





Thoughtfulness and introspection fall before the onslaught of mind-blowing action.


Constant happenings engage all Yorkites in the chase for status and personal fulfillment. School-sponsored projects are an accepted outlet for most student ambitions.




















# P.E. Classes Offer Diversified Activities





# Dukes Top WSC, County; Take 3rd in State Meet

York's Varsity Cross Country team followed a perfect 11-0 dual meet season with a 3rd place finish in the State Meet. Jim Hackbarth and Most Valuable Runner Pete Reiff led the attack by capturing 13th and 15th respectively. Ed Wagner took 22nd, Gary Goss placed 36th, and Walt Koenig came in 38th to round out the scoring.

Hackbarth paved the way in the initial state effort with 10th place in the District Meet at Ridgewood. The Dukes amassed 89 points, good for 2nd place to qualify them for








Perry Thompson performs scissors trick while warming up for the District meet.




