Treasurer's Report for January through March 2018.

Revenue as of January 31, 2018 was \$172,726.83. Expenses were \$250,451.24. Occupancy collected was \$172,667.60 compared to \$212,808.00 collected in January 2017.

Revenue as of February 28, 2018 was \$202,498.02. Expenses were \$185,587.12. Occupancy collected was \$201,482.96 compared to \$218,059.90 collected in February 2017.

Revenue as of March 31, 2018 was \$206,904.32. Expenses were \$183,386.38. Occupancy collected was \$204,910.42 compared to \$195,778.21 collected in March 2017.

The balance in the checking account as of March 31, 2018 totaled \$41,507.16. The total funds in certificates of deposit (CD) was \$740,168.00. \$133,352.75 at PNC was moved to PNC Investments on 2/7/18. Board set a goal to maintain a 3-month contingency.

We are engaged to audit the financial statements of Fayetteville Area Convention & Visitors Bureau, Inc. ("the Organization") for the year ended June 30, 2018. Professional standards require that we provide you with the following information related to our audit. We would also appreciate the opportunity to meet with you to discuss this information further since a two-way dialogue can provide valuable information for the audit process.

Our Responsibility under U.S. Generally Accepted Auditing Standards

As stated in our engagement letter dated March 16, 2018, our responsibility, as described by professional standards, is to express an opinion about whether the financial statements prepared by management with your oversight are fairly presented, in all material respects, in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles. Our audit of the financial statements does not relieve you or management of your responsibilities.

Our responsibility for the supplementary information accompanying the financial statements, as described by professional standards, is to evaluate the presentation of the supplementary information in relation to the financial statements as a whole and to report on whether the supplementary information is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements as a whole.

Planned Scope, Timing of the Audit, and Other

An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements; therefore, our audit will involve judgment about the number of transactions to be examined and the areas to be tested.

Our audit will include obtaining an understanding of the Organization and its environment, including internal control, sufficient to assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements and to design the nature, timing, and extent of further audit procedures. Material misstatements may result from (1) errors, (2) fraudulent financial reporting, (3) misappropriation of assets, or (4) violations of laws or governmental regulations that are attributable to the Organization or to acts by management or employees acting on behalf of the Organization. We will generally communicate our significant findings at the conclusion of the audit. However, some matters could be communicated sooner, particularly if significant difficulties are encountered during the audit where assistance is needed to overcome the difficulties or if the difficulties may lead to a modified opinion. We will also communicate any internal control related matters that are required to be communicated under professional standards.

We expect to begin our audit on approximately May 1, 2018 and issue our report on approximately September 30, 2018. April Adams is the engagement partner and is responsible for supervising the engagement and signing the report or authorizing another individual to sign it.
