#### College Seminars Guide Educational Planning

Juniors and seniors file into the Yorker Room and take their places. They have arrived to listen to a speaker who will discuts a very important step in their lives. Is he a professor or an economist? No, he is a college representative ready to give information about his institution and to answer questions.

Such were the scenes of this year's college seminars sponsored by the Guidance Department. Representatives from many Midwest colleges arrived at York to speak at these sessions. Along with the seminars, the department issued regular junior-senior bulletins concerning College Board Exams. This year the juniors took the Kuder Occupational Interest Survey to help themselves and their counselors see where students' interests were centered. In the post-high-school planning room students used a new DuKane slide projector and record player for an audio-visual presentation of colleges.

For students not going on to college there was the department's show case with job openings, descriptions, and names of employers to contact. By offering such opportunities the Guidance Department tried to help upper classmen plan for the future.

Underclassmen sought advice from counselors on questions concerning orientation and schedules. Counselor request from retainers, placed around the building, gave all students the chance to secure an immediate appointment.







Recognizing students' varying interests, the English Department offered several new programs designed to study aspects of English from different points of view. Humanities, created to focus on the vocabulary, processes, and understanding of specific art forms, encouraged individual expression. Among student projects were photography exhibits and musical slide shows. Throughout the year daily journals of emotionally or intellectually moving experiences were kept.

Creative writing offered aspiring authors the opportunity to study techniques and styles in order to perfect their attempts as an art form. The course provided an outlet for the student to submit his works – including poetry, short stories, and essays – for criticism and help.

English literature and social science formed a new flexible scheduling group with team teaching. The group consisted of two classes which either met together for films and discussions or separated for class or individual study.

College-bound students who wished to improve their reading found an independent reading program available during study periods. Machines designed especially to help improve such areas as speed, comprehension, and vocabulary also helped prepare students for aptitude tests.




Important additions to the second floor library this year were a new copy machine which enabled students to make reproductions of pages from books or articles and a microfilm reader-printer. Both were aids for independent study and research.

A new plan of scheduling was used in all four library rooms to increase learning facilities: the first three days of the week were assigned for class use and the last two days were open for individual study. Some English and social studies classes held seminars in the library. All freshmen had three periods of orientation in order to learn to use the library facilities effectively.











Mastery of a foreign language is no simple task. At York the process was divided into four main endeavors—comprehae ding, speaking, reading, and writing. Would-be linguists encountered everything from grammar to language structure to idiomatic vocabulary. To promote confidence in oral expression and to introduce students to native dialects, each class spentone half period per week in the language lab. In addition to aural and conversational proficiency, the Foreign Language Department attempted to provide a panoramic view of the history and culture of foreign nations. Films, tape recordings, reading materials, and speakers proved to be invaluable in accomplishing the goals of the department.

In the spring students who demonstrated outstanding ability were selected to participate in extra-academic contests. French, German, and Spanish students entered the American Association of Teachers of Foreign Language Contest while Latin students competed in the State Latin Contest.

#### Seminars Encourage Independent Study

A new addition to the Social Studies Department was a senior social seminar. As a team, Mr. Henry C. Hitt and Mrs. Carolyn A. Landwehr taught the course — a combination of Senior Social Science and English Literature. Fifty-nine students were divided into two classes with half attending English Literature. The pupils were on a flexible schedule, occasionally meeting together in Yorkshire Hall for films or lectures with the remaining time spent in independent study. Guest speakers afforded opportunities to learn about varied experiences first hand. An important factor in this course was that the pupils had time for and were held responsible for independent study.

Student responsibility is characteristic of the Social Studies Department, since all courses except American History and Social Science are elective. Freshmen may enroll in community or world-oriented studies, sophomores may take World History or Economic Geography, and juniors and seniors may survey non-Western civilizations or cultural geography. Also open to chosen applicants are honors courses in American History and Seriori Social Science.








### Scientific Study Probes Nature's Wonders


Styles of teaching the various scientific disciplines have been carefully considered in York's Science Department. In each of the four major subjects taught—physical science, biology, chemistry, and physics—new course levels and equipment were under constant analysis. The most recent addition was the sophomore Physical Science II course that provided a firm foundation, primarily, for students who did not plan to take physics or chemistry. Ambitious scholars were allowed to start biology in their freshman year, progressing toward the three year old Advanced Placement studies in either chemistry or biology. Sustained diligence by an upperclassman in Science Department academic work was rewarded with the Bausch and Lomb Science Award, and creative students entered an all-Chicago science fair.

Exemplifying the continual refinement of equipment for demonstration and student participation purposes was a linear air track to be used for frictionless motion studies in physics. Less sophisticated devices, such as small stoves and glassware, were no less important in creating a better science curriculum.










With the introduction of several new courses, the Math Department had a greatly increased enrollment. Courses in Probability and Statistics and Computer Programming were created to keep pace with a mathematics-oriented society. A special room was provided for the department's computer teletypes, enabling students to use the machines any time. For seniors who were not math majors, but who wanted to prepare for college, the new College Prep Math course was offered. Upon the suggestion of the North Central Evaluating Committee, the Math Department provided an elementary Geometric etc, the Math Department provided an elementary Geometric etc, the Math Department provided an elementary Geometric course, while continuing a special two year Algebra program started in 1968. York also sponsored an accelerated four year course for exceptional students, which included a college credit calculus course in the senior year.

The Math Department, under the chairmanship of Mr. Thomas Nelson, hosts a chapter of the Mu Alpha Theta Math Honorary Society. The annual math contest, in which top math students in each class compete for recognition by the student body, is perhaps the highpoint of the year. A pin and certificate are given to the individual champion, while a team score — used for comparison with other schools — is compiled from the top three individual scores and sent to the Mathematical Association of America.

# Emphasis on Exercise Marks Departmental Trend



The revamping of the weight training facilities was the major change in this year's boys' Physical Education Department. In previous years a lack of space prevented more than a few boys at a time from lifting weights, but with the help of a group of athletes, the coaches converted the Civil Defense storage room into a new area for weight training. This expansion gave more boys a chance to "sweat a bucket" the goal for this year's physical education program. Director Earl Ellingson, concerned with improving the physical fitness of today's youth, believes that work and strenuous activity build both character and physique.

In conjunction with Mr. Ellingson's exercise program for boys, the girls were offered a new course in Form and Figure. Director Mary Lou Snyder attempted to increase the girls' knowledge of outside activities by having a series of talks presented by various coaches. The main topics of the talks were the fundamentals, rules, and techniques of football. In order to find a more ideal physical education course a poll was taken to evaluate the present gym classes.





### New Machines Improve Pupil Business Skills

Electric typewriters were a new addition that the Business Education Department made to the steno laboratory. This modern equipment and a full electronic laboratory made the department's facilities equivalent to that which is found in a business office.

The data processing students were furnished with the IBM 2-card punch machine and a collator which merges two omore unit record card files into one. These two data processing machines helped to speed up student work, allowing them time to work on the card punch, sorter, and accounting machine.

The department offered practice rooms for students of business to use during their study hall. These rooms consisted of typewriters and adding machines, and were monitored by student volunteers.

"Music hath charms to soothe the savage beast" and the Music Department did its best to keep all participants caim by offering enough opportunities to satisfy the desires and ambitions of any vocalist or instrumentalist. Musical entertainment and competition filled their agenda. Special homerooms and practice periods during and after school homerooms and practice periods during and after school allowed a maximum amount of time to prepare Christmas, winter and spring concerts and to practice for the State Music winter and spring concerts and to practice for the State Music Contest. Challenging for chairs and auditions to qualify for all but freshman groups assured a healthy competition among the musicians.

To further develop sight reading skills and an "ear," a two semester course, Basic Harmony and Theory, was offered to students interested in developing skills necessary for writing melodies. For those individuals interested in expanding their involvement, there were madrigal and folk groups formed within the choirs, marching and stage bands and string groups within the orchestra. Most of these were student inspired and student directed efforts for school and community service as volunteer entertainment.







### Student Artists Plan Displays, Showcases

Student art exhibits and showcases were on display during music and drama presentations, marking the Art Department's new approach to involvement in school affairs. Poster contests on community and national levels and an art display in June judged by the Elimburst Woman's Club were among extracurricular activities.

To meet the demands of an increasing student enrollment, the department expanded its facilities with the addition of another classroom and a new art instructor. Courses offered this year covered fields of commercial art, painting, printmaking, jewelry, ceramics, sketching, and visual survey. Interested and talented students had the opportunity to join a staff, under the direction of Art Department Chairman, Mrs. Ann Schroeder, which provided art work for school publications. Staff members received honors including Allerton Art Scholarships and Scholastic Art Awards.







Becoming a home economist does not, as popularly rumored, entail permanent relegation to the stove or sewing machine. This year's home economics students banished those misconceptions. Trips to a training center for McDonald's employees, to the kitchens of United Airlines, Henrici's Restaurant, and to the massive Chicagoland Jewel Distribution Centers were a few of many opportunities afforded to cut the apron strings of the young homemakers. Supplementing study within the classroom were professional speakers and demonstrators, including representatives from the McCall Pattern Company, the Unique Zipper Company, and the Northern Illinois Gas Company.




### Practical Experience Builds Vocational Skills



The buzz of a saw and the pound of a hammer were familiar sounds that came from the Industrial Arts Department when boys from surrounding junior high schools came to observe work in the shops. Teachers pointed out how the junior high craft skills could be correlated to the more advanced ones at York in metal, wood, and mechanical drawing. Visiting these classes they observed that melted metals take the form of the designer's choice when poured into a wooden foundry mold; carpentry includes knowledge ranging from joint structure to the application of commercial finishes; a complete set of blueprints is only the beginning in mechanical drawing, for from this, a model of original design is constructed.

Auto shop acquired the Clayton-Chassis dynamoneter, a machine which not only locates the problems in a car but also analyzes them. Electronics was no exception to York's high standards, for boys were able to experiment on a new Zenith color television set.



District 88 is expanding its special education program to provide facilities by September, 1969, for all special education students. This year, two groups were at York-Educable Mentally Handicapped and Multiply Handicapped Deaf. Specialists in special education were consistent in advocating for the EMH student a curriculum close to everyday living needs. 





This year's Student Council sought to provide such a force, directing it toward the betterment of student character and education. First, it provided an outlet for complaints and suggestions. Working quietly behind the scenes, this organization solved some problems before they developed into major concerns. For other problems, special homeroom research committees, composed of members of the student body at large and headed by a council member, were created. These research groups concerned themselves with the study of such topics as a new dress code, the narcotics problem, an intramural soccer program, and the District 88 tax referendum.

Student Council also provided a link between the York student body and the outside world. Council, guided by Mrs. Joanne Fischer, made many decisions which determined the type of image York would have in the eyes of outsiders. For example, Student Council sponsored two foster children—Mary Blaine Murietta in New Mexico and Cheung Chi in Hong Kong—in addition to contributing to charities and sponsoring service projects such as the Appalachia and Viet Nam clothing drives.


## AFS: Jet Set with Purpose-Friendship

1968 was a landmark year for York's American Field Service Committee. For the first time in the committee, bistory, three foreign students came to York to live and study. Roma Griffiths of Australia, Beth Venzon of the Philippines, and Steve Thomi of Switzerland. A two-way system of learning and sharing was readily established as many Yorkiteexpanded their knowledge of different peoples while the AFSers adjusted to the United States scene.

Also unique to 1968 was the participation of a Yorkstudent in the Americans Abroad winter program. Peter Pompei, a senior, spent the entire year living with a host family in Ville d'Avray, France. Even the annual candy sale was revolutionized when, for the first time, two types of candy – pollydoodles and chocolate-covered almonds – were offered simultaneously. Tales of the Land Down Under, Filipino dancing, and slides of Switzerland – all presented by York's three AFSers – provided novel entertainment for committee members at a Christmas party.

Tradition was not completely abolished, however. In the early fall a special selection committee met to choose York's representatives to the Americans Abroad program. Junions Little Marbach and Charlotte Cowles, applicants for the summer and winter programs, respectively, were selected after a series of interviews. Another tradition, renewed during the Christmas season, was the annual sale of mistletoe.

#### Ideas, Words, Style Needed for Each Page

"On with those heads!" This frequently-heard cry was not that of a confused Queen of Hearts, but a command from yearbook sponsor Mrs. Lucile Albert or the co-editors-in-chief. Writing headlines was just one part of the work involved in preparing a page for the yearbook.

Although the individual procedure varied with each type of page, the basic steps were the same. First, a rough plan for the page was concocted by the editors, and appropriate pictures were scheduled and selected. The layout staff then determined the precise dimensions and positions of the pages' components. At the same time, copy writers gathered information, compiling it into copy blocks, captions, and headlines. After several rewrites, layout and typed copy were assembled and sent to the printers in North Carolina, where a mock page was made up. This sample was proofread by the staff for possible mistakes and returned to Delmar Printing Company to go to press. Thus, one two-hundred-and-fortieth of the yearbook was completed.

This process, multiplied many times over, presented quite a task for the sophomores, juniors, and seniors, who worked during homeroom and seventh period to keep pace with deadlines.







Coach Don Trolliet's Most Valuable Player and Co-Captain was John Dearborn who led the team with eight touchdowns and a total of 598 yards rushing. Bill Uecker was voted team Captain with three touchdowns and 360 total yards while Rich Diugas was selected Most Improved.

### Dukes Set National Mark; Earn State Title

"Nobody stops the Dukes" became a reality as the Harriers finished with a perfect season, gaining their 7th straight conference title and bringing the State Cross Country Championship home to York for the third time in the last seven years. Co-captain and Most Valuable Peter Reiff paced the way, winning the Peoria Invitational and taking 3rd in the State Meet — the highest a York runner has ever finished. Dean Foote, co-captain, placed 3rd at Peoria and 8th in the state. York's low score of 121 points downstate was rounded off bed Wagner, finishing 13th; Mark Schmelzel, 63rd; and Chuck Weigel, 67th.

Mid-season victory at Peoria was especially significant since this was the Harriers' first year of competition in this meet. The Dukes also won a national postal meet with a record time of 47:53 in the 5-man, 2-mile team race, thus becoming third first high school team in history to officially break 48:00 in the event. The Barons, bolstered by Most Valuable Mark Schmelzel, won five straight dual meets and the DuPage County Crown before submitting to a close 27-28 dual meet loss to Maine East. In addition to Schmelzel, the sophomores' strength was enhanced by steadily improving John Beyer, who finished 5th in the Conference Meet. The team completed the season with an 8-1 dual meet record and a 2nd place Conference Meet finish.









Youth may view those on the other side of the desk and on the other side of thirty with a wary eye as anti-Establishment-arianism takes hold. Firmly believing, as F. Scott Fitzgerald did of the rich, that "They're different from you and me," students confirm each others' prejudices. However, the moods of students are transitory. The growing pains pass. And, after differences diminish or disappear completely, each discovers that teachers are human, too.
