JULY 105 participants viewed the **online lecture Apollo 10: Dress Rehearsal for the Moon.**

AUGUST Nearly 100 music enthusiasts enjoyed an **out-door concert** of **Vince Guaraldi tunes** performed by the Chris White Duo to celebrate **Snoopy Soars with NASA.**

SEPTEMBER 236 fans turned out for the *Vintage Baseball Game* at Elmhurst University, and 1,013 thirsty supporters attended the Elmhurst Heritage Foundation's 6th *Annual Craft Beer Fest* on the museum grounds.

OCTOBER 37 daring participants joined the *Haunted History Tour* exploring the Glos Mansion and local cemeteries after dark.

NOVEMBER 102 guests experienced **private exhibit tours** hosted by the Elmhurst Heritage Foundation for *An Ever-Widening Circle: Elmhurst University at 150.*

DECEMBER 169 local students participated in the **Kid-Story history program** in their classrooms marking a careful return to **in-person school programming.**

EXHIBITS


The Elmhurst History Museum continued to support our mission and engage with the community by offering an eclectic variety of exhibits in 2021. Despite limited visitation due to COVID-19 protocols, two in-house exhibits, one national touring exhibit plus our core Elmhurst history exhibit (*By All Accounts: The History of Elmhurst*) were presented and explored in 2021.



To start out the year, *Together We Cannot Fail:*Overcoming the Great Depression took a deep dive into the causes, challenges, and long-term effects of one of our country's most difficult eras: the Great Depression in the 1930s. The exhibit, developed and designed by Curator of Exhibits Dan Bartlett, interwove the national story with local aspects including rare photos and artifacts related to the Civilian Conservation Corps, the response of government, the impact on local businesses, and the rise of community support organizations during that tumultuous decade.



In summer, EHM turned to the skies with a new touring exhibit from the Charles M. Schulz Museum. *To the Moon: Snoopy Soars with NASA* landed in the gallery in June and attracted visitors from across the Chicago area with its heart-warming story of Snoopy's long-term relationship with the U.S. space program. The exhibit was supplemented with another related exhibit which was installed outdoors on the lawn. *Destination Moon: The Apollo 11 Mission* from SITES (Smithsonian Institution Traveling Exhibition Service) shared details on the historic 1969 mission when Neil Armstrong took man's first steps on the moon.



In fall, the museum collaborated with our hometown university to present another in-house exhibit, *An Ever-Widening Circle: Elmhurst University at 150*, in honor of the school's sesquicentennial. The exhibit and related programming provided an opportunity to collaborate with the EU faculty, students, staff, and

and related programming provided an opportunity to collaborate with the EU faculty, students, staff, and alumni to depict the journey of Elmhurst's respected and beloved institution of higher learning.



PROGRAMS

Faced with the continuing challenges presented by the ongoing pandemic, public programming forged ahead in 2021 by adapting to virtual formats developed over the last two years. As patrons became more comfortable using technologies from Zoom to YouTube, prerecorded video lectures, live performances, gallery talks, and online book discussions provided much-needed learning opportunities for interested participants. As the year progressed, in-person programming with attendance limited to enhance safety cautiously started to return.

A sampling of the year's diverse program offerings included curator's gallery talks, the *War of the Worlds* radio play with GreenMan Theatre, *Songs of the Great Depression* music program by Dean Milano, a remote lecture on the Space Race, *Museum Maker Mondays* and a *Lunar Cartooner Workshop* for kids in summer, a fascinating presentation on the Great Chicago Fire, a walking tour of the Elmhurst University arboretum, and an off-site book discussion and tour at the Aurora Fire Museum.

A noteworthy new tool developed by our educator was a new **Mobile Tour App** for self-guided tours and interactive gallery activities. This new technology expanded learning opportunities to connect with audiences both in the galleries and outdoors in the community.

EDUCATION

With traditional field trips on hiatus for of the 2021 school year, our Supervisor of Education Services, Jessie Wandersee, continued to provide teachers and students with flexible programming that was adapted to a virtual format. The KidStory artifact-based program was presented to young students, often via Google Classroom. A virtual tour and live interaction with the Schoolmarm also proved to be popular for remote learners, and students were able to get a glimpse at what life was like in the Churchville One-Room Schoolhouse in the early 1900s. In all, 1,360 schoolchildren were served by our educator through these programs.

In addition to schools, local scout troops were able to take advantage of EHM educational programs. In 2021, 123 children were served as troops took part in programming at the museum and the Churchville Schoolhouse as well as virtually.



COLLECTION & RESEARCH




The most popular Throwback Thursday post of 2021 was this photo of the Elmhurst Shopping Plaza, c. 1960s which reached 7,035 social media users.

The Collections staff, led by Curator Daniel Lund, continued the ongoing work of managing, organizing, digitizing, and overall care for the EHM collection. Some of the various projects accomplished in 2021 included:

- The **History in Focus** video series continued in 2021 with five new installments on Lost Landmarks of Elmhurst, Elmhurst architecture, Veterans organizations, the 1936 Centennial Celebration, and the history of Elmhurst University.
- Digital copies of numerous York High School yearbooks were added to our website.
- Weekly Throwback Thursday posts featuring photos from Elmhurst's past reached a total of 176,338 Facebook followers on social media.
- ➡ History Highlights articles were added to the museum's website, covering topics such as the Case Cherry Farm, the Great Chicago Fire, Hill Cottage Tavern, and Wilder Mansion.
- Quarterly History Spotlight displays were added to the By All Accounts: The Story of Elmhurst exhibit featuring information about Elmhurst Hospital, a 1940's Lions Club event, a display about early domestic cleaning appliances, and York Theatre.
