Military Memorials — The Capital City pays tribute to our service men and women through profound and unforgettable memorials to their sacrifice and service. From the WWII Memorial honoring the 16 million Americans who served to the haunting Vietnam Wall that lists the names of the 58,000+ Americans who made the ultimate sacrifice, these memorials are a lasting reminder that "freedom is not free."

American Heroes — The majestic white marble memorials that pay tribute to the American heroes who shaped our history are not to be missed. Standing on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial, the exact spot where Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. gave his "I Have a Dream" speech, visitors feel the influence and impact that our first leaders made on our nation's story.

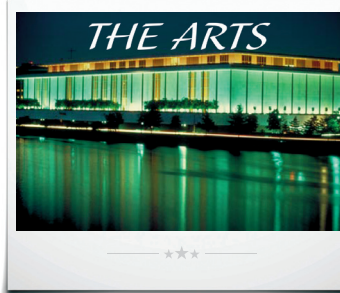
