

The National Air and Space Museum Steven F. Udvar-Hazy Center near Washington Dulles International Airport is the sister museum to the Air and Space Museum on the National Mall. Together, these two museums house the largest collection of aviation and space artifacts in the world. Upon arrival, visitors to the museum are treated to spectacular views of aircraft dramatically displayed from the arched ceiling of a 10-story hangar. Experience the thrill of "piloting" your own plane in one of the museum's flight simulators, or take in the stunning display of the enormous Space Shuttle *Discovery*. Walk among some of the most unique aircraft in the world, including the SR-71 Blackbird, Gemini II capsule, and Concorde jet. The museum's IMAX theatre, guided tours, and elevated skywalks all make it an unforgettable trip.

HIGHLIGHTS

- The Boeing Aviation Hangar is 10 stories tall and the length of three football fields.
- The ceiling of the James S. McDonnell Space Hangar, home of the Space Shuttle *Discovery*, is painted black to simulate space.
- The 164-foot tall Donald D. Engen Observation Tower provides a 360-degree view and looks out onto two adjacent Dulles International Airport runways.



- Take a Tour: The museum's docents, some of whom are former NASA employees or even pilots who flew aircraft displayed in the museum, lead tours that highlight the museum's collection and trace the history of air and space travel.
- Ascend and Observe: The Donald D. Engen Tower provides a 360-degree, bird's-eye view of Washington Dulles International Airport and the surrounding area.
- **Simulate:** Ever wonder what it's like to do a barrel roll while racing through enemy fire? Or what the view is like from the International Space Station? Take a ride in one of the museum's flight simulators and find out how it feels without ever leaving the ground.
- Take Movies to the IMAX: The Airbus IMAX Theater is among the first theaters in the world to feature IMAX's new laser projection system. The dual 4K laser projection system provides the sharpest, brightest, clearest, and most vivid digital images possible. The future of movie technology is here!
- Witness History: The museum is home to the Mary Baker Engen Restoration Hangar, where preservation of the Air and Space Museums' collections takes place. A glassed-in mezzanine provides a view of restoration projects in progress.
- **Celebrate:** Organizations can host a one-of-a-kind event among the pioneers of flight. The sweeping 10-story Boeing Aviation Hangar makes an incredible backdrop for extraordinary receptions or banquets of up to 5,000 guests.
