

- The As One Prayer Walk management estimated **7,500** attendees prior to the event.
- There were **110** completed surveys.
- Using the 7,500 attendees, the Confidence Interval for this presentation with a 110 Sample Size is +/- 9.28%. Because of the size of the sample the Confidence Interval is well below the "best practice" of +/- 5%.




The walk begins at 10 a.m. in Festival Park and will include five prayer stations along the route:

Religious Freedom Trail



Bottom Line

• Not all Tourism Development Authority (TDA) requirements were met:

366 completed surveys was the agreed upon requirement (only 110 collected)

- Room Nights Because the required sample size was below the TDA required amount, the FACVB was unable to accurately project room nights.
- **6.36%** of participants (**7**) were overnighters and came specifically for the event. Because the agreed upon required sample size was not met, the FACVB was unable to accurately project room nights.
- **0** participants were referred by hotels.
- 69.09% were from Cumberland County, including Fort Bragg.
- **9.09%** were day-trippers.
- Participants heard of the event mainly by Word of Mouth (34%) and their church (20%).
- **12** attendees signed up for the FACVB's E-Promotion Program and provided a valid E-mail address.
- Those that came for the event and stayed at a hotel listed the following hotels: Fairfield and Embassy Suites.
- Official Hotel Pick Up: 0 Room Nights
