban Championship

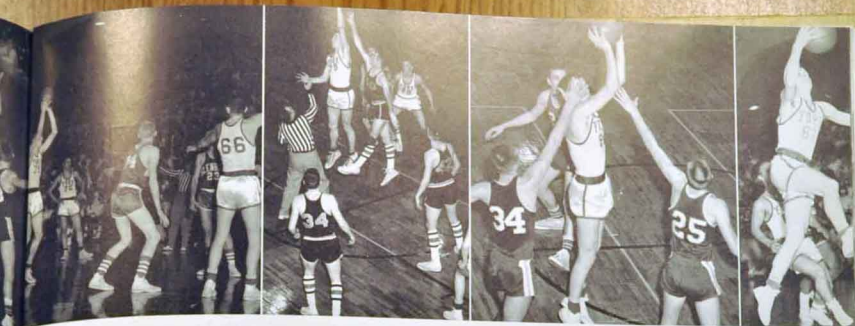

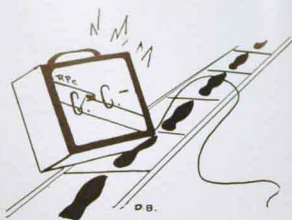


York Varsity Harriers Place Second in Conference

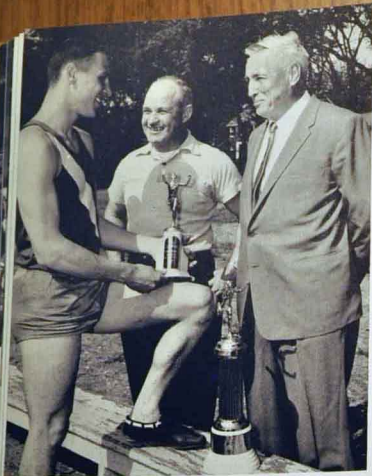

In another large meet, the DuPage County Meet, the Dukes came home with the championship trophy.

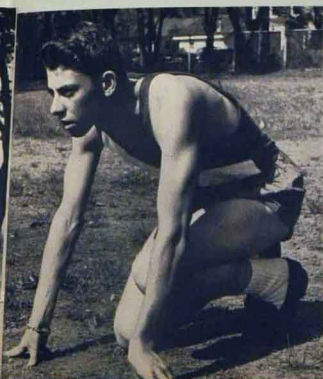
York had several boys who qualified at the District Meet and went to the State Track Meet. John Cada won his event, the pole vault, and became state champion.

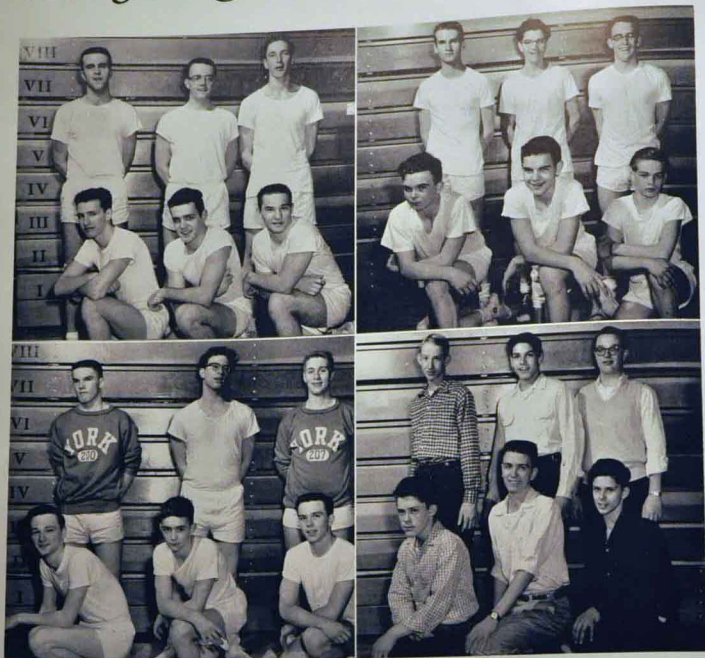
