## 2022: BACK DOWN TO BUSINESS

As we look back on highlights from 2022, it is hopeful to see the museum get back down to our core business of engaging the community with history in many ways. The Elmhurst History Museum team bounced back in 2022 with a return to a full exhibition schedule and robust program offerings. Conditions related to the COVID-19 pandemic eased, and the Elmhurst History Museum team was in full swing with more in-person programming, school field trips, and an uptick in foot traffic that was welcomed by all.

Here are just a few of the interesting numbers from a year that took our audiences on an eclectic journey through history. In 2022, we traveled back in time to learn about the indigenous prairie people of northern Illinois; we took a nostalgic trip through Chicago's culinary history—from pizza to hot dogs and Rainbow Cones—to consider the city's best-known foods; and we ended the year with an insightful and powerful retrospective featuring the stories of local immigrants to consider what it means to be an American.

12,000 YEARS IN DUPAGE COUNTY

**February 4 – June 5, 2022:**

### ***People of the Prairie: 12,000 Years in DuPage County***

The Elmhurst History Museum continued to support our mission to engage with the community by offering a diverse selection of exhibits throughout the year. 2022 opened with *People of the Prairie: 12,000 Years in DuPage County*, which explored indigenous life in this area from the Ice Age through the establishment of the Cottage Hill settlement now known as Elmhurst. This exhibit offered opportunities for curriculum-aligned field trips and included many fascinating artifacts and interactive displays.

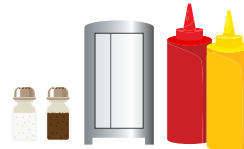
**June 24 – October 2, 2022**

Following the museum's tradition of taking a look at the lighter side of history in summertime, in June *Eat Your Heart Out: Iconic Chicagoland Foods* opened to enthusiastic response from both history and foodie fans across the region. The exhibit was a celebration of the culinary delights that are Chicago trademarks with a spotlight on the "big three": pizza, hot dogs, and Italian beef. The exhibit garnered significant foot traffic and publicity during its popular run with more than 3,400 visitors.

### **IMMIGRANTS IN OUR COMMUNITIES**



**October 28, 2022 – May 14, 2023**

### ***In Pursuit of Happiness: Immigrants in Our Communities***

In fall of 2022, *In Pursuit of Happiness: Immigrants in Our Communities* took a comprehensive look at the changing tapestry of people who call the western suburbs home. The exhibit showcased the immigration stories of many residents of DuPage County through interviews and the objects they shared to be displayed in the exhibit. This exhibit continues its run through May of 2023.

**Ongoing Exhibit:**

### ***By All Accounts: The Story of Elmhurst***

Of special note is that several enhancements to the *By All Accounts: The Story of Elmhurst* exhibit in our second-floor gallery were initiated in 2022. A portion of *People of the Prairie* was adapted to create a new introduction to our core exhibit, providing an important facet of our local history that precedes white European settlement in the area. In addition, the exhibit's mini-theatre was enhanced with the addition of a selection of staff-produced short videos for viewing.

## PROGRAMS

The Museum's Supervisor of Education Services, Jessie Wandersee, spearheaded the effort to return to normalcy with a diverse offering of Public Programs for audiences of all ages. Many of these learning opportunities were designed to connect with exhibit themes, and a few seasonal favorites returned as well. Some of the key programs and special events from 2022 included:

- ➔ In Spring, EHM hosted Spring Break activities for families including an **Atlatl to Archery Workshop** and a **Three Sisters gardening program. Museum Day** returned in May with authentic Native American dancers and musicians.
- ➔ Summertime activities included a **Family Pizza-Making Workshop, Iconic Chicago Foods lecture**, a visit from the **Sandwich King**, and a festive **Picnic on Park** that welcomed the Oscar Meyer Wiener Mobile and Rainbow Cone truck to the museum campus along with approximately 1,000 people.
- ➔ Fall's programming was led by special events that included the **Graveside Stories Cemetery Walk** with GreenMan Theatre Troupe, an amazing **Day of the Dead Celebration** led by Immigrant Solidarity DuPage, and the **Immigration Stories Showcase** at the Elmhurst Public Library. The highly-anticipated **Elmhurst Quarry Tour** in October, which sold out in minutes, enabled more than 360 ticketholders to take a rare behind-the-scenes tour of the facility.



## EDUCATION

The Education market made a slow post-Covid return in the Spring of 2022 with 416 children visiting the **Churchville One-Room Schoolhouse** for living history programs. A noted trend was the rise in **Portable Programs** which are provided by museum educators in the classroom, and 784 students were served at area schools through this offering. A new program was developed for the *People of the Prairie* exhibit and proved to be popular with teachers, and it has been added to the regular roster.

In the summer, EHM's sold-out **Museum Explorer Camp** was back in place with a full week of fun STEAM-focused activities for curious kids in grades 2 – 5.

## COLLECTION & RESEARCH

The Collections staff, led by Curator Daniel Lund, continued the ongoing work of managing, organizing, digitizing, and caring for the Elmhurst History Museum's collection. Some of the projects accomplished in 2022 included:

- ➔ A major achievement in 2022 was the implementation of the **Catalogit Hub**, a new collections database with more than 6,000 photographs available for public viewing on our website.
- ➔ Another key achievement was the **restoration of the G.P.A. Healy portrait of Jane Byrd Bryan**, which was acquired by the museum in 2020 with private funding and assistance from the Elmhurst Heritage Foundation. The painting was painstakingly restored over the past two years and will be officially unveiled in April 2023 and installed permanently in the *By All Accounts* exhibit later this year.

- ➔ **Weekly Throwback Thursday posts** continued to be the museum's most popular social media stars. The most popular post was a photo of the Yankee Doodle Dandy restaurant circa 1970 which garnered a reach of more than 15,000.



- ➔ A **new Elmhurst History in Focus video** on Elmhurst restaurants was created as a feature in the *Eat Your Heart Out* exhibit and was added to this popular series on our YouTube channel.
- ➔ **History Spotlight rotating displays** were added to the *By All Accounts: The Story of Elmhurst* exhibit. New topics included the Elmhurst Kiwanis Club, a history of catalog/kit homes, and a feature on the incorporation of Elmhurst as a village in 1882.

The Elmhurst History Museum is fortunate to have a dedicated source of support provided by the Elmhurst Heritage Foundation. Here are some of the successes for the Elmhurst Heritage Foundation in 2022:

The **Elmhurst Craft Beer Fest** was once again the year's highpoint with 1,077 attendees and more than 53 sponsors, raising key funds for future exhibits, programs, and other enhancements.
