Major League Baseball and various partners will host an unprecedented 24 hours of 'PLAY BALL' on Thursday, June 21<sup>st</sup>, the Summer Solstice, in Fairbanks, Alaska. The special effort is in celebration of one of baseball's most unique spectacles – the 113<sup>th</sup> Midnight Sun Game. Given the city's unique geographic location, Fairbanks sees 24 hours of daylight during the Summer Solstice. Throughout the 24-hour period, there will be a number of softball and baseball activities, for both adults and kids, hosted by Major League Baseball, the American Legion, PONY Baseball and Softball, USA Baseball and USA Softball.

During the "Open Session" PLAY BALL events, approximately <u>600 kids</u>, ages six to 12, from local youth organizations and communities, will run through informal baseball- and softball-centered 'PLAY BALL' stations that provide fun activities highlighting the many ways the game can be played and enjoyed. Each participant will receive a bat & ball set, PLAY BALL-branded t-shirts and wristbands to take home. Other activities throughout the day will include games featuring different baseball and softball-focused organizations, including the Armed Forces Softball League, American Legion, Reviving Baseball in Inner Cities (RBI), and USA Baseball and USA Softball. The numerous games and activities throughout the day will culminate with the 113<sup>th</sup> Midnight Summer Game, which has been played annually in Fairbanks for over a century.
