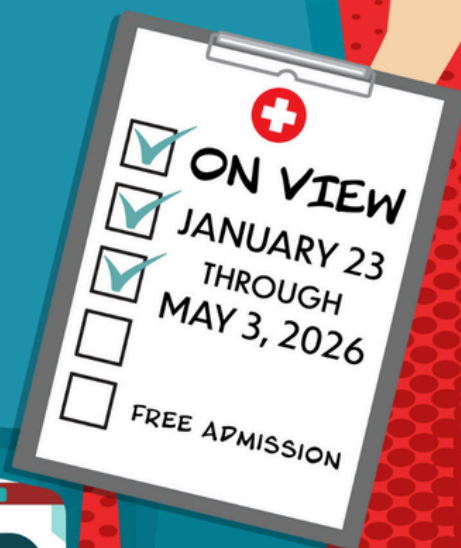

Surgical Science (IMSS)! Located in the historic Eleanor Robinson Countiss House, one of the few remaining lakefront mansions in Chicago, the tour will also feature an interactive demonstration of a leg amputation from the mid-1800s, with no anesthesia and no sterilization! After the tour, enjoy lunch at Orso's Italian Restaurant in the nearby Old Town neighborhood. Ticket price includes IMSS admission, transportation, and a three-course lunch. Space is limited to 35.

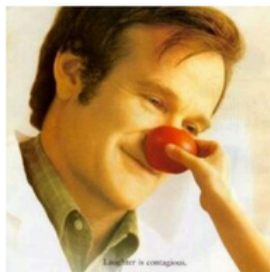
FILM SCREENING

Museum Explorers Camp is designed for children who like to engage in a variety of STEAM activities with an emphasis on learning, cooperation, fun, and creativity in a respectful atmosphere. The camp format is structured with daily lesson plans incorporating age-appropriate activities with scheduled outdoor playtime and visits to other museums in the area. In 2026, campers will learn about the history of the United States in honor of our country's 250th Anniversary. From exploring the museum's own *History of Her: Women Who Shaped Chicagoland* summer exhibit, to learning about Native women in Illinois, a field trip to the Lizzadro Museum of Lapidary art to learn about fossils and women in STEM, and more, campers will enjoy a well-rounded experience and even construct their very own museum exhibitions!

Snapshots in Time: 250 Years of Elmhurst History

Celebrate America's 250th Anniversary with Elmhurst History Museum Executive Director, Dave Oberg's new lecture on Elmhurst history! Presented in 25 year intervals, this lecture will provide a 250 year retrospective on how the area we call Elmhurst today has changed over time. This talk covers the vast and sweeping changes our area has seen, from the time when Pypegee strolled along the banks of the Wewanippissee (now called Salt Creek), through the arrival of the iron horse, incorporation under Village President Henry Glos, explosive growth in the '20s and '60s, and a new era of construction in the 21st century. Patrons will experience the lives and worlds of ten generations in under an hour.
