The history of movie theaters is a story of innovation, evolution, and adaptation. From the early Nickelodeons to the modern digital experience, movie theaters have played a crucial role in our culture and have helped to shape the entertainment industry. The movie palaces of the early 20th century sparked public interest in movies with enhanced experiences through elaborate architectural designs, captivating marketing, and the introduction of new technologies like sound and color. While some of the iconic movie palaces of Chicagoland no longer exist, those that remain transport audiences back in time as they watch a movie on the silver screen, just as they did over a century ago.

Chicagoland Movie Palaces: A Century of Follies & Film will explore the first movie palaces built in the Chicagoland area as well as commemorate the centennial celebration of the York Theatre, featuring a special section dedicated to the famous performances and films that have graced the iconic marquee in Elmhurst since 1924.

Tickets will go on sale online only September 3 at 9 a.m. Take a behind the scenes tour of the Elmhurst Quarry Flood Control Facility, a site generally closed to the public. Visit various areas, including private quarry platforms, and see how DuPage County Stormwater Management operates the facility to reduce area flooding. Tours depart from Elmhurst History Museum via bus every 30 minutes from 9:00 a.m. - 2:30 p.m., and last approximately two hours.


