





A year at York is a record of achievement York's aims are high. York's results are enviable.

It is to this pursuit of excellence that we dedicate this book and commend those who have won high recognition for themselves and York.







### Administrative Council Sets School Policy




















#### Leadership is Key to Successful School


## Scriblerus Encourages Literary Achievement








# Football on the Upswing at York




#### Gailis And Fontana Best In State





The Frosh-Soph team was undefeated in dual meets during the season and took the West Suburban Conference title.




