

View the 2006 documentary that gives a fascinating account of the earliest days of mountain biking using archival footage from the late 1960s and early 1970s, photographs, and interviews with those who were there. These cycling enthusiasts rode modified pre-WWII bicycles down California slopes, often risking life and limb. It was from these humble beginnings that a billion-dollar industry, a new form of recreation, and an Olympic event were born. Co-presented with Elmhurst Public Library. Illinois was at the center of a massive bicycle boom in the late 1800s with women at the forefront challenging Victorian social norms by advocating for dress reform and women's rights. Some of the best female racers in the country hailed from Chicago, and they disproved contemporary myths about women's physical fragility. Based on his original research for a forthcoming book, author Chris Sweet will present and discuss the rich history of Illinois women cyclists from the 1860s-1900.


