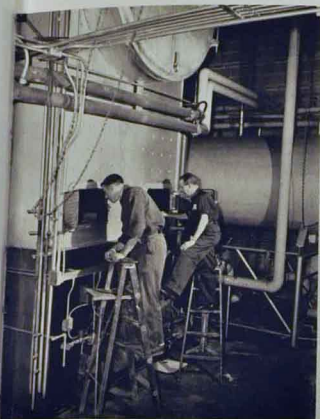

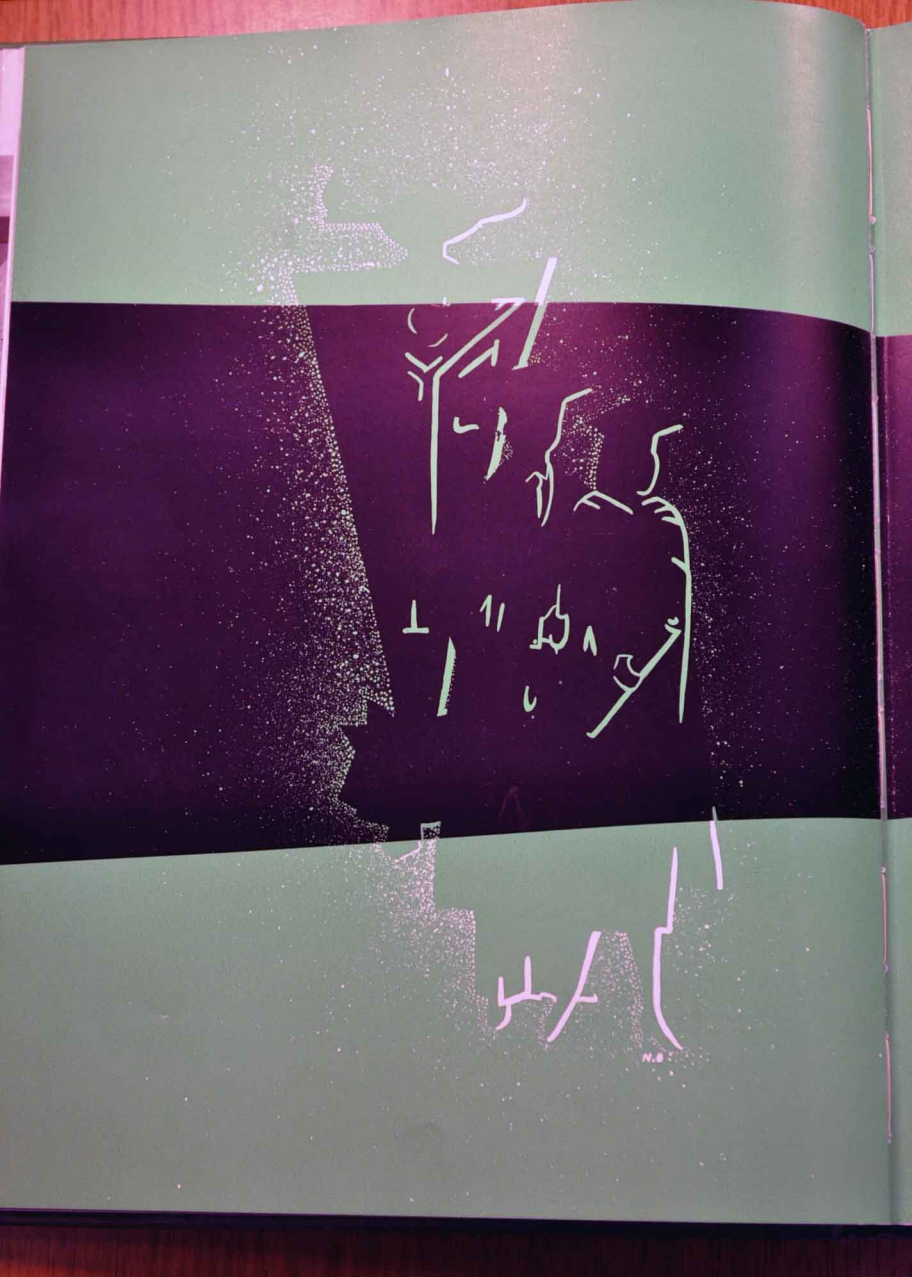

York's Girls Athletic Association was organized for those whose interest in athletics extends beyond their daily gym class. The purpose of this state-wide organization is to promote interest in sports.

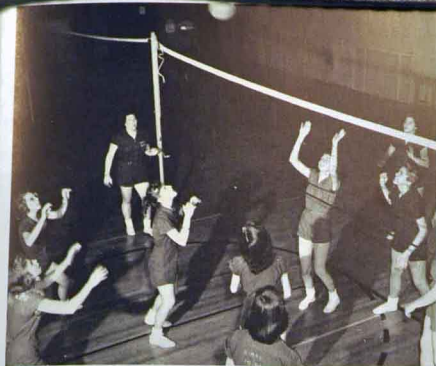
At York teams are organized each fall which participate in various sports after school each Tuesday and Thursday. This rotation of sports each six weeks allows the girls to become familiar with several activities.

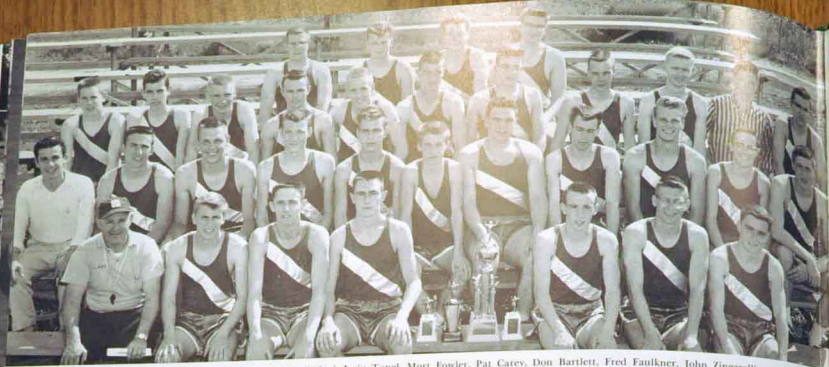

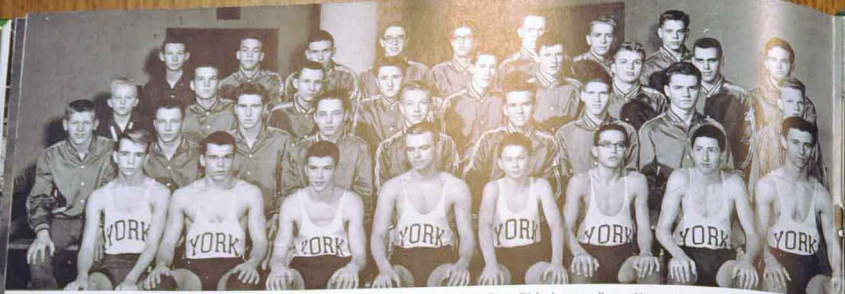
