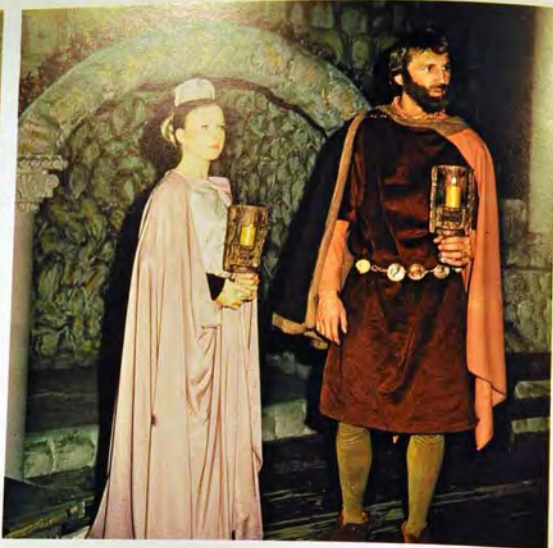

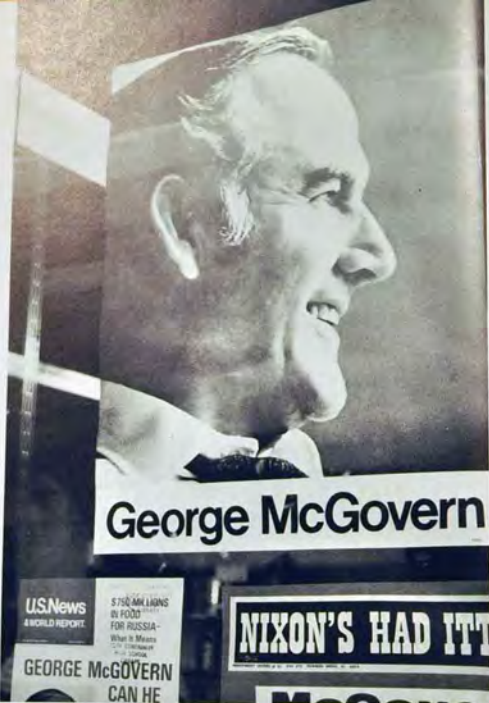

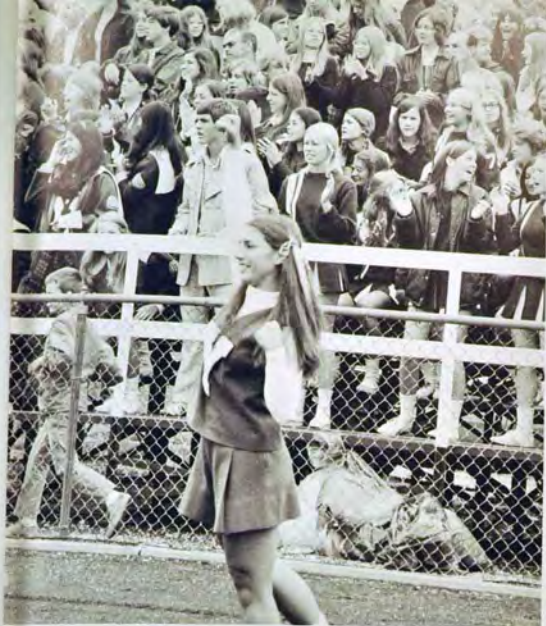

English

Extensive revisions instituted in the English Department involved updating Basics courses and altering curriculum for Track I of English 9, 10, and 11. Also the English Resource Center was relocated in the Yorker room, a larger and more funtional area. College Reading Skills classes were successful in the improvement of reading rates and comprehension and in the preparation for college exams.

Foreign Language

With a renewal of interest in Eastern European culture, a Russian class was offered. In addition to learning Russian grammar, students studied the civilization and daily life of the Soviet people.

In fourth-year French classes, an in-depth study of culture and cuisine was part of the curriculum. Students prepared a French dinner, and sampled French wines.

The cultures and literature of Spain, Mexico, and Latin America were emphasized in third and fourth year Spanish studies. Written and oral expression were also stressed.

Movies, occasional guest speakers, and tapes encouraged German students to appreciate and better understand the customs and lifestyle of Germany.

The basic understanding of Greek mythology, and the development of grammar and language skills comprised the Greek unit studied by third and fourth-year Latin students.



Third and fourth-year Latin students acquired the basic knowledge of classical Greek to further their understanding of the language they study.

The main goal of the Russian course is to teach the basic fundamentals: speaking, reading, and writing the language.

Progress checks, learning outlines, and tests were all part of the individualized program new to the Math Department. The program encouraged students to work at their own rate.

Science

Solid-state calculators were installed in the IPS and physics classes to simplify the mathematics behind the courses. In addition to improving accuracy, the calculators provide more time for experimentation.

Social Studies

Improvements and relocation of the Social Studies Lab allowed room for a screened sight barrier for group discussion and a work area. Cassette tapes and filmstrips were available for individualized use. The social studies department examined its curriculum and sought to pinpoint the scope and sequence of each course. Four new courses were proposed for next year in an effort to draw new students into the field.

Home Economics

Expanding their curriculum far beyond the conventional sewing and cooking classes, the Home Economics department suggests a variety of courses for men as well as women.

Designed for student observation and participation, a pre-school for children 3-4 years old is instituted each semester for Child Development classes. The objective of this course is to study the social, emotional, physical, and intellectual development of a child through the early school years.

Psychology for Living helps the individual relate more intelligently to himself and others. Exterior and interior design and houseplanning and the study of architecture styles is emphasized in Housing and Home Furnishings. The course selection offers a spectrum of choices within the field of Home Economics.

Metals 9 is a six-week course designed to introduce students to various pieces of equipment such as the spot welder.

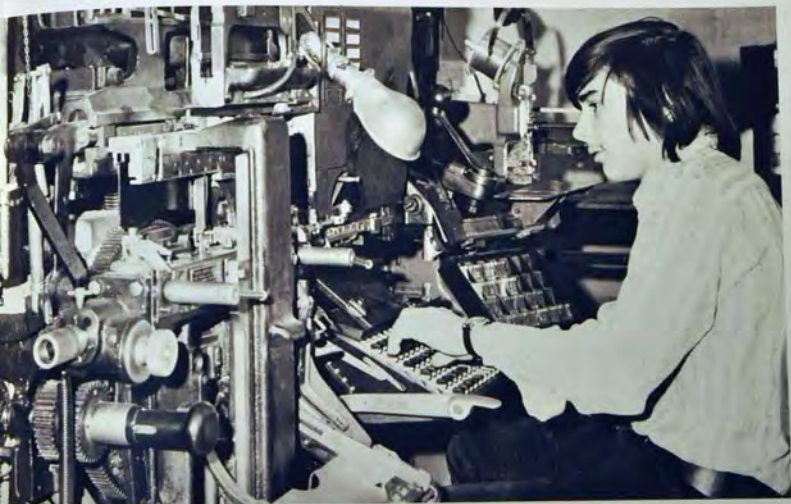
Learning to repair a television by using a basic circuit, students acquire valuable experience for a possible future in electronics.

Industrial Arts

The purpose of the Industrial Technology department is to develop knowledge and proficiency on machinery needed for both professional and vocational applications. To facilitate the fulfillment of this goal, the department acquired additional machinery, such as a 17-22 offset press, as well as the equipment necessary to meet the new safety standards in auto shop. An addition to the curriculum is a full three years of Graphic Arts course offerings.

Business Education

Business math, accounting, shorthand, and business law courses are offered to suit all students, those with business careers in mind as well as college-bound students. Subject matter varies from data processing, which is taught on the college level, to salesmanship. Training in office skills enables the students to take an alternate job in the event that the position they want is unavailable.

Art

Enrollment in various art courses increased to such an extent that it became necessary to expand the physical facilities of the art department. A professional sculptor, Mr. Jones, contributed much to the sculpture program. Also, the addition of two pottery wheels resulted in increased activity in that area. Students' work is displayed during the Spring Show, and profits from the Christmas Art Sale and donations are contributed to the Glenn Messersmith Scholarship Fund. This enables a talented student to pursue a career in art.

Library

Providing a wide variety of services to students and faculty, the library is more than a literary center. Such facilities as study carrels, records and players, an art print collection and conference rooms are available.

The library was the scene for "Christmas Around the World", a holiday event which featured customs from several countries. Other activities included an open-house for the faculty and staff and an awards party for student assistants.

Guidance

To increase student attendance and decrease the number of truancies, the Guidance Department instituted a stricter system. In order to be able to return to class, a student is now required to have an admit from his counselor. Information on scholarships, grants-in-aid, and student loans was offered in a new CVIS program. Students were better prepared for registration through counselor visits to English classes. Group registration made the process less confusing and more efficient.

Students were issued either white unexcused admits or blue excused admits in accordance with the new attendance system.

Counselors offered assistance in interpreting college entrance exam scores.



Physical Education

Personal defense and karate courses were offered to boys at the YMCA, while co-ed volleyball and archery classes were introduced to renovate the physical education departments. In the girls' department, golf classes made trips to the Salt Creek Golf Club. The ski conditioning trip to Alpine Valley was cancelled due to warm weather.

Special Education

Cooperation is the theory of the Special Education program, the objective being to develop each individual's maximum potential.

In applying such methods of study as a work program, a tutorial program and individualized study, the department works to help those with specific handicaps overcome or compensate for these weaknesses.

As a part of their physical education curriculum, the students make frequent trips to bowling alleys and the YMCA.



The curriculum for the Educably Mentally Handicapped students emphasizes personal development to compensate for their deficiencies, with pre-vocational training providing valuable experience.





The television camera plays a vital role in the production of a video-tape.

Through the use of mechanical aids, students are exposed to demonstrations and ideas that are not available through regular classroom learning. The new combination video tape and cassette recorder is an advanced means of communicating knowledge by presenting students and teachers with information recorded on video and audio tape cassettes. Video tapes of some classes are available to help students review or make up work they have missed.

Eight Players Qualify For All-Conference

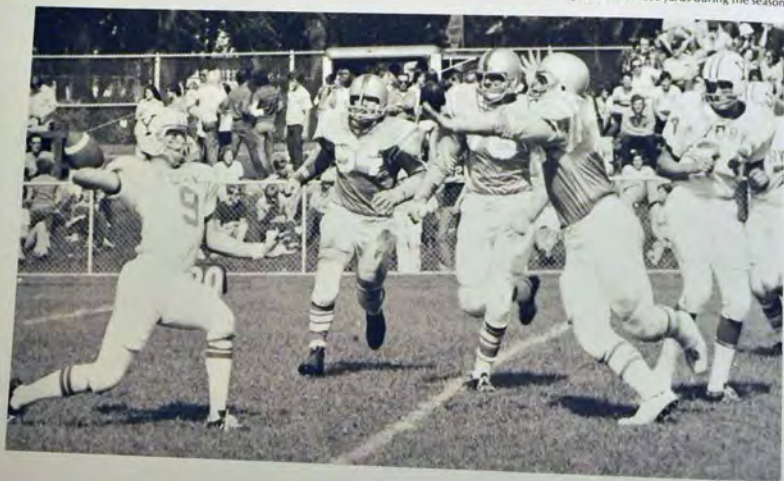

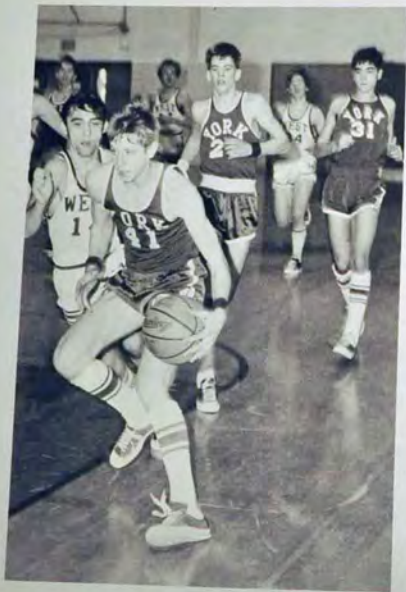

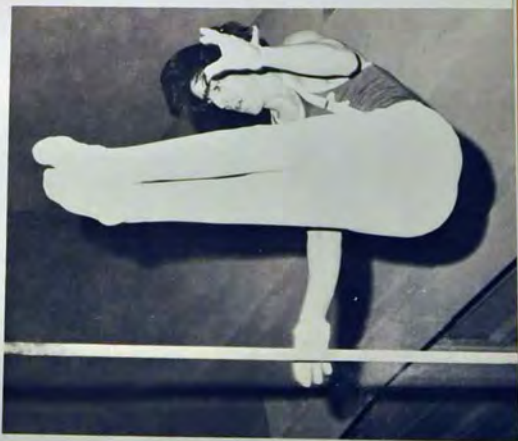

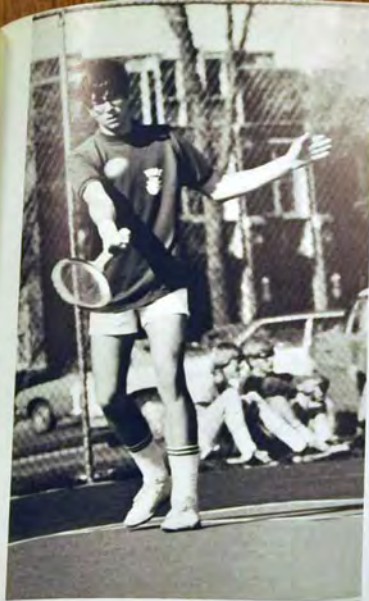
