Morning: Airborne & Special Operations Museum

Morning: Coffee and Pastries at Superior Bakery

Start the day with a stop at Superior Bakery, a long-standing local favorite. This quick visit gives travelers a chance to enjoy fresh pastries and a relaxed start before heading out for the day.

Optional Stop: Carvers Creek State Park

Groups looking to add an outdoor experience can include a stop at Carvers Creek State Park, located just north of Fayetteville in Spring Lake.

This stop offers a slower pace and a chance to stretch between activities. It can be shortened or skipped based on timing and group preference.



Lunch: Easy Options Near Carvers Creek State Park

After visiting Carvers Creek State Park, groups can stop nearby for lunch before continuing on to their next destination.
