

7 Van Duzen County Park

This redwood forest along the Van Duzen River includes Swimmers Delight, a great place for a summer splash, a first come, first serve campground; and a group campsite, reservations required, in enchanted Pamplin Grove. **12 miles east of Fortuna on Hwy 36 707-445-7651**

8 Humboldt Redwoods State Park

The oldest and largest of California's redwood parks includes the Rockefeller Forest – a 10,000-acre sanctuary with nothing but old growth redwoods – as well as 250 campsites, 100 miles of hiking trails, the wild & scenic Eel River, and the world famous Avenue of the Giants. **30 miles south of Eureka on Hwy 101 | 707-946-2263**



9 Richardson Grove State Park

Near the southern Humboldt County line, this 2,000-acre park features a stand of giant old growth trees along a scenic stretch of Hwy 101 known as the "Redwood Curtain." The park is popular for Eel River swims, fishing, and camping. **7 miles south of Garberville 707-247-3318**

13 Avenue of the Giants

This 33-mile stretch of historic Hwy 101 in Southern Humboldt features some of the world's tallest trees.

14 Newton B. Drury Scenic Pkwy

An 11-mile road in Redwood National Park leads to Big Tree, Corkscrew Tree, and other notable giants.

FUN FACTS

Half of the world's old growth redwoods are in Redwood National & State Parks.

The single largest stand of redwoods, the Rockefeller Forest, is 10,000 acres in size.

The world's tallest tree, Hyperion, is 380 feet tall, six stories taller than the Statue of Liberty.

Old growth (never cut) redwoods can live 2,000 years and exceed 74 feet in circumference.

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1 Redwood National Park

An international Biosphere Reserve and World Heritage Site, this park preserves the world's tallest trees, including the record holder at 380 feet, six stories higher than the Statue of Liberty. Besides hiking, biking and horse trails, the park boasts some of California's wildest beaches. **40 miles north of Eureka on Hwy 101 | 707-465-7765.**



2 Prairie Creek Redwoods State Park

This 14,000-acre wilderness next to Redwood National Park has the world's densest concentration of old growth giants in the Redwood range, world famous Fern Canyon, and meadows full of grazing Roosevelt elk. **45 miles north of Eureka on Hwy 101 | 707-488-2039**



3 Arcata Community Forest

An 800-acre wonderland next to Humboldt State University, the forest is known for its sustainable forest management. It includes hiking, biking and horse trails, a playground and grassy knoll, perfect for picnics and lounging in the sun. **Corner of 14th and Union St. 707-822-8184**

4 Sequoia Park Forest

Next to Eureka's Sequoia Park Zoo, this 67-acre dog-friendly preserve includes old growth giants, miles of trails, seasonal waterfalls, duck pond, dahlia garden and playground with super redwood slide. Don't miss the new Redwood Sky Walk in the zoo. **3414 W St., Eureka | 707-441-4263**



5 Rohner Park Forest

This 50-acre retreat, in the heart of Fortuna, has miles of peaceful walking trails in second-growth redwoods and showcases native wild shrubs and herbs. Stop at the Fortuna Railroad Depot Museum near the park entrance. **3 Park St., Fortuna 707-725-7600**

6 Grizzly Creek Redwoods State Park

This one square mile forest packs in plenty of family fun, with 24 camping spots and five miles of trails. The prettiest redwoods are hidden in nearby Cheatham Grove, where alliance rebels chased storm troopers in Return of the Jedi. **15 miles east of Fortuna on Hwy 36, 16949 Hwy 36, Carlotta 707-777-3683**
