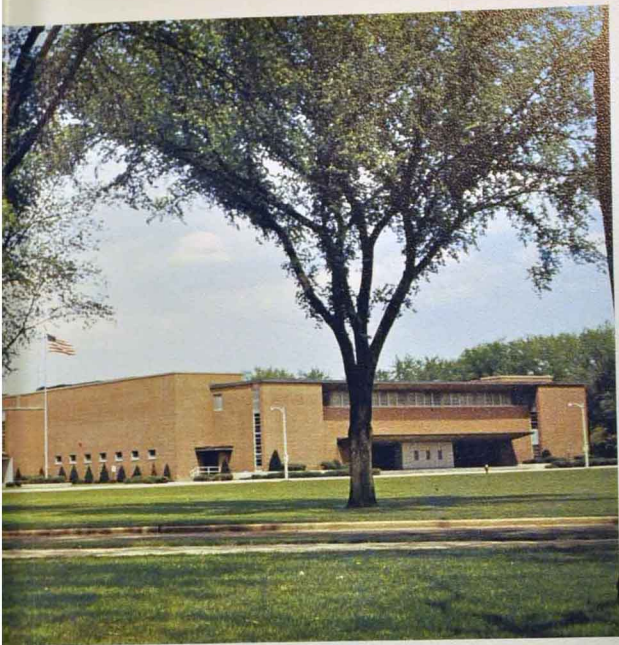


FACES

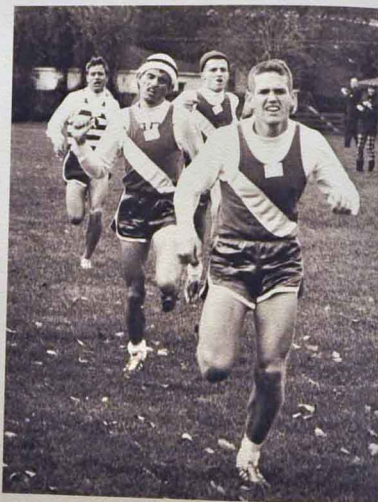

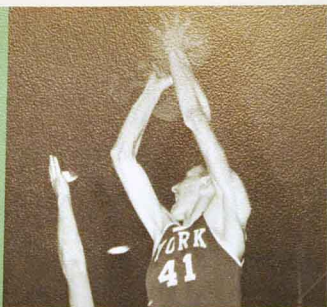

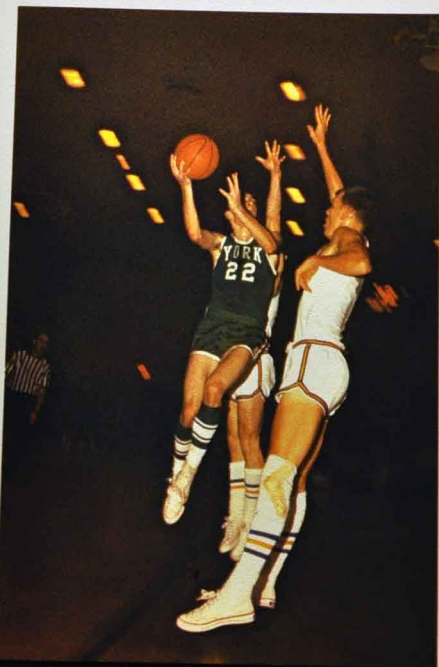

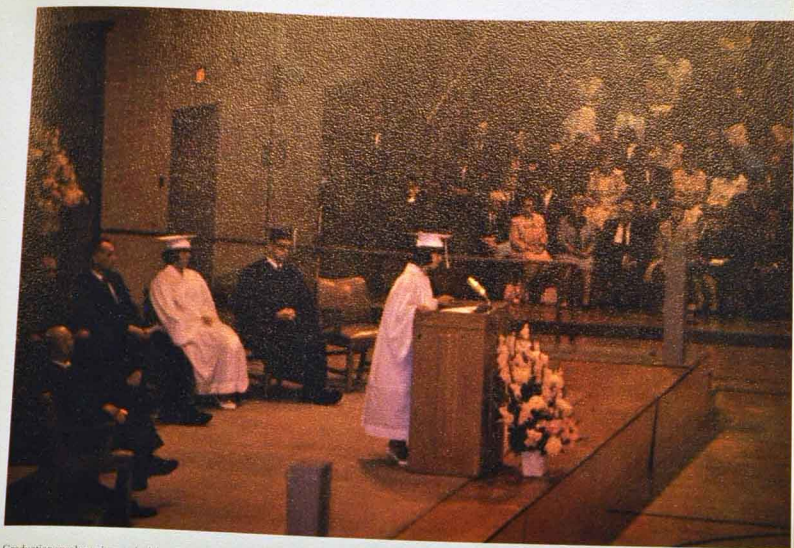

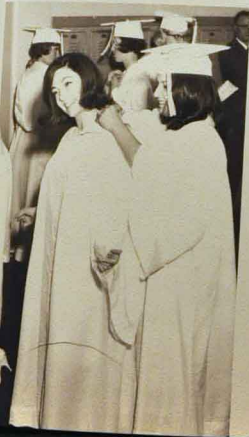

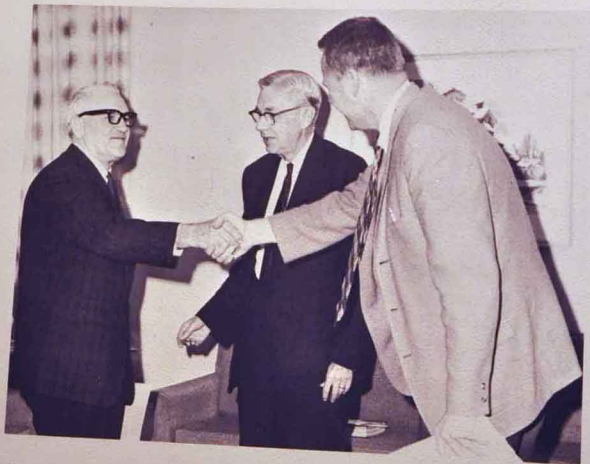

New at York this year, Russian was the fifth foreign language offered to students. The two classes of students who studied Russian were enthusiastic because of the uniqueness of the language—especially its written form. Taught much the same as the other languages—French, Spanish, Latin, and German, the phases of learning stressed were reading, writing, speaking, and oral comprehension. To obtain a solid foundation in the Russian language, the student must master the alphabet, correct pronunciation, and fundamental grammar.

Languages comprise an important phase in the academic lives of many Yorkites. The department, headed by Miss Margaret Ryan, and staffed by 14 instructors, strives to encourage mastering a second or third language. As a result, an increased ability to communicate, an understanding of different customs, and a comprehension of world situations are acquired. These pupils augment their knowledge through the use of such aids as tapes, films, slides, and individual lab works.

Russian New Challenge to Aspiring Linguists

Add New Semester Courses to English Program

Basic speech, debate, and drama and oral interpretation will be offered as new one semester courses by the English Department next year. These will provide students with a chance for more extensive study in these specific areas. Other offerings that comprise the English curriculum are English literature, business English, contemporary problems English, modern world literature, journalism, stagecraft, two-semester speech, and English 9,10,11, and 12. All these are designed to increase the student's skill in his usage of the English language, to create a sound and appreciative knowledge of literature, and to augment the student's ability to communicate with others.

This department, headed by Mr. Robert M. Leader, also offers an opportunity for further enrichment in literature with the Movie of the Month and Book of the Year projects.

This opportunity allows students to gain the knowledge necessary in the largely scientific world of today to move forward with progress. Well-stocked labs along with good leadership give the student the opportunity to improve his education in the scientific fields. General and physical science, biology, chemistry and physics are the branches in which courses are offered. Mr. Elmer Kunze is the head of this department.

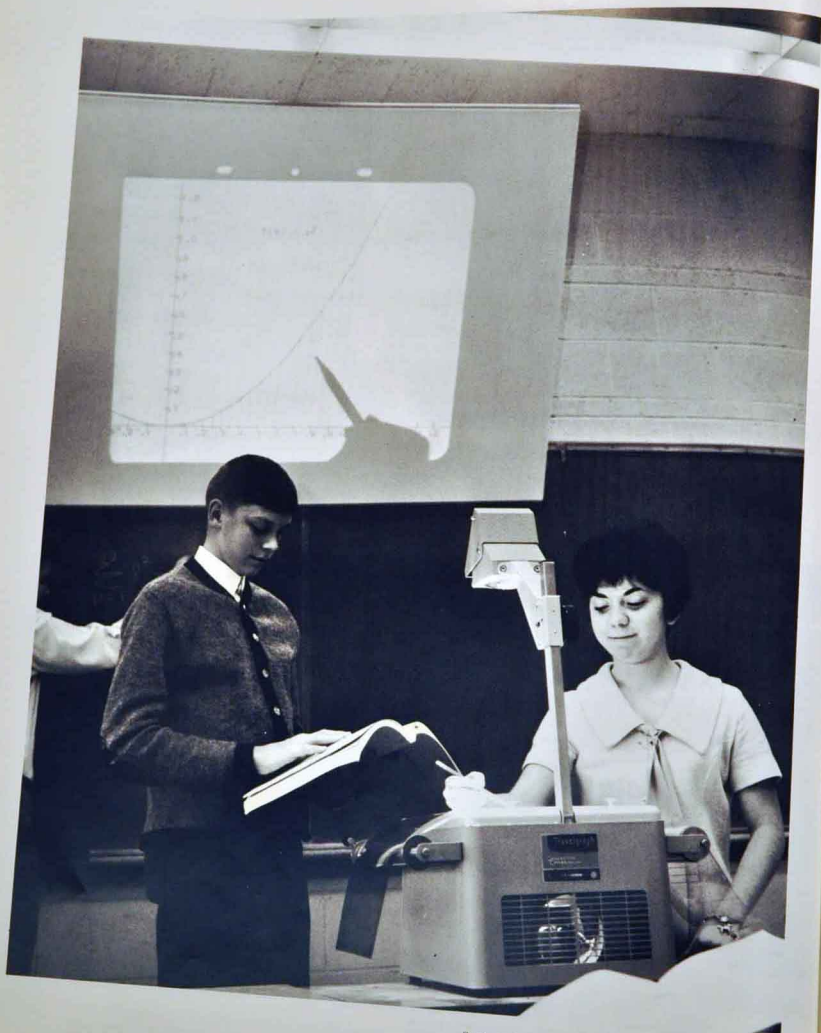

Transparencies Define Mathematical Problem

The use of experiments with transparencies and plates on overhead projectors, introduced in math 12 classes last year, has been greatly expanded for this year. During the past summer, Miss Janice Flake selected from geometry 10 U.I.C.S.M. textbook situations where visual materials would be of aid to students. She made plates and transparencies where needed, and through the cooperation of the Visual Aids Department, copies of these were made.

Another experiment planned by the Mathematics Department is a five year program for the advanced-placement students. This program, when in effect, would encompass material usually studied by sophomores in college. There is a proposed plan to experiment with a one semester computer-programming course for next year. Chairman of this department is Mr. Thomas Nelson.

Social Studies Emphasizes Progress of Man

American History 11—Seminar will be a new course offered by the Social Studies Department next year. This course will be taught by Mr. Robert Hyde, and it may be elected to fulfill the American history requirement in the junior year. The seminar is for those students who want a more comprehensive, cultivated, and challenging perception of our American heritage.

Besides this new offering, courses in civics, geography, world history, American history, social science, and psychology will be taught as usual. The two required courses, American history 11 and social science 12, plus all of the other course offerings in this department are designed to give the student a better understanding of the development and progress of man throughout the ages. Mr. Howard Van Norman is the chairman of the Social Studies Department.

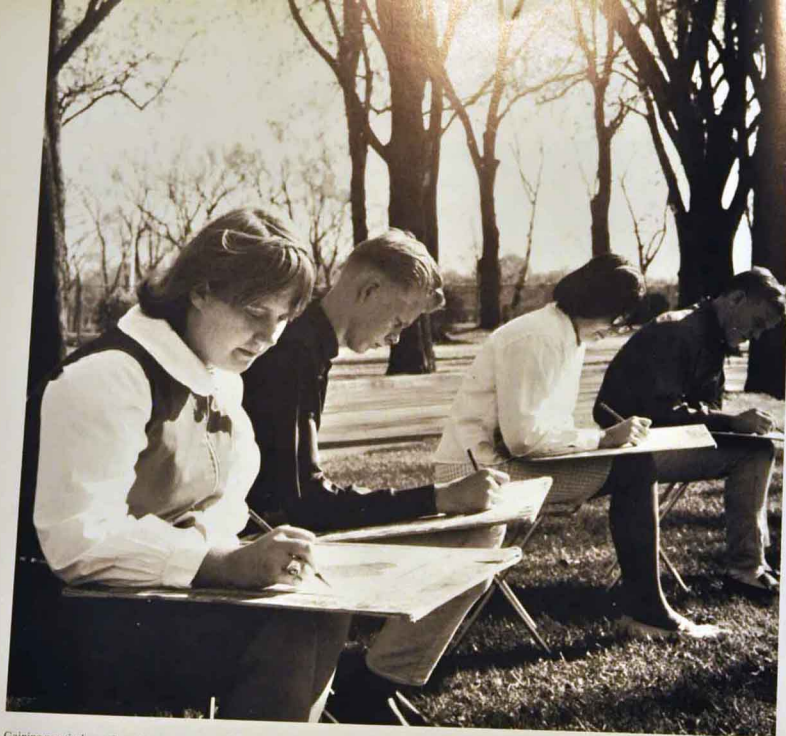
Teachers and librarians at York recognize and accept their separate but complementary roles in helping students discover and use the knowledge of books. Library units and research materials are available for presentation to supplement various facets of class study. Over 1,000 classes benefit from this service each year.

This busy department, headed by Miss Myrtle Ellis, operates the year round. It serves the students and faculty with reading material not only all through the regular school term but also throughout the summer session. In the summer weeks alone the library handles a circulation of about 4,350 books.

As the enrollment has increased, the library has added a copy machine, paper back collections in each reading room, and duplications of many expensive reference materials to fill the growing need for more facilities.

Art Stimulates Creativity, Encourages Talent

To expand students' knowledge while urging them to creatively express their thoughts is the goal of York's Art Department under the guidance of Mrs. Patricia Alstrin, department chairman. This is done by offering courses such as Art 9 and 10, sketching, printmaking, ceramics, survey of visual arts, painting, and commercial art. In addition to the regular classes there is an art staff offering services to drama, English, music, home economics, modern dance, *York-Hi*, and *Y's Tales*.

Clubs and organizations may obtain posters and other needs from the art staff through Mrs. Alstrin. The Art Department serves a two-fold purpose. It provides useful creations for the enjoyment and benefit of all, while giving students a chance to discover and develop their talents in the field of art.

Future Homemakers Gain Practical Knowledge

Participating in an annual Spring Fashion Show and Christmas Tea, students of the Home Economics Department demonstrated experience and knowledge gained through classroom and laboratory work in the areas of foods and clothing. The primary aim of a study in clothing is the construction of professional-looking garments through simplified methods, while a study in foods stresses nutrition, meal-planning, and techniques in food preparation.

Commercial Food Service is a new one-semester course offered in the Home Economics Department this year. It provides practical experience in the food service areas and acquaints students with the broad opportunities in this field.

Along with Commercial Food Service and full-year courses in foods and clothing, the department, headed by Mrs. Helen O'Neill, offered several one-semester courses primarily for juniors and seniors. These were family living, home management, cookery for the career girl, and wardrobe building.

York's Music Department offers a wide range of activities for the musically inclined student with any degree of experience. Prime objectives of the department are to increase the technical ability of the student and to encourage an appreciation for music. In freshman chorus, girls' glee club, junior choir, senior choir, cadet band, concert band, or concert orchestra, there is a place for any student interested in music. For students especially talented in this field, a class in harmony and theory is held five times weekly to further increase their knowledge of music and how it is created. Department chairman is Mr. L. R. Reimer.

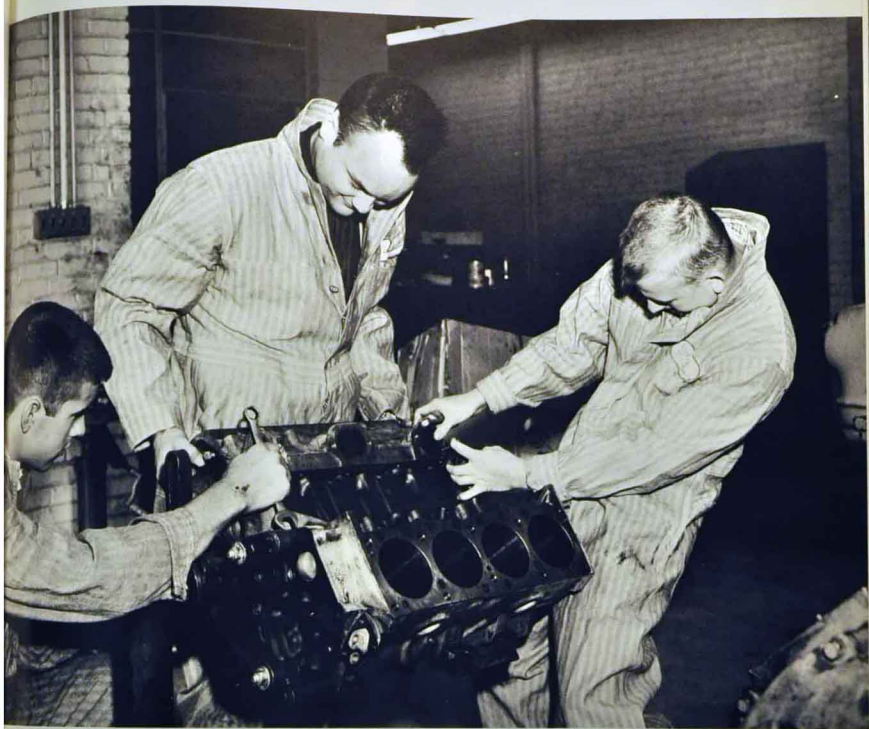

Industrial Arts Develop Vocational Skills

Seeking an opportunity to engage in manual skills, many students take advantage of the courses offered by the Industrial Arts Department in the fields of auto mechanics, electronics, mechanical drawing, metals, printing, and woodworking. Through instruction and experience, York students may form foundations for careers in architecture, auto repairing, carpentry, press work, radio and television repairing, and welding.

Available to juniors and seniors in this department is the diversified occupations program, in which a student may put his knowledge to practical use by working a half day at a possible future vocation. Mr. Paul Hartwig is department chairman.

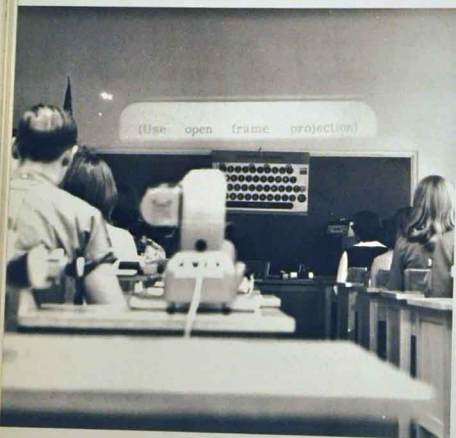

Business students seeking applicable skill in data processing, programming, and computer language will be interested in a course, Introduction to Data Processing and Computers, an addition to the business curriculum. Miss Marie Gustafson, department chairman, stated that business education has two main objectives, equipping students with useful skills and training them for the future in business jobs.

The courses through which these goals are realized are general business, applied business, arithmetic, economic geography, salesmanship, bookkeeping, business law, shorthand, advanced stenography, clerical practice, business machines, and notehand. Students become more proficient in their chosen fields through diligence and individual assistance so that they may fulfill job qualifications. Competent students may be recommended for jobs by the Business Department. An additional opportunity for vocational experience is offered by the distributive education program so that students may spend half a school day in training on the job in various community establishments.

Every student at York worked with one counselor this year, receiving information and advice. The counselor evaluated the student's progress, made sure that he was working to the best of his ability, and helped him select courses to meet future goals. He also verified the fact that the student's best interests were considered. The counselor brought about this relationship through either of two methods: counseling with the individual student or advising a group.

Directing the Guidance Department, Mr. Raymond Hylander heads the aptitude testing program and vocational planning. Driver Education Adopts Expanded Program

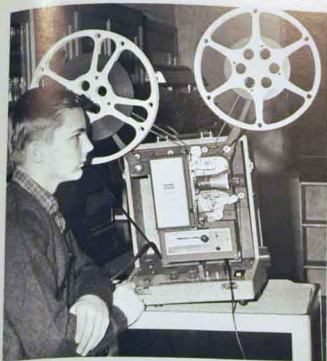
For the first time since the 1959-1960 school year, the Driver Education Department offered behind-the-wheel instruction during the school year. This gave training to students who otherwise might not have been able to participate in the program because of summer jobs or extended vacations. The program was not in operation, however, during the winter months—the third and fourth six weeks—because of frequent bad weather and unfavorable road conditions.

This year, with Mr. R. J. Wilson as its director, the department used two cars and six teachers to train the approximately 100 students involved in the program. During one grading period teachers aided the students in developing correct skills and safe driving habits. The driving instructors met with their students twice a week during either first or eighth period or after school.

Sophomores, juniors, and seniors who have completed the classroom driver training course may enroll for behind-the-wheel instruction. The classroom phase is given to all students as their sophomore health class. In addition to the school year program, driver education will continue in the summer as usual.

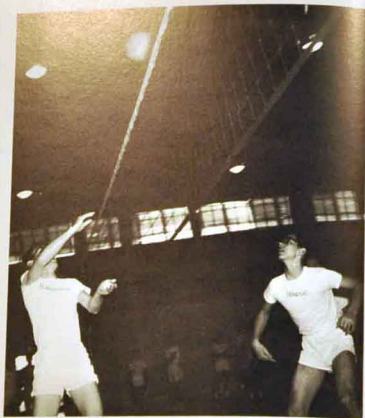

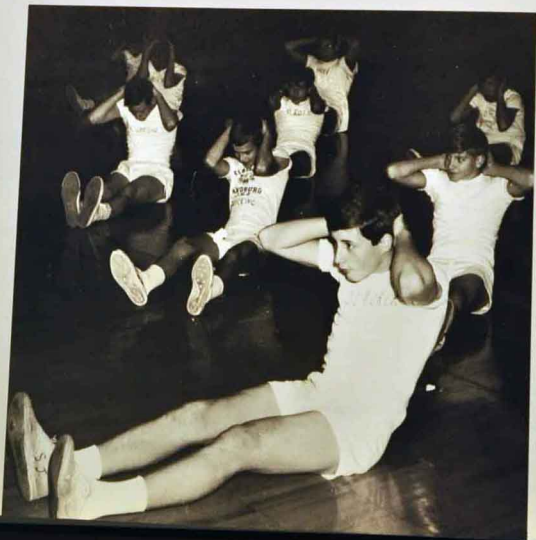

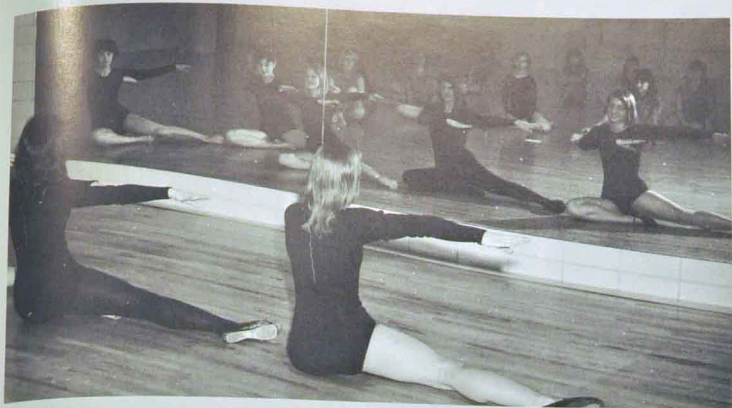


Junior boys participate in one of the many activities in the PE program, volleyball.

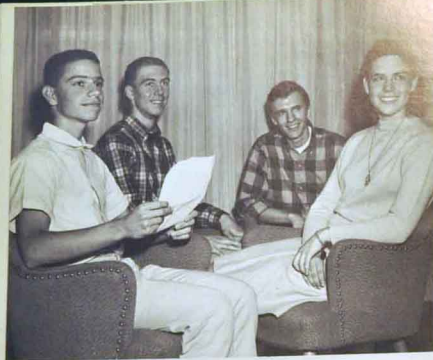

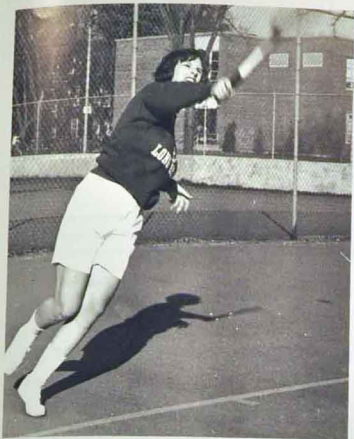

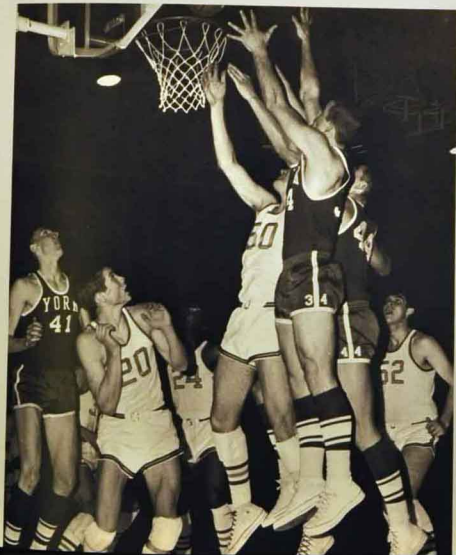

Paced by co-captains George McGregor, fourth in the state meet and York record holder at 4:23.5 in the mile, Ray Menzel, state semi-finalist in the 220 yard dash and WSC first place finisher, Mr. Newton's cindermen returned from dominating the first WSC indoor championship to win the outdoor title for the first time since 1956. The Dukes regained the Palatine Relays trophy after a four year drought, captured the Rockford title for the sixth straight season, and took a close second at the Naperville Relays.

Twenty-six varsity records were established during the season that saw Al Janulis crack the 440 mark with a 49.7 second sprint at the WSC meet and Ray Menzel break the 220 record with a blistering 21.7 second dash. Shot-putter Carl Liecker and the mile relay team also bolstered the green and white by taking firsts in the WSC outdoor meet.

York's sophs imitated the varsity's nine win and two loss dual meet record and followed the Dukes lead by taking both WSC titles. Ken Van De Venter paced the Barons by taking firsts in the broad jump and 440 at the WSC meet. Bob Booth captured second in the 100 and 220 in the WSC meet and led the thinclads to first at the Glenbard Soph Invitational and seconds at the Proviso West Invitational and West Suburban Meet.

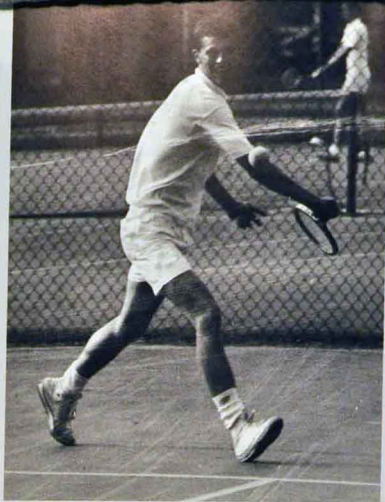

Andy Pachner, who qualified for the WSC quarter finals, boasted an 8 and 4 mark, and John Strain went 6 and 6 in singles play. 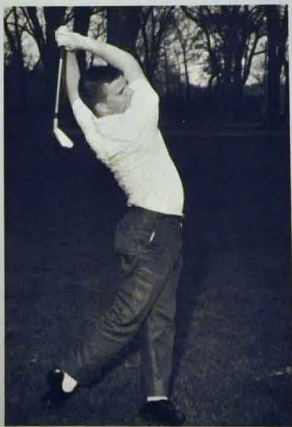
Linksters Cop 4th in State

Compiling a 9—5 WSC record, York's 1965 Varsity baseball team copped a 2nd place tie in conference play. Coach Erl Ellingson's Dukes streaked to a 9—2 mark in early season competition. After dropping a double-header to a tough Lyons squad, the Green and White rebounded to finish 12—7 overall.

Captain Guy Homoly pounded out 16 hits to lead the team in batting with a .340 average, while Most Improved John Sonnenberg batted .333. 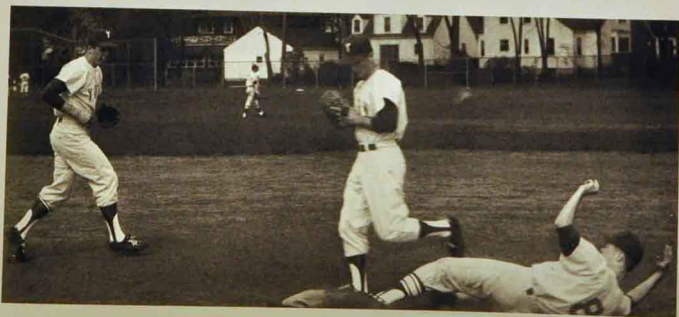


George Dean stretches for the final throw from third base against Downers Grove.

Dukes Tie for 5th; Barons Cop 2nd

The Dukes of York opened the 1965 season with signs of a spectacular year. Coach Alex Naidenovich's varsity gridders were victorious in four out of their first five games as they tied with Lyons and Hinsdale for the West Suburban Conference lead. After trouncing both Willowbrook, 39-14, and Maine East, 25-7, the Dukes' winning streak was broken by Downers Grove before they continued along the victory path and defeated Arlington, 13-6, and Riverside-Brookfield, 21-0. The Green-and-White then went into a tailspin, which found them succumbing to Lyons, Hinsdale, and Glenbard West. By losing their final three games, The Dukes finished with a 4-4 season mark and a 3-4 WSC record which put them in fifth place.

All-state tackle Lou Drinka and fullback Pete Mastro received All-WSC honors. Drinka, along with Russ Standlee, was a defensive standout throughout the season. Mastro led the team in rushing by gaining 830 yards for a 6.4 yards-per-carry average while Ted Mosier was the leading pass receiver with a 15.4 yards-per-catch average. Mastro and Mosier each ran for four touchdowns. Quarterback George Dean, however, was the team scoring leader this year with a total of 58 points on nine touchdowns and four extra-point plays. Co-captains for the Dukes were Drinka and Bill Poe. Drinka was also voted Most Valuable and Ted Hope was named Most Improved.

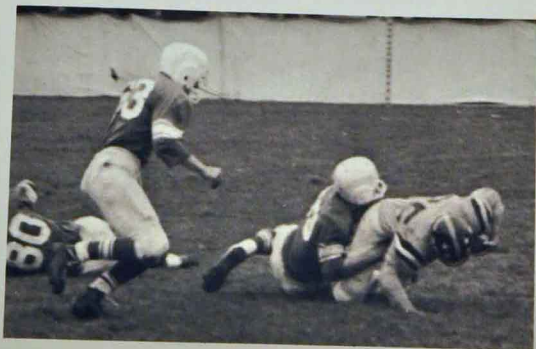

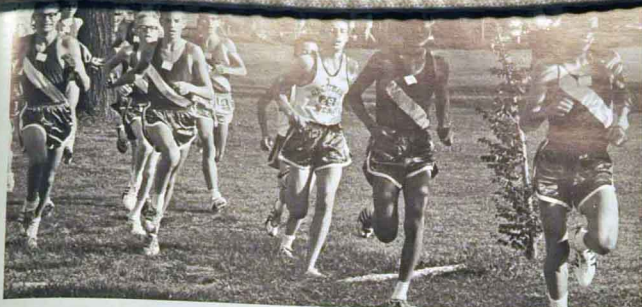

The York Dukes swept through the 1965-66 season by going undefeated in regular season competition and capturing the WSC title by five games over runner-up Arlington. Winning by comfortable margins every time, the highly touted Dukes cinched first place with four WSC contests left to play. The Green and White also romped to the DeKalb tourney title, defeating Freeport by seven in the title tilt.

The first real test for the York cagers came January 7th at LaGrange. The Dukes responded by stomping last year's conference champions by the score of 91-70. With a 73-61 conquest of Hinsdale on the Red Devils' Court, the Dukes presented Coach Campbell with his 100th win as varsity coach.

Center Larry Saunders led the Dukes' onslaught this year by finishing 2nd by one point in the WSC scoring race and copping all-WSC, all-area, and all-state honors. Saunders' 467 points, 423 rebounds, and .676 field goal percentage made him York's 2nd all-state cager in history. Captain Ned Reese was credited with 155 assists, breaking Jim Dawson's old mark of 131. Forward Scott Fiene was 2nd in scoring, also taking all-WSC honors along with Reese and Saunders. Guard Derrick Grove's outside shooting and sophomore Chris Schweer's second-half surge helped vault the Dukes to a 2nd place rating in the state cage polls.

Although the Dukes' unbeaten string was snapped at 24 in the regional championship contest, Mr. Campbell's words sum up every Yorkite's sentiments: "One game will not erase the greatness achieved through 24 games over 4 1/2 months of play."

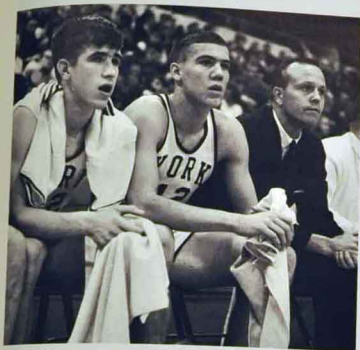

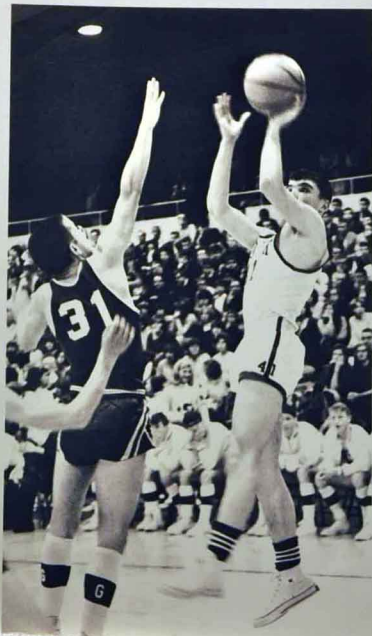

Led by all-around man Wayne Lessner, the 1965-66 Duke gymnasts captured third place in the WSC final standings. In the conference meet, Dean Hill and Ron Quimby paced the musclemen by taking firsts on the side horse and in tumbling. Lessner took third in all-around competition, while Jim Rodemaker and Tom Ryan took third and fourth on the trampoline. The Dukes copped 3rd place in the District Meet behind Proviso East and Willowbrook, first and second place finishers in the state. 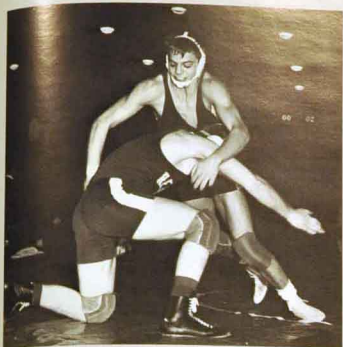


Senior Ken Fontana executes a German on the high bar.

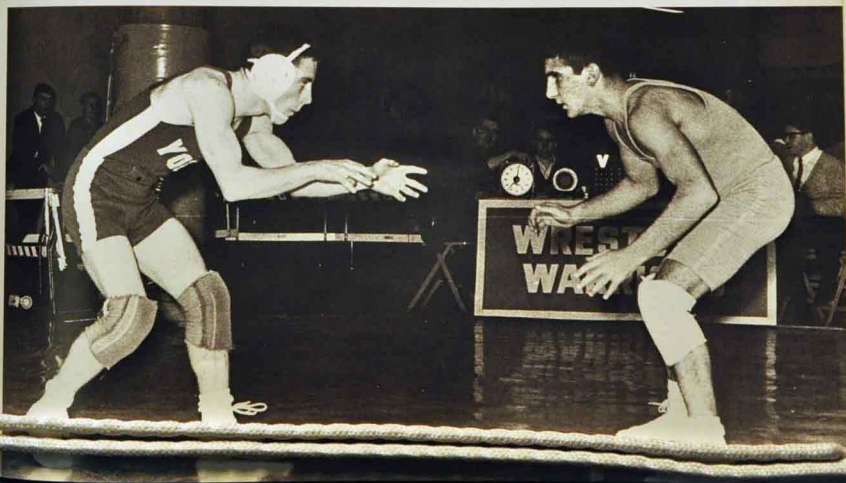
Bien Takes 3rd in State; Dukes 2nd in Sectional

Defending State Champion Bob Bien captured 3rd in the 120-pound class this year and Rich Bobus copped 5th in the 133-pound division in the State Tournament. Bien's only loss of the year to McQueen of North Chicago, the eventual State Champion, forced him to settle for 3rd. Four of Coach Lee Wachenheim's grapplers captured District berths, enabling them to advance to the Sectionals where they combined for a 2nd place finish for the Dukes. Co-captains Bien and Russ Rapier and junior Rich Bobus each fought their way to a 1st in the Sectionals and qualified for the State Finals.

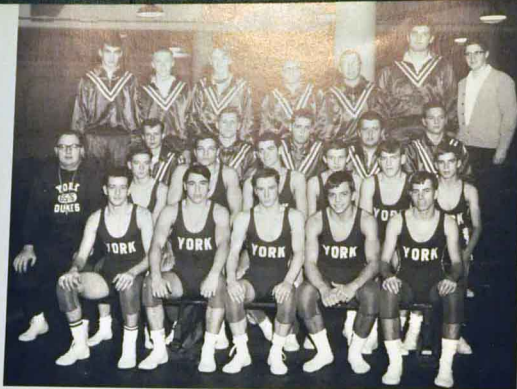

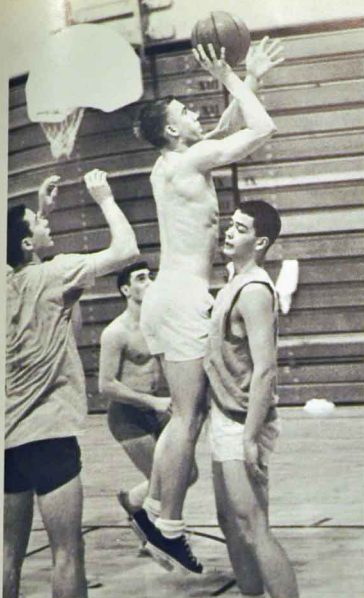
