Visit the farm for a hot pancake breakfast with real maple syrup then tour the sugarhouse where the syrup is produced. Those registered for the Adopt-a-Maple program will also go into the woods to tap their adopted tree, followed by a visit to the tasting room for a guided tasting of various maple products.
