





HAVING DEVELOPED SKILLS IN VARIOUS AREAS THROUGH LABORATORY TRAINING, home economics students designed the fashions for their annual spring style show and prepared the refreshments for the faculty at their Christmas tea. Students who desired just a semester of intensive area study enrolled in family living, home management, and commercial food service.

Development of a course of automotive study with cutaways of different systems provided a new attack on teaching of the ever-changing field of automotive mechanics. 


BUSINESS EDUCATION PROVIDES A WIDE RANGE OF COURSES for students preparing for business careers or merely seeking basic skills such as shorthand and typing. One semester and two semester classes provide the student with the opportunity to delve into an area to any extent which he desires. A comprehensive view of business may be obtained by taking business exploration, while the more specialized skills are acquired through various selective courses such as bookkeeping, clerical practice, salesmanship, psychology, and data processing.

The Mathematics Department initiated a five year program designed to give advanced mathematics students a better college background. Calculus and other college sophomore mathematics material was the basis for this course. The now extensive use of transparencies in the entire math program has saved valuable class time in the last year. Transparencies also give the mathematics student opportunities for outside study.







FRESHMAN LIBRARY ORIENTATION AND DRIVER'S EDUCATION enabled students to acquire the rudimentary knowledge and attitudes from which they developed skill and confidence in these two areas, which soon occupy a good part of their time. 



WE HAVE FINALLY REACHED THE LEVEL, WHERE WE CAN BEGIN TO DEVELOP along lines almost entirely free of the group's influence. Realizing the necessity of this level of development in high school students, the Science Department, in 1963, implemented an advanced studies program. This year's senior class is the first there completed biology, chemistry, and physics in their first three years and continued with advanced placement biology and/or chemistry in their senior year. The department chairman felt that this program has greatly strengthened the Science Department.

Similarly an air of freedom, self-reliance, and creativity has reigned in the Art Department. Artistic endeavors begun in art 9 and 10 were followed by specialized courses, such as commercial art, ceramics, print making, and painting, in the junior and senior years.




The Guidance Department initiated a new system of alphabetical student grouping.


FOR THOSE WHO CHOOSE TO GRASP A RESPONSIBILE ROLE IN STUDENT GOVERNMENT

Two foreign students, Annie Domine from France and Alvaro Johanning from Costa Rica, came to York this year through the sponsorship of the American Field Services Committee. The committee sent one student, Doug Russell, abroad to Helsinki, Finland, last summer. Funds were raised for this by the AFS candy sale last February, the mixer after a basketball game, the mistletoe sale last December, and also through civic donations. tural Attache of Chicago, delivered a talk to York's French Club. Impressed with both the club and the school, he suggested to his government that they present the club with some money to be used in furthering its activities. 

Strauch Directs Dukes' Explosive Offense

Defeating four out of their first five opponents enabled York's Varsity Football Team to tie for 4th in the WSC. with a 3-3-1 record, and to finish with a 4-3-1 overall mark. Coach Alex Naidenovich fielded a light squad as no player weighed over 200 pounds. The Dukes' passing and running game, however, made up for lack of size as the Green-and-White started fast. In a non-conference battle, York squeaked past District 88 rival Willowbrook, 14-13. Quarterback Bill Strauch connected on a 77 yard pass play, and Bob Booth ran 60 yards to account for York's touchdowns. Against Glenbard West, York scored on 87 and 82 yard pass plays but lost. Coach Naidenovich's varsity gridders then clobbered Maine East, 45-18, Downers Grove, 12-7, and Proviso West, 26-0, as long runs and passes again characterized the Dukes' offense. York faced three tough opponents during the final weeks of the season and fought Riverside to a scoreless tie while losing to Lyons

and Hinsdale.

Senior quarterback Bill Strauch broke most of York's passing records as he led the Dukes' offense to an eight game total of 140 points. Strauch completed 56 of 150 attempts-good for 1144 yards, a 20.4 yards-per-completion average, and ten touchdowns. These were all records End Mike Dann also established a few school records as he caught 17 aerials for 374 yards. Halfback Booth, leading rusher, carried the ball 114 times, gaining 562 yards for a 4.7 average. Booth scored 43 points while Dann accounted for 23. Jack Derning, Randy Meyer, and Dave Anderman bulwarked the defense. Derning led in tackles and also recovered four fumbles and intercepted four passes. The team elected Strauch and Derning co-captains, chose Derning as MVP, and voted Wally Rudnick Most Improved. Strauch. Dann, and Derning were selected to the All-WSC and All-DuPage teams.



Amassing twenty-five victories and their second consecutive WSC Championship, the Dukes of York came through with another successful season. After losing their second and third games, the Green Machine produced seventeen straight victories before being upset. The varsity's 13—1 WSC slate earned the 1st place trophy. With a high-scoring attack, York captured the DeKalb Tournament Title. Chris Schweer scored 46 points in one game to set a tournament record.

With Schweer and Derrik Grove leading the way, the Green-and-White offense averaged 77.1 points per game. Against Proviso West, Grove poured in 46 points on 23 field goals, a York and WSC record, as the Dukes set a scoring high of 101 points. Grove also set a season mark with 163 assists. Schweer established new season scoring records with 697 points and a 24 point average. His 978 career points and 55 rebounds were also new marks. John Doolittle helped out on the boards with 355 rebounds. Captain Bill Strauch canned 88 of 114 free throws for a record .772 percentage.

Schweer became Coach Richard Campbell's third player to receive all-state honors. Schweer and Grove were voted to the All-WSC and All-Chicago Area squads. Schweer, Grove and Strauch were selected as MVP's for the Dukes while Schweer was elected captain for next year's team.


Advancing to the "Sweet Sixteen," York's Dukes met Chicago Public League Champion Harlan in a showdown battle for the trip downstate. The Green-and-White found the going rough and never led Harlan for thirty-one minutes and fifty-eight seconds of the game. 




